Cong makes people of one region fight against another: Modi

ABOHAR: Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Thursday hit out at Punjab Chief Minister Charanjit Singh Channi for his 'UP, Bihar and Delhi de bhaive' remark, saying people with such "divisive thought" do not have the right to rule the state.

Addressing a rally here ahead of the February 20 Punjab assembly polls, he also urged voters to bring the BJP-led alliance to power in Puniab for the all-round development of the state.

Channi during a Congress roadshow on Tuesday courted controversy by asking people not to let "bhaiyas" of Uttar Pradesh, Bihar and Delhi enter Punjab, a remark apparently aimed at leaders of the Aam Aadmi Party (AAP), which is emerging as a strong contender for the polls to 117-member state assembly.

In a video circulating on social media, Congress gen-



made the remarks during the roadshow in Rupnagar. The word "bhaiyas" in reference to people from Uttar Pradesh and Bihar is gener-

ally considered offensive. During his address, Prime Minister Modi attacked the Congress, saying it "always makes people of one region fight against another region

for its own gains". Referring to Channi's remark, he said the entire Varanasi and you will not let 'bhaiya' of Uttar Pradesh to enter here, will you throw out Ravidasiyas (followers of Guru Ravidas), will you erase Sant Ravidas' name too. What kind of language are vou speaking?" Modi further asked where

Over 174.59 Cr COVID vaccine doses administered in India: Govt

J&K reports 232 new COVID cases, Ladakh 47

NEW DELHI: The cumulative number of COVID-19 vaccine doses administered in the country crossed 174.59 crore on Thursday, according to the Union health ministry.

More than 33 lakh (33,62,813) vaccine doses were administered till 7 pm on Thursday, the ministry said, adding that the daily vaccination tally is expected to go up with the compilation of the final reports by late night.

More than 1.84 crore (1,84,27,087) precaution doses of the vaccines have been administered to healthcare workers (HCWs), frontline workers (FLWs) and those aged 60 years and above with comorbidities.

The countrywide vaccination drive again the viral disease was rolled out on January 16 last year with the HCWs getting inoculated in the first phase. The vaccination of FLWs started from February 2 last year. The next phase of Covid vaccination commenced from March 1 last year for people over 60 years of age and those aged 45 years ■ CONTD ON PAGE 9



DB upholds Section 28 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act 1960

JAMMU: In a Public Interest Litigation filed by one Tek Chand, claiming to be a Pujari and seeking prohibition on illegal practice of slaughtering animals on basis of superstition and in name of religious sacrifices besides praying that Section 28 of Prevention of Cruelty to Animals Act, 1960 (for short 'the Act') be declared as unconstitutional, a Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir High and Ladakh High comprising Chief Court Justice Pankah Mithal and Justice Sindhu Sharma, while disposing of PIL, observed that in case in some religious places the practice of sacrificing animals is being carried on violation of Act, the petitioner is free to

approach concerned Head of Administration of District, who will consider the matter and take appropriate action in accordance with law. DB observed that practice of killing innocent animals is sufficiently taken care of by the Act and, as such, there is no need for issuing any further direction prohibiting the practice, if any, of killing animals and it is left to the executive to apply the Act strictly. DB observed that the aforesaid provision is a saving provision and its object is to not to criminalise killing of animals for religious purposes only which is a policy decision as per wisdom of the lawmakers and is beyond judicial review.
