**Junior classes in...**

in J&K shall open in a phased manner. Classes from 9th to 12th can commence routine offline teaching from February 14, 2022. All the students of 15-17 age group coming to attend regular offline classes must carry a vaccination certificate with them. Head of Institutions must ensure vaccination of every student above 15 years of age in their respective Institutions.

The vaccination adherence shall be ensured through coordination with the Department of Health and Medical Education J&K. Every School must further ensure full compliance to COVID Appropriate Behaviour (CAB) and SOPs," read an order.

It added "The offline mode of teaching for remaining junior classes in Summer Zone Schools shall begin from February 21, 2022 and Head of Institution shall be responsible for adherence to COVID Appropriate Behaviour in their respective schools and prepare proper plans for the same."

"The Winter Zone Schools of J&K shall commence offline teaching for all classes after 28th of February 2022 and the Head of the Institutions must ensure that guidelines related to vaccination for students above 15 years, social distancing norms and CAB are followed strictly including regular screening at the entrance of the Institution," it added.

24 hours. Till date 6004757 persons have been enlisted for observation which included 31703 persons in home quarantine including facilities operated by government, 3683 in isolation and 443602 in home surveillance. Besides, 5512024 persons have completed their surveillance period.

Meanwhile, Ladakh has reported 58 fresh Covid cases, taking the infection tally to 27,594, officials said.

The number of active cases stands at 523, including 404 in Leh and 119 cases in Kargil, they said.

The Union Territory has recorded 227 Covid-related deaths -- 168 in Leh and 59 in Kargil, they said.

No death was reported on Tuesday, officials said.

As many as 57 patients, 34 in Leh and 23 in Kargil, were cured and discharged from hospitals, taking the overall recoveries to 26,844, they said.

Of the 58 new cases, 43 were from Leh and 15 from Kargil, officials said, adding that a total of 1,193 sample reports in Ladakh were found negative.

**Deaf & dumb villagers finally find a mentor as army adopts Dadkhai**

**BHADARWAH:** Mysterious disorder which tell the tale of silent sufferings that reigns in the sleepy village of Dadkhai, nestled high up in the Himalayan mountains in Jammu and Kashmir's Doda district and where the majority of residents are deaf and mute have finally found a mentor as Indian Army's Rashtriya Rifles unit based at Bhadarwar has extended its helping hand in a big way by deciding to adopt the the village.

After distributing hi-tech specialised hearing aids among the deaf and mute villagers on Jan 18, Army has gone a step further for the overall comprehensive welfare of the differently abled population, with multiple social security programs aimed at to give them confidence to survive and make a living on their own.

In the first step, beside looking after their basic

needs like clothing, food and Healthcare, 4 RR has started door to door personalized teaching classes for the mute children by deploying sign language experts who have been especially trained at Hyderabad and Secunderabad respectively.

An army Spokesman informed that in the next tier of the ongoing welfare scheme school with hostel facility will be provided for the mute villagers in Dadkhai Panchayat itself. Each of the 50 families in this village inhabited by trib-

"We want to help them in a comprehensive and long lasting way and to teach them best possible sign language, two teachers were sponsored by the Army to get specialized training at Hyderabad and Secunderabad cities of Telengana and know deaf and mute population is being taught by them at their respective places," Spokesman added.

Each of the 50 families in this village inhabited by trib-

als have at least one member who can neither hear nor speak. The first reported case dates back to 1931 and now the numbers have swelled to 78.

"Whenever a woman gets pregnant, not only the family but entire village lives in constant trauma, not because of the gender of the child. But the fear is, if the offspring turns to be deaf and mute then it aggravates problems and increases miseries," said Mohd Hanif, BDC Chairman Bhalessa and native of Dadkhai Village.

While expressing their gratitude to the Army, villagers said that since last two decades a number of Government and NGOs have visiting their village but nothing concrete was done for them but Army has initiated practical steps which will surely go a long way to eradicate the miseries they have been facing due to the disability they have been facing

the root cause of which has not been located yet.

Deaf and mute girls in the newly learned sign language while expressing their desire to start sewing center demanded from the Army officers that sewing machines for the mute girls should be provided and a residential school should be established at the earliest.

"Now all our hopes are from the Army, as they are the only ones who have been looking after us since last 10 years. My three daughters - Asran Bano 8, Reshma 12 and Asha Bano 23 are born with the disability and army beside looking after all their needs have recently provided them with hearing aids, my daughters although disabled but are showing keen interest in stitching clothes, hope army will help in this as well by providing a sewing machine," Said Hussan Bibi mother of three deaf and mute daughters.

On getting information, FIR no 17/2022 under section 363 of IPC was immediately lodged at Police Station Reasi, legal action initiated & search was launched by multiple police parties. Family, friends & sources provided clues on enquiries made by police. After hectic efforts, the presence of the minor was established in Gurdaspur, Punjab along with kidnapper Rashpal Singh, son of Ajit Singh, resident of Handar, Arnas.

