CRIME REPORT

Minor fire breaks out at GMC Jammu

JAMMU: A minor fire broke out at Government Medical College (GMC) hospital here on Tuesday, but no one got injured, officials said. The fire was noticed in storeroom of ward-8 of hospital at Bakshi Nagar at around 10 AM and was swiftly brought under control, thereby averting a possible tragedy, they said.

An official of fire and emergency services said fire tenders were rushed to the spot on getting information about fire that is believed to have been caused due to a short-circuit. The fire was put out at around 10.20 am and there was no loss of life or injury in incident, a police official said.



Notorious drug peddler arrested, contraband & cash recovered

BUDGAM: Acting tough against menace of drugs, Police on Tuesday arrested a notorious drug peddler in Budgam and recovered contraband and cash from his possession.

As per details, officers from Police Station Budgam at a checkpoint established near Ichgam Temple intercepted a suspect identified as Mohammad Shafi Mouchi, son of Nazir Ahmed Mouchi, resident of Ichgam. During search, 300 gm Charas & cash amounting to Rs 11,300, believed to be proceedings of drug peddling, were recovered from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 43/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Budgam and further investigation started.

Rs 29,900 fine recovered from SoPs violators

RAMBAN: Continuing the enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across district Ramban, the Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 29,900 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs 93,90,150. The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department collected 3,851 samples including 722 RT-PCR and 3,129 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 489 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district. As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr Suresh, Health Department on Tuesday administered COVID vaccine doses to 402 persons including 278 children in 15-17 years age group in the district.

4 fraudsters nabbed with fake RCs, number plates; 4 vehicles, electronic gadgets & incriminating material seized

R S PURA: Police on Tuesday nabbed four fraudsters with fake RCs, number plates and seized four vehicles, electronic gadgets and various incriminating material from their possession. As per details, after generating input regarding fake RCs and number plates, R S Pura police arrested four fraudsters and recovered fake RCs and number-plates along with four vehicles.

A special police team led by SHO R S Pura Jai Pal Sharma constituted under the supervision of SDPO R S Pura Shabir Khan raided a hideout used by fraudsters and recovered fake material used for making illegal profit. Four accused namely



Kewal Krishan alias Billa, son of Banarsi Lal, resident of Khan Chak R S Pura; Neeraj Kumar, son of Rattan Lal, resident of Rangpur Sidhrey; Ashok Singh, son of Ganga Singh, resident of Hari Vihar Kunjwani and Kuldeep Singh, son of Gandhrava Singh, resident of Bera R S Pura were also arrested. Subsequently, FIR No 23/2022 under sections 420/467/468/471 of IPC was registered at Police Station R S Pura. During intensive questioning, the accused provided more leads and on their disclosures a Scorpio with registration number JK02BC/0101 was recovered but original number of said vehicle was DL3CAS/3760. Moreover, a Balero (JK11E/7555) with original number JK12A/8328; Breeza chassis no MA3NYFB1SJ48610 and engine No D13A-5767732 and Alto with Chassis no MA3EUA61S00876011 and engine No F8DN5641258 were also recovered. In addition to it, a laptop, a printer used for preparing fake RCs was also seized. Police is also working out thoroughly to crack forward and backward cartel of this illegal trade. The whole operation was conducted under supervision of SP Headquarters Jammu Rannish Gupta.

12 bovines rescued; 6 smugglers arrested

JAMMU/ KISHTWAR: Police on Tuesday foiled various bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 12 bovines and arrested 6 smugglers.

As per details, acting tough against the bovine smugglers, Jammu Police rescued 7 bovine animals i.e., 4 from vehicle with registration number JK02CD/5175 and 3 bovines from vehicle with registration number JK02CP/5032 at Suketar Jhajjar Kotli Naka, laid by teams from Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. In this regard two different FIRs viz No. 40/2022 and 41/2022, under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act respectively were registered at Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and 4 accused were arrested, who were identified as Pappu (driver), son of Abdul Ganai, resident of Javed Nagar, Beli Charana; Mohd Fareed, son of Shah Mohd, resident of Sidhra; Bilal Ahmed, son of Mohd Ayub, resident of Kulgam and Abi Hussain (driver), son of Mir Ali, resident of Dhammi, Jhajjar Kotli. The arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Devinder Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

Meanwhile, on a specific information a special team led by Insp Vikas Jasrotia SHO Atholi and under supervision of SDPO Atholi Vikram Singh laid a Naka at Atholi area. While checking, 5 bovines were rescued and 2 smugglers were arrested. A vehicle was also seized on the spot. In this regard, FIR No. 06/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Atholi and investigation started.

Bootlegger nabbed with 32 bottles of illicit liquor

DODA: Police on Tuesday arrested a bootlegger and recovered 32 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession.

