# Only Modi Govt provided succour to refugees: Kavinder

JAMMU: There is no match in the history to the steps taken by the PM Narendra Modi led government in providing succor to the refugees from PoK as for the first time the hapless community got Rs 5.5 lakh as relief. This was stated by senior BJP leader and former Deputy Chief Minister Kavinder Gupta during a meeting with delegation of SOS International, an organization of PoK refugees' settled in J&K. The delegation was led by its Chairman, Rajiv Chhuni, which also submitted a memorandum to the former deputy CM. mRajiv apprised Kavinder that for the last more than one year there's no permanent Provincial Rehabilitation Officer in Jammu and the charge has been handed over to Special Secretary, Disaster Management Department who sits in Civil Secretariat, Jammu/Srinagar which has made things cumbersome for
