JK Women Science Congress 2024 begins at JU

JAMMU: Lieutenant Governor J&K and Chancellor, University of Jammu Manoj Sinha, inaugurated the JK Women Science Congress organized by the University of Jammu in collaboration with the J&K Science Technology and Innovation Council, Government of Jammu & Kashmir.

The inaugural function was attended by Dr. Vibha Tandon Director Indian Institute of Chemical Biology, Kolkata (IICB-CSIR who was also Guest of Honor for the congress, Prof Umesh Rai, Vice Chancellor, University of Jammu, Prof Anju Bhasin Dean Academic Affairs & convenor of the congress and co-convenor of the congress Prof Jyoti Vakhlu along with full participation from the dignitaries from various spheres, former university faculty, current faculty, scholars and students.

Dr. Vibha Tandon, delivered a thought-provoking inaugural talk on "Women in Science: Past, Present, and Future" during the inaugural session. She focused on the impact of government policies on the improvement of the status of women in the field of science. Prof Tandon highlighted the societal influences on career choices, emphasizing that societal perceptions significantly shape a person's career path. Prof Vibha Tandon left the audience with a powerful message: "You

never know how strong you are until being strong is your only choice".

Prof. Umesh Rai, presided over the inaugural session. In his presidential address, Prof. Rai renewed the commitment of the University to the upliftment of all genders, saying this congress has been organized in a trans-disciplinary mode by dissolving boundaries and evolving education. Prof. Anju Bhasin gave a formal welcome address.

Prof. Jyoti Vakhlu, Co-convenor delivered a formal vote of thanks. The inaugural session was followed by a lecture series in both offline and online mode by researchers of international repute. The first session was chaired by Prof. Riddhi Shah, Professor of Mathematics, School of Physical Sciences, JNU and Prof. Samridhi Arora, Department of Home Science, JU was the co-chairperson and Dr. Sheetal Ambardar from the School of Biotechnology was the rapporteur. The chairperson introduced the speaker to the audience and highlighted the achievements made by them in their respective fields.

The first lecture was delivered by Prof. Prajval Shastri, Emeritus Scientist from Raman Research Institute, Bengaluru on the topic "Understanding the Hefiest Things We Know: Giant distant black holes". During the session, Prof

Shastri delved into the intriguing realm of astro-physics, illustrating the stark differences in the appearance of Jupiter when observed in visible light versus radiolight. The second Session was chaired by Prof. Prajval Shastri and co-chaired by Prof. Namrata Sharma from the Department of Botany, JU and Dr. Sandeep Arya from the Department of Physics was the rapporteur.

Prof. Jasdeep Dhanoa from Indra Gandhi Delhi Technical University for Women talk, titled "Electronics to Spintronics: Growth and Future of VLSI Technology," dove into the dynamic aspects of electronic spin manipulation and its application in enhancing memory devices. Prof. Dhanoa meticulously explained how the principles of spintronics could lead to faster, more energy-efficient memory storage solutions compared to traditional electronics.

The next lecture was delivered by Prof. Riddhi Shah (Professor of Mathematics, School of Physical Sciences, Jawaharlal Nehru University, New Delhi) on certain aspects of dynamics. Prof. Shah explored cutting-edge research on how dynamics can be applied to solve complex problems in engineering, physics, and mechanics. The third session was chaired by Prof. Jasdeep Dhanoa and Co-chaired by

Prof. Sandeep Pandita from the Department of Geology and Dr. Monika from the Department of Chemistry University of Jammu was the Rapporteur for this session. The session began with a talk by Prof. Manzoor Ahmad Malik (Prof. of Physics, and Dean, Physical and Mathematical Sciences, University of Kashmir) on Science for sustainable development. He highlighted 17 sustainable goals regarding food science.

The last lecture of the day was delivered by Prof. Farooq A Masoodi (Professor of Food Science and Technology, Dean Academic Affairs, University of Kashmir) on the Production of Pullulan and pectin from apple pomace: A sustainable approach towards valorizing agro-industrial by-products. He talked about the importance of converting waste to wealth.

The day concluded with the cultural ensemble headed by Prof. Sanjana Kaul, convenor cultural committee JKWSC.