Shailender Singh Senior Superintendent of Police Reasi constituted a special team led by a Sub-Inspector rank officer & sent it to Punjab for recovery of minor. With help of local Police, the team raided all possible places and finally recovered the missing minor girl from clutches of accused in Gurdaspur. The accused was also arrested on the spot. Medical examination of victim was conducted by board of doctors, statement of minor was recorded before judicial Magistrate & all legal procedures were completed after which Judicial Magistrate ordered to shift the girl to Nari Niketan Jammu.

Singh, while sharing the details, conveyed that case will be investigated thoroughly to minutest of details & charge-sheet against accused will be produced in the court of law within stipulated time. Shailender further said that it is recovery of fourth kidnapped girl and a minor boy in last one week by Reasi Police. He appealed to parents that girls should be made aware of fraudsters who always remain on a mission to spoil lives of innocents.

**BHADARWAH:** Police on Wednesday nabbed a notorious drug peddler wanted in multiple NDPS cases and recovered 9.3 Kg poppy straw from his possession.

Doda Police said that a police team led by Incharge Police Post PSI Gourav Sharma under the supervision of Insp Arun Sharma, SHO Police Station Doda and Jaswant Singh DySP Hqrs Doda apprehended an accused namely Surinder Singh, son of Hans Raj, resident of Chakra Bhatti, Tehsil Bhalla, Bhadarwah after strenuous efforts. Police said that accused was wanted in FIR No. 08/2022, under sections 08/15 of NDPS Act registered at Police Station Doda and FIR No. 22/2022 under sections 08/15 of NDPS Act registered at Police Station Thathri. In both cases, poppy straw weighing 9 Kg and 3 Kg were recovered from him respectively. The accused was a main supplier of poppy straw and he was on run from last about one month. The arrest was made by the police team under the overall supervision of Abdul Qayoom, SSP Doda.

**Withdraw draft proposals for demarcation of constituencies: NC to Delimitation Commission****STATE TIMES NEWS**

**SRINAGAR:** The National Conference has asked the Jammu and Kashmir Delimitation Commission to withdraw the draft proposal for demarcation of assembly constituencies and also stop further proceedings of the Commission till the final adjudication of pleas challenging validity of revocation of Article 370 and reorganisation of the constituencies has not been given the prominence it deserves.

The three Lok Sabha members, who are associate members of the Commission, in their written objections filed on Monday said, the draft proposal made in working paper 2-6 proposing demarcation of the assembly and parliamentary constituencies be withdrawn without acting upon the proposals in any manner or proceeding ahead in the matter.

The Commission must stop the exercise forthwith pending final adjudication and disposal of the batch of writ petitions questioning Vires and constituencies.

"The deviation in population ranges from 56,077 more than average of 1,36,304 in case of 41-Dooru to 85,025 less than average in case of 50-Padder. There are seven Assembly segments with less than 100,000 population (Padder; Shri Mata Vaishno Devi, Bani, Mughal Madaan, Basohli, Ramgarh and Kishtwar) in Jammu Province while number of such constituencies is only three (Gurez, Karnah and Kunzer)," they added.

The leaders said as per the draft proposal, people of Dooru will have one member in Assembly while an almost equal population from Padder, Bani and SMVD constituencies shall have three members in the Assembly.

"The Working Papers 2-6 script a story of disempowerment and disenfranchisement of Kashmir and far flung unattended areas of Jammu," they said.

**Low intensity quake of 3.2 magnitude hit Valley****STATE TIMES NEWS**

**SRINAGAR:** A mild intensity earthquake with epicentre in Jammu and Kashmir's Pahalgam area shook the valley on Wednesday but there was no damage reported due to the tremor. An earthquake of magnitude 3.2 on Richter scale was felt at around 5.43 am in Kashmir, an official of the Disaster Management authority said.

He said the epicentre of the earthquake was 15 kilometres south-southwest of Pahalgam, the base camp for Shri Amarnath yatra, at a depth of 16 kilometres. The official said there were no reports of any damage so far.

**UGC-NET result to be declared in a day or two****STATE TIMES NEWS**

**NEW DELHI:** The result of National Eligibility Test (NET) will be declared in a day or two, the University Grants Commission (UGC) said on Wednesday. "Due to the COVID-19 pandemic, the UGC could not conduct the December-2020 UGC-NET examination. Consequently, the UGC-NET of December 2020 and June 2021 Cycles were conducted together by National Testing Agency between November 20, 2021, and January 5, 2022," a senior commission official said. "The UGC-NET was conducted in 81 subjects, in 837 centres spread across 239 cities in the country. More than 12 lakh candidates registered for UGC-NET. The processing of the results is underway. UGC is working closely with NTA and all efforts are being made to declare the UGC-NET results in a day or two," he added.
