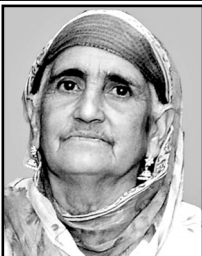

# CRIME REPORT

## Rescue mission launched to trace 6 missing persons traveling from Anantnag to Kishtwar

SRINAGAR: Authorities launched a rescue mission on Thursday to trace six persons, who went missing a day ago, while traveling from Anantnag to Kishtwar, officials said. A three-pronged rescue mission has been launched to trace them, they said. "Rescue mission has been launched to search the six missing persons at Margan top," officials said.

"One team is proceeding by road along with snow cutter machine and JCB, led by SDM and accompanied by Tehsildar MED and NHIDCL officials while the second team, comprising Army rescue team and local volunteers, is proceeding by foot," they said, adding that third helicopter rescue team, is currently on standby at Larkipora and waiting for weather conditions to improve, the officials added.

The six persons from Warwan, started their journey on foot from Anantnag via Margan Top. Kashmir valley, especially areas in south, received heavy snowfall on Wednesday and there are apprehensions that persons might have been caught somewhere in snow.

## AE facing bribery charges commits suicide in judicial custody

JAMMU: An Assistant Engineer (Civil), posted at GE Satwari Office, Jammu Cantt, who was in judicial custody after trapped by ACB in a bribery case, committed suicide on Thursday.

As per details, Mohd Imran Ullah, AE (Civil), was trapped by sleuths of CBI-ACB Jammu on January 7, 2022 on charges of demanding and accepting a bribe of Rs 10,000 along with a Junior Engineer (his sub-ordinate). As his bail plea was also rejected on February 12, 2022 by CBI court, he was presently in judicial custody and committed suicide. The exact circumstances of suicide have not been ascertained yet but there are substantial doubts regarding some foul-play within jail premises, an official said.

## 2 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

GANDERBAL: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Thursday arrested two drug peddlers in Ganderbal and recovered contraband substance from their possession.

As per details, officers from Police Post Shadipora under the supervision of DySP Hqrs Ganderbal Abdul Majid, at a checkpoint established at Waskoora intercepted a Xylo (JK15-0610) with two persons onboard. During search, officers recovered 15 bottles of Codeine Phosphate & 128 capsules of banned drugs from accused, who were identified as Bilal Ah Parry, son of Ali Mohd Parry, resident of Wangipora, Sumbal and Javid Ahmad Ganie, son of Ghulam Mohammad Ganie, resident of Lar. They were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No 41/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Ganderbal and investigation started.

## Rs 9,300 fine recovered from SoPs violators

RAMBAN: Continuing enforcement drive to implement COVID protocol across district Ramban, Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance. The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs 9,300 taking total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs 94,29,350. The Enforcement officers urged people to wear face-masks and maintain physical distancing besides taking COVID vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

As per daily bulletin issued by Chief Medical Officer Ramban, Dr Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 2,980 samples including 593 RT-PCR and 2,387 RAT samples besides administering COVID vaccine to 339 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres.

As per District Immunization Officer Ramban Dr Suresh, J&K Health Department administered COVID vaccine doses to 339 persons including 226 children in 15-17 years age group in district.

## 9 vehicles booked for over-charging, other violations

REASI: Assistant Regional Transport Officer Reasi, Rajesh Gupta along with his team, on Thursday, conducted an extensive checking on Katra to Domail route. During inspection, ARTO enquired from passengers the fare being charged. He also assured public that strict action, as per norms of Motor Vehicles Act, will be initiated against offenders.

During extensive checking, the team challaned 9 vehicles for over-charging and

many other violations besides recovering an amount of Rs 61,000 as fine. The ARTO also sensitised drivers about Motor Vehicle Act norms and urged them to follow traffic rules to ensure their safety. During checking of vehicles, the ARTO emphasised that traffic violation leads to road accidents and kills hundreds of people on daily-basis but adherence to laws can avert such tragedies besides making commuting hassle free.

The ARTO also organised an awareness camp on MVA at Government Middle School Moorie. While interacting with students, the ARTO emphasised that everyone should know about traffic norms.

He also interacted with drivers as well as general public besides advising them to follow traffic norms & COVID SoPs.

## 41 bovines rescued; smuggler arrested

KATHUA: Tightening noose over bovine smugglers within district, Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP R C Kotwal rescued 41 bovines and arrested a smuggler on Thursday.

