### **NC** will contest elections whenever held: Farooq

SRINAGAR: National Conference president Farooq Abdullah on Saturday said his party will contest elections whenever they are held in Jammu and Kashmir but remained critical of the ongoing delimitation exercise.

He was speaking after the People's Alliance for Gupkar Declaration (PAGD), comprising five mainstream political parties of Jammu and Kashmir, met at his residence here to discuss the fallout of the draft recommendations of the Delimitation Commission.

"We will fight the elections, there is no doubt about it. We are not going to run away from it but these (draft recommendation of delimitation commission) are the things which pain

undoubtedly realise that it has not been only a misadventure but violation of the Constitution and a huge betrayal," the PAGD said in its 38-page white paper.

The alliance said that it will be sufficiently clear that the unilateral and unethical decisions pushed the entire region to uncertainty and widened the gulf between the people of Jammu and Kashmir and the rest of the country and above all resulted in an avoidable drain on the scarce and precious resources to maintain calm on the streets.
