DB directs for making common law for all charitable, religious institutions



shrine in Union Territory as a

whole may not be an appropriate and feasible exercise. Therefore, to have a consolidate and a uniform legislation for all charitable and religious institutions and endowments within the Union territory, we feel that it would be more appropriate and better if the government identifies all such institutions in the State/UT as a whole and endeavours to make a common law for all of them if necessary, the Court

The Division Bench after hearing both sides observed that on foundation of facts and circumstances of case, the Court dispose of petition finally leaving it open to Advocate General or the public spirited persons having some interest in temple to get a scheme of management prepared with

the intervention of the court under section 92 of CPC and at the same time directed the Government to explore possibility of a legislation in consonance with Acts enacted for management and governance of similar shrines in the Union Territory or country elsewhere. The Court expected the Government to take a positive call in this regard without any delay in right earnest as early as possible and come up with an appropriate legislation and till such time, any arrangement as aforesaid should be made and enforced. DB directed the Government to entrust entire management of the Shrine in question to one of the Shrine Boards existing in Union Territory in context with temples/shrines.