As per details, a team of Police Station Doda while on patrolling duty in Doda town apprehended a suspect, who on seeing police, tried to escape but on was chased and nabbed by alert cops. On enquiry, he was identified as Surinder Singh, son of Prem Singh, resident of Maneshi Bhagwa, district Doda. During search of his bag, 32 bottles of illicit liquor were recovered. He was arrested and FIR no.31/22 under section 48 (A) of Excise Act was registered at Police Station Doda.

Drug peddler apprehended with narcotic substance

Doda Police said that a party from Police Station Doda during patrolling noticed a suspect who on seeing Police tried to flee but was nabbed by alert cops. On enquiry, the suspect disclosed his identity as Amir Hussain, son of Mohd Rafiq Tantary, resident of Nagni, Tehsil Kahara Doda and on search narcotic substance was recovered from his possession, which he was carrying illegally for selling among youth. He was arrested and FIR No. 30/2022, under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Doda. The recovery of Narcotic Substance and arrest were made under supervision of Insp Arun Sharma, SHO Police Station Doda and Jaswant Singh, Dy SP Hqrs Doda.



Trucker nabbed with 1.5 quintal poppy straw

SAMBA: Police on Tuesday arrested a truck driver and recovered approximately 1.5

quintal poppy straw like substance from the truck.

As per the details, a party from Police Post Mansar during routine vehicle checking intercepted a truck (JK03E-6766) at Mansar Naka, Samba and during checking recovered 8 plastic sacks filled with poppy straw like substance, each weighing approximately 15-20 Kg, which were concealed tactfully beneath other plastic sacks containing raw wool. The accused driver, identified as Firdous Ahmed Yatoo, son of Mohd Akbar Yatoo, resident of Sheikhpoora Moran, Pulwama was arrested on the spot and contraband along with vehicle were seized. FIR No. 33/2022 under sections 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Samba and further investigation started. The whole operation was carried out under supervision of SSP Samba, Dr Abhishek Mahajan.



2 missing boys traced, reunited with family

KATHUA: Police on Tuesday traced out 2 missing (minor) boys and reunited them with their family members.

As per details, on February 22, 2022, a missing report was lodged at Police Station Billawar by father of minor boys stating therein that his sons namely Mohd Sadiq (17) and Mushtaq Poswal, both resident of Dhanu Parol Billawar, District Kathua went missing. Accordingly, FIR No. 142/2022 under section 363/IPC was registered and search started to trace them. Acting instantly on the missing report, the missing boys were traced out from Katra and were immediately handed-over to their legal heirs after completion of all legal formalities. Family members have applauded swift action and timely intervention of Kathua Police in the matter.

6 soldiers, 2 tourists among 24 injured in separate accidents

SRINAGAR: At least 24 persons including six army soldiers and two tourists got injured in four separate accidents in Kashmir valley on Tuesday.

As per details, six army soldiers were injured when a gypsy, they were travelling in, collided with a Dumper (JK01R-1833) at Chooraa area of Sangrama in the district. All injured were shifted to hospital, who were identified as Dharmender Singh, Muttu Kumar, Puneetkar, Taranjit Singh, Mandeep Singh and Taminder Singh.

Meanwhile, eight persons got injured after a vehicle they were travelling in skidded off the road at Laganbal Pahalgam near Hotel Kulhai Glacier in Anantnag district. As per details, a Tavera vehicle (JK018A-0320) fell into a gorge, resulting in injuries to eight persons, who were shifted to PHC Pahalgam from where doctors referred them to GMC Anantnag for specialized treatment. The injured persons were identified Mohammad Saleem Dar from Pahalgam, Fahameda, wife of Manzoor Ahmad from Anantnag, Imtiyaz Ahmad from Anantnag, Shahid Nazir from Kokernag, Muneer Ahmad from Mujkund Srinagar, Vipal Chohan from Gujrat, Jyoti Chohan from Gujrat and driver Imtiyaz Ahmad Mir from Batkot.

Two more accidents happened near Gander bridge Pampore and Pattan Baramulla, in which five persons got injured.

At Pampore, an accident occurred between Santro car (JK01M-2803) and Tavera (JK13B-2024) resulting in injuries to five persons, who were admitted to hospital. At Ranji area of Pattan, there was head-on collision between two vehicles, injuring five persons.

Retired BSF Jawan 'murdered' in Jammu

JAMMU: A retired BSF Jawan was found 'murdered' in a house at Akalpur area of Domana on Tuesday.

As per details, body of Bua Diita, son of Dharam Dass, resident of Akalpur was found in pool of blood in his house. During investigation, police found a blood-ridden axe and some stains of blood in his bed-sheet. He was staying alone at home while his wife & son were residing at Talab Tillo for last six years. His other son is in Army and presently posted at Chennai. Police has sent body to morgue and a forensics team has collected evidences from the spot.

Driver dies after car hit divider
