JAMMU: Sadia Tariq of J&K secured gold in the just concluded Moscow Wushu Stars Championship which was part of the exposure events to the Indian Wushu team preparing for the Asians.

As per a tweet by the Secretary J&K Sports Council, Nuzhat Gul, Sadia won gold beating Russia opponent in the finals.

Sadia is a two times gold medalist in the Junior National Wushu Championship.

As per the reports reaching here, Sadia outplayed a local favourite at the event which is the approved event in the Annual Calendar Training



and Competition of the Sports Authority of India (SAI). Both the Junior and Senior India team is participating in the championship.

Earlier in the day, former Sports Minister and Athens Olympics medalist Rajyavardhan Rathore took to social media and laud the gold-winning effort from

Sadia.

Sadia is the daughter of India Today cameraman from Srinagar, Tariq Lone. A beaming father Lone who is in New Delhi said it is not just her medal but his as well.

Ranji Trophy: After a hard toil on field, J&K batters show application

JAMMU: After toiling hard on the field for around three sessions on day-2 and the penultimate day today, Jammu and Kashmir batsmen showed application, composure and promise today, but have a huge task at hand on the final day tomorrow, needing 319 runs more to win with 6 wickets in hand in the Ranji Trophy Elite Group-C match at IIT Chemplast, Chennai.

Earlier, resuming from an overnight score of 128/2, Karnataka declared their second innings at 298/3, thus setting a target of 508 runs for Jammu and Kashmir: Sidharth KV top scored with 72-ball 72 runs, while first innings centurion Karun Nair and skipper Manish Pandey contributed unbeaten 71 and 37 respectively. Openers Samarth R and Devdutt Padikkal scored 62 and 49 runs respectively. Left-arm spinner Abid Mushtaq was the only successful bowler from J&K, taking all three wickets to fall, conceding 65 runs in his 18 overs. Chasing a huge winning target of 508 runs in the second essay, J&K batsmen showed resistance and were 189 for the loss of

4 wickets in 71 overs at the draw of stumps today. Skipper Ian Dev Singh Chauhan was unbeaten on 65 off 113 balls, studded with 8 fours and 2 sixes, talented Abdul Samad was at the crease on 21 off 29 deliveries with 1 four and 2 sixes. Earlier, wicketkeeper batsman, Fazil Rashid, who was promoted to number-3 spot scored magnificent 65 runs off 140 balls, studded with 8 fours and 2 sixes. Jatin Wadhawan (15), Shubham Singh Pundir (09) and Qamran Iqbal (04) fell cheaply. For Karnataka, Shreyas Gopal took 3 wickets by conceding 90 runs in his 19 overs, while Prasadh Krishna claimed 1 wicket by giving away 20 runs in his 12 overs.

With last day's play left, J&K needs 319 more runs to win with 6 wickets in hand.

Though, it is a huge ask for J&K, but with Ian leading from the front, promising Samad at the other end, Parvez Rasool yet to come, all-rounders- Abid, Auqib in J&K's kitty, surface behaving beautifully and cricket being the game of glorious uncertainties, all the three possibilities are there- a win, a loss or a draw. Let's wait for the final day.