The evening was graced by a dance performance choreographed by Dr. Priya Ditta (IMFA), a theatre play based on Girish Karnad's Nagamandal directed by Ifra Kak, from the theatre club, UTSAH JU along with Dr. Madhulika Singh from the Department of History and Bhupender Jamwal from the cultural committee.

Sanjeevani Sharda Kendra pays tributes to martyrs of 1947-48

JAMMU: A memorial function was organized at Sharda Bhawan Bohri, Jammu under the aegis of Sanjeevani Sharda Kendra to pay tributes to the forgotten sacrifices of Jammu and Kashmir especially who were brutally massacred in the Pakistani invasion of 1947-48.

On this occasion, two minutes silence was also observed for the supreme sacrifice of Indian army and selective killings of other community of faith who laid their lives for the integrity and sovereignty of India. The Chief Guest of the function and member advisory committee of

POJK, R K Chhibber, while addressing the gathering threw light on the incidents of Pakistani invasion in the territory of India in Jammu and Kashmir after the partition. He said that it has been recorded as a black day in history.

He laid emphasis upon that the day is not far when Pakistan Occupied Jammu Kashmir will be again integral part of India because it is our land and now this is the only agenda left. He also revealed that in the coming days, a heritage centre of Pakistan Occupied Jammu and Kashmir will be constructed in Jammu which will inspire us to come closer to

our roots.

Speaking as the keynote speaker, Dr. Ramesh Taimri gave details of the heart-wrenching incidents of the days of 1947-48. Referring to his recently published book 'Pakistan's invasion in J&K 1947-48', he said that the Pakistani invaders invaded Indian territory in a planned manner and killed hundreds and thousands of Hindus and Sikh community.

Chairman of Sanjeevani Sharda Kendra, Dr. Maharaj Krishan Bharat, while paying tributes to the martyrs of 1947-48, said that today there is much need to rebuild the factual narrative when it is being

said that there was a tribal attack on Jammu and Kashmir in 1947-48.

In fact, it was not a tribal attack but Pakistani soldiers infiltrated the Indian borders in a planned manner and selectively killed civilians in Jammu and Kashmir. It was only Indian army who push them back to their territory but unfortunately we loss major portion of Jammu Kashmir now called as Pakistan occupied JK, which is in the illegal occupation of Pakistan.

Narrating the story of the families killed in the Gushi area during the Pakistani invasion of 1947-48, Dr. Bharati Kaushal Bhat said that this is not the story of just one house, these are the real incidents of every second-third house in that area. She said that they gave their lives for their country and religion, in which my grandfather was also murdered.

Radheshyam, a worker of Sanjeevani Sharda Kendra conducted the stage. Lakshra Raina recited a patriotic song.

Public Notice

Solid Waste Management (SWM) Rule 2016 notified by The Ministry of Environment, Forest and Climate Change, Government of India vide notification No. G.S.R. 1357(E) on 08/04/2016 mandated, **Bulk Waste Generator of Municipal Waste** to carry out certain waste management functions by themselves.

1. The Municipal Council Ramban not withstanding any other rules and provision, hereby directs, all **Bulk Waste Generators** who are generating **more than 100Kg of waste per day** in total from their identified premises/property/establishment to implement the provision of the SWM Rule 2016 and the Municipal bye laws thereof notified by the Municipal Council Ramban not later than 45 days from the date of this notice, **including segregation into 3(three) categories/stream (Biodegradable/Non -biodegradable and Domestic Hazardous waste) at source. Storage within the premises for collection and undertake processing and treatment of biodegradable waste within the premises.**

2. All RWAs, Market Association Members, Hotels and Restaurants etc. as defined will be classified as Bulk Generators unless they submit within the notice period a self-declaration of generating less than 100 kg of waste from their premises.

3. Such self-declaration will be subject to verification and penal cost (upto Rs 2500), if found untrue. Such self-declaration shall be submitted to the Municipal Council Ramban within 30 days of this notice for enabling verification. Self-declaration sent/submitted after the due date will be rejected.

4. Any violation of the SWM Rules 2016 for the bulk generator after 30 days of this notice will attract penal charges/fines as stated in the bye laws of the Municipal Council Ramban.

The declaration if found false at a later date will attract penalties as per the byelaws of the Urban Local Bodies.