As per details, a police team led by Insp Sunil Kumar SHO Police Station Hiranagar under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan while on Naka checking duty in its jurisdictional area near Londi Morh intercepted a truck (JK02BM-5525), driven by one Amarjeet Singh, son of Kulbir Singh, resident of Palpora, Tehsil & District Kulgam. During checking, 23 bovines were found laden in vehicle, which were rescued. The accused was arrested and FIR No. 22/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Hiranagar.

Meanwhile, a police team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Police Station Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Sachit Mahajan during Naka checking duty near NH Rajbagh, noticed a suspicious truck (JK02AT-4957) which was signaled to stop for checking. On seeing Naka party, driver managed to flee from the spot leaving the vehicle abandoned. On thorough checking, 18 bovines were found loaded in it, which were rescued. FIR No. 33/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Rajbagh.

## Theft case solved; 3 arrested & 5 quintal iron-bars recovered

RAMBAN: Police on Thursday solved a theft case within 24 hours by arresting 3 persons & recovered five quintal iron.

As per details, on February 23, a complaint was received from one Ashok Sharma, son of Balkrishan Sharma, resident of Tringla, Batote regarding theft of some iron material (Srya) which was kept near his house at Tringla Batote, during intervening night of February 22-23, 2022 by some unknown persons.

In this connection, FIR No. 18/22 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Batote. Acting swiftly, a police team visited the place and enquired from some people in locality to fetch some clues about stolen items. After getting some leads, the police team arrested three persons namely Harbans Lal alias Chittu, son of Kartar Chand, resident of Sanasar; Sandeep Singh alias Chottu, son of Pyar Singh, resident of Thopal and Bhushan Kumar, son of Balak Ram, resident of Baroon, Batote. On sustained questioning, they confessed their crime and on their disclosures, stolen iron Saria (weighing 5 quintals) along with an Auto Load Carrier (JK19 9517) which was used in the commission of offence, were recovered and seized. Further investigation is underway to retrieve other stolen items. The recovery and arrests were made by a police team under the supervision of Inspector Sudhir Sadotra SHO Batote and DySP Hqrs Ramban Pardeep Singh Sen and under overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

## Youth dies of asphyxiation, colleague found unconscious

DODA: An 18-year-old youth, working in a hotel as cook, died of suffocation while his colleague was found in an unconscious state, as duo had kept a coal gas heater in their room in Doda district, officials said on Thursday.

As per details, duo Shah Nawaz Hussain (18) and Adil Hussain Sheikh (22), both residents of Dharam area of Tehsil Gool in District Ramban were working as cooks in a hotel at Kahara, Doda. They were found in an unconscious state in their rented room and subsequently shifted to hospital, where doctors declared Shah Nawaz as brought dead while Adil was admitted in hospital and is presently under treatment.

## Jawan dies as shed collapsed due to snowfall

SRINAGAR: An army Jawan died after a shed collapsed due to snowfall inside Badami Bagh Cantonment area in outskirts of Srinagar city on Thursday.

## Army apprehends suspicious Bangladeshi resident from Baramulla

The person is presently under police custody at Uri.

## Two absconders arrested

As per details, an absconder namely Daljeet Singh alias Jeeta, son of Sikander Singh, resident of Mawa Karora Akhnoor, who was evading his arrest in FIR No. 75/2021 under section 379 of IPC at Police Station Akhnoor, has finally been arrested. Information was received at Police Station Akhnoor regarding location of absconder, on which a team from Police Station Akhnoor under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Akhnoor Insp Hilal Azhar arrested the absconder from a suspected location.

Meanwhile, Police team from Nowabad Police Station apprehended an absconder namely Parveen Kumar, son of Dev Raj, resident of Kothay Bulandy Tehsil Bishnah, who was evading arrest in FIR No 149/2013 registered under section 4/25 of Arms Act at Police Station Nowabad and against whom warrant was issued by Learned Sub Registrar (JMJC) Jammu on March 31, 2015. SHO Nowabad Rajesh Khajuria along with his team did, acting on a tip-off, raided a suspected location and arrested the absconder.

## Two persons get trapped in flood-like situation, rescued

## Two missing persons traced, reunited with families

## Bootlegger arrested with 85 bottles of illicit liquor

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested a bootlegger and recovered 85 bottles of illicit liquor from his possession.
