About the widening of Kalakote- Siot road, the ExEn PMGSY Rajouri apprised that the DPR for the same has been formulated and the work on the road would be executed under PMGSY Phase-I.

Regarding Khawas to Dalheri, the ExEn PMGSY Budhal said that the road has been renovated.

For the identification of the additional beneficiaries under PMAY-G, the ACP informed that a comprehensive survey has been carried out and 42000 new beneficiaries have been identified for providing the benefits under Awas Plus

While reviewing the action taken on the culvert on Lam-Qila Darhal road, the meeting was informed that the funds for the culvert stands sanctioned and the work on the culvert would be executed in the next financial year.

Regarding the construction of PHC Building at Sair Makri, it was informed that the DPR for the construction of the said building stands prepared and sent to the Medical Education Department for grant administrative approval but the said approval has not been received as yet.

Similarly, a detailed discussion on other developmental issues was also held in the meeting.

The ALS 108 ambulances shall serve in Chinta, Chilli, and Kastigarh area, while soon a similar ambulance will be started for Marmat area also.

KHOUR: A protest was held under the leadership of Congress leader Satish Sharma at Khour against the anti people policies of the current BJP led Govt of J&K.

Hundreds of youth and local residents joined the protest outside SDM office Khour to raise their demands of revocation of order of cancellation of jobs, reinstatement of separate ALC quota and to express their anguish against the failures of Govt of J&K to control mining mafia & issuing of anti people orders to disturb the peace of people living in rural areas. While addressing the people Satish Sharma said that the Government of J&K which is remotely controlled by central BJP Govt is a complete failure and is each day proving to be a disaster for the people of J&K. He said that this Govt approved to designate a competent authority for seeking permission to do any kind of construction in the rural area. This rule is threat to the social fabric of our rural society as this rule is going to make a ground for unrest in the rural areas as there are serious apprehensions about the members of this committee in the people living in rural areas as Sarpanch is not elected by whole village and might work on an biased basis towards his

supporters & people who opposed him in Sarpanch elections. Also the Patwari is an already over-burned Govt employee so it is going to be a hard exercise for the people to seek permission from them. Satish also raised the issue of recruitment for the post of constable in two border battalions in which they "excluded the candidates who had earlier qualified/disqualified in PET/PST in earlier notification of these posts. Order of exclusion is against the spirit of law and violates fundamental right under Article 16 of the constitution which guarantees "equality of opportunity in matters of public employment". Satish said that youth of J&K wants revocation of this rule and include all the candidates in the recruitment process. An memorandum raising all these demands was also given to SDM, Khour. Ex Minister of State Kuldeep Verma, BDC Chairman Praveen Kumar , Prem Singh Vice President DCC, Vijay Singh Sarpanch Panjtoot, Nikku Ram, Bablu Ram, Suraj Sharma(All Former Sarpanches), Rattan Lal, Ashok Kumar Ex Naib Sarpanch, Prabhu Dayal, Ajeet Singh, Tarsem Singh, Gittan Lal, Ram Nath President Bhagat Biradari and others were also present in the protest.
