Thief arrested, 2 stolen vehicles recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday solved a theft case solved by arresting a thief and recovered two stolen scooters.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Peerimitha by Shubam Suri, son of Ashwani Kumar Suri, resident of Lower Mast Garh regarding theft his scooter (JK02AX 9430) from front of his house. On this, FIR No. 11/22 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Peerimitha and investigation started. A team of Police Station Peerimitha under the supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO Peerimitha Inspri Zaheer Mushtaq, after strenuous efforts and analysis of CCTV footages of area along with timely human intervention, rounded up a suspect namely Ritu Daman, son of Shubhdweep Singh, resident of Mubarak Mandi, who during sustained questioning, confessed his crime. On his disclosure stolen scooter along with another stolen scooter (JK02BJ 0380) were also recovered.

Two missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Monday traced two missing persons and reunited them with their family members.

As per details, two different complaints were lodged at Police Station Bakshi Nagar by legal heirs of a boy namely Shubam Verma, son of Joginder Verma, resident of Rajpura and a girl, stating that they went missing from their respective homes.

In this regard two missing reports viz DD No.07 dated Feb 13, 2021 regarding boy and DD No.21 dated January 12, 2021 regarding missing girl, were registered at Police Station Bakshi Nagar and investigation started. On this, special police teams were formed under supervision of SDPO West Rahul Nagar. The team led by SHO Bakshi Nagar Inspri Harjeet Singh traced both missing persons. Subsequently families of missing persons were informed and both were handed over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Six gamblers arrested, stake money Rs 30,000 recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday arrested six gamblers and recovered stake money amounting to Rs 30,000 from the spot.

As per details, a team of Police Station City headed by SHO City Inspri Vijay Kumar assisted by In-Charge Police Post Hari Market SI Ravi Kumar while on patrolling duty received an information regarding gamblers in Hotel New Swastik near Gurdwara Sunder Singh road. On this, police teams raided the spot and nabbed six gamblers along with Rs 30,000 stake money and a deck of playing cards.

All accused were arrested and FIR under section 13 of Gambling Act was registered at Police Station City. The accused were identified as Mohammad Amir Bhat, son of Mohd Maqbool Bhat, resident of Parimpura, Srinagar; Ishfaq Nazir Banjari, son of Nazir Ahmad, resident of Rainwari, Srinagar; Mudasir Ahmad Haji, son of Abdul Salam Haji, resident of Qamarpora, Srinagar; Shabir Ahmad Batt, son of Abdul Rashid Batt, resident of Bemina, Srinagar; Abdul Ahad Kawa, son of Ghulam Rasool Ahad, resident of Aqal Mir Khanyar, Srinagar and Bilal Ahmad Khan, son of Ali Mohd Khan. The overall arrests and recoveries were made under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu.

Theft case solved, stolen truck recovered

JAMMU: Police on Monday solved a theft case solved by recovering stolen truck loaded with 704 coca-cola cases and arrested the accused.

As per the details, an information was received at Police Station Digiana regarding theft of a truck (JK02S-9027) carrying 704 coca-cola cases. On this, FIR No. 40/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Gandhi Nagar and investigation started. After this, a team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar under the supervision of SDPO City South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspri Pankaj Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Digiana SI Tarsem Lal did strenuous efforts and arrested the accused. The stolen truck along with 704 coca-cola cases was also recovered from his possession.

10 drug peddlers arrested across Kashmir; 2 detained under PIT NDPS Act

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Monday arrested 10 drug peddlers across Kashmir and recovered psychotropic/contraband substances from their possession. Besides two notorious drug peddlers were detained under preventive detention under PIT NDPS Act in Kulgam.

In Sopore, a party of Police Post Watergam under the supervision of SDPO Rafiabadi and SHO Police Station Dangiwacha at a checkpoint established at Ladoora crossing intercepted and arrested a suspect identified as Mehraj ud Din Bhat, son of Ghulam Hassan Bhat, resident of Ladoora Rafiabadi. During checking, 169 banned capsules were recovered from his possession. In Awantipora, officers from Police Post Reshipora at a checking point established at Kawanji Crossing arrested a suspect identified as Gulzar Ahmad Ganie, son of Gh Mohd Ganie, resident of Bra Bandina and recovered 3 Kg grinded cannabis (concealed in a nylon bag) from his possession. In Handwara, officers from Police Post Chogal at a checking point established at Chogal arrested one Farooq Ahmad Teli, son of Gh Qadir, resident of Maidan Chogal and recovered 205 gm Charas from him. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. In another action, officers at a checking point established at Watayeen on Sopore-Kupwara highway intercepted and arrested a suspect identified as Fayaz Ahmad Mir; son of Gh Rasool, resident of Drugmulla Kupwara. During checking, 2 Kg Charas was recovered from his possession.

Similarly, Police in Baramulla at various checkpoints established across the district under the supervision of senior officers arrested 5 drug peddlers, who were identified as Rafiq Ahmad Mir, resident of Chakthopora, Humayun Tariq & Abid Hamid both residents of Nowshera Baramulla, Javid Ahmad Ganie, resident of Bachi Trikanjan & Arshid Ahmad Mugal, resident of Salamabad Uri. Among arrested drug peddlers, two each were arrested in jurisdiction of Police Station Bonyar & Police Station Uri while other was arrested in jurisdiction of Police Station Tangnarg. All accused were shifted to respective Police Station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and investigation started.

Besides, Police in its recent action against drug dealings in Kulgam, booked 2 notorious drug peddlers under preventive detention under PIT NDPS Act by orders issued by Divisional Commissioner Kashmir. They were identified as Ali Mohammad Mir, son of Late Ghulam Hassan Mir, resident of Mir Mohalla DFI Pora and Azaz Ahmed Wani, son of Abdul Rahman Wani, resident of Wanigund Khudwani. They were detained under provisions of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substance Act for their repeated involvement in drug peddling and have been lodged in Central Jail Kot Bhalwal Jammu.

Inter-district vehicle-lifters' gang busted; 2 more stolen vehicles recovered

BUDGAM: Police on Monday seized two more vehicles in connection with case FIR number 28/2022 pertaining to busting of an Inter-District Gang of vehicle lifters. Earlier, 4 accused persons were arrested & 11 stolen vehicles were recovered from their possession. As per the details, during the course of investigation of the said case, two more stolen vehicles with fabricated registration numbers were recovered from Watrigh area of Budgam district, taking the toll of recovered stolen vehicles to 13. The recovered vehicles included White colour Honda City [(Original Registration number DL14CC-5699), (fake Registration number JK02BL-1170)] & White colour Vitara Breeza [(Original Registration number DL9CAV-4656), (FAKE Registration number DL2CBB-6437)]. The investigation of the case is still going on. More arrests and recoveries of stolen vehicles in the instant case are expected.

Rs 27,800 fine recovered from SoPs violators

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across the district Ramban, the Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 27,800 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 93,60,250. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC. As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 3,564 samples including 740 RT-PCR and 2824 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 489 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.

As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh, the Health Department on Monday administered the COVID vaccine doses to 489 persons including 393 children in 15-17 years age group in the district.

Crack whip on illegal mining, overcharging of minerals; 3 dumps seized, fine of Rs 48,000 recovered
