# Corruption charges framed against Patwari in trap case

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge Anti-corruption Kathua Kamlesh Pandit on Wednesday framed corruption charges against Romesh Chander, son of Bishan Dass, resident of Thal, Tehsil Lohai Malhar, at present Malti Tehsil Billawar, then Patwari Halqa, Bhaddu, Tehsil Billawar (Kathua), who was caught red-handed by Anti-Corruption Bureau (ACB)

while accepting a bribe Rs 10,000 from complainant for issuance of a Fard.

Additional Sessions Judge Anti-Corruption Kathua Kamlesh Pandit after hearing both sides observed that it was prima facie proved by the prosecution at this stage that accused was demanding illegal gratification from complainant for issuance of Fard (revenue extract) and a successful trap was laid against accused for

proving demand and acceptance of bribe, which was also recovered from his possession during the trap. As a sequel to all what has been discussed herein above, the court has no reason to differ with conclusion arrived at by the Investigating Officer as there are grounds for presuming that accused has committed offence alleged to have been committed by him and is liable to be charged accordingly.

# DB directives in PIL on deaf & dumb populace of Paralkote

JAMMU: In a Public Interest Litigation (PIL) regarding difficulties of deaf and dumb population of Paralkote village in Poonch, a Division Bench of J&K High Court Jammu Wing comprising Chief Justice Pankaj Mithal and Justice Sindhu Sharma granted a month's time to comply with direction passed by the Court on February 15, 2021.

It is worthwhile to mention here that on February 15, 2021, the Division Bench observed that on basis of news item published on November 29, 2018 in context to village Paralkot of Poonch that most of the population therein is deaf and dumb, a suo-motu action was taken by the court. DB further observed that status report on record indicates that Government has sanctioned a pension of Rs 1,000 per month to suffering villagers and an amount of Rs 3,25,000 has been sanctioned for setting-up a Vocational Skill Development Courses," DB observed. Deputy AG submitted that Institute of Human Genomics, University of Jammu is studying the matter but on account of COVID-19 pandemic, report could not be submitted. DB after hearing Deputy AG, directed for filing fresh action taken report along with report of University of Jammu bringing on record the suggestions or proposals of Government, intended to taken to get rid of the impairment from village.
