Terrorist who killed two labourers from Punjab in Srinagar arrested

SRINAGAR: The terrorist who killed two labourers from Punjab here last week has been arrested, a senior Jammu and Kashmir Police officer said on Tuesday. The weapon used in the attack, a pistol, has been recovered. Additional Director General of Police (ADGP) Vijay Kumar told a press conference here. "Adil Manzoor Langoo, the terrorist who opened fire on the two labourers from Punjab in the Habba Kadal area of the city on February 7, has been arrested," he said. Langoo, a resident of



Zaldagar here, carried out the attack on the directions of his handler in Pakistan, Kumar said and added he was arrested from Srinagar. While Amritpal Singh was killed on the spot in the February 7 attack, Rohit Masih died during treatment at the Sher-i-Kashmir Institute of Medical Sciences a day later. "It has come to the fore that the accused had conspired with his handler in Pakistan for commission of the crime," Inspector General of Police, Kashmir Range, VK Birci, told the press conference.

Let us know if any prosecution carried out under death penalty provision of SC/ST Act: SC to AG

NEW DELHI: The Supreme Court on Tuesday asked Attorney General R Venkataramani to inform it whether anybody has been prosecuted under the penal provision that stipulates mandatory capital punishment for a person whose fabrication of a false evidence has led to conviction and execution of an innocent member of a Scheduled Caste or Scheduled Tribe. A bench of Justices Surya Kant and K V Viswanathan was hearing a PIL filed by advocate Rishi Malhotra, who has sought striking Section 3 (2) of the Scheduled Castes and Tribes (Prevention of Atrocities) Act, 1989 stipulates mandatory death sentence in a case where an innocent member of a scheduled caste or a scheduled tribe is convicted and is executed in consequence of a false and fabricated evidence given by the concerned accused. As the hearing commenced, Venkataramani

Modi says India, UAE partners in progress; hail ancient community, cultural ties

ABU DHABI: Hailing India and the UAE as "partners in progress", Prime Minister Narendra Modi on Tuesday said the ties between the two countries serve as a model for the world and they are scripting a new history in the third decade of the 21st century. "Our partnership is getting stronger in all areas and reaching newer heights. It's India's wish that our partnership keeps getting stronger every passing day," he said. "India and the UAE are partners in progress. Our relationship is of talent, innovation and culture," Modi said while addressing the Indian community here at the 'Ahlan Modi' (Hello Modi in Arabic) grand event. Underscoring the ancient community and cultural ties between the two countries, Modi also spoke a few lines in Arabic, which he later translated as how both India and the UAE are scripting a better future on 'duniya ki kitaab' (the world's book) with 'waqt ki kalam' (the pen of time). He then noted that many of these Arabic words are commonly spoken in India. He told the Indian community here that India is proud

After greeting the thousands-strong audience with a 'Namaskar' amid chants of 'Modi, Modi' at the Zayed Sports City Stadium here, Modi said he was overwhelmed by the affection at the community programme. "You have scripted history by coming in such large numbers here. You may have come from different parts of the UAE and different states of India, but everyone's hearts are connected," Modi said.
