JAMMU: Justice Sanjeev Kumar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court on Wednesday quashed the detention under PSA of Tajinder Singh alias Jinda and directed his release forthwith from preventive custody. if not required in any other case. While quashing the detention order, Justice Sanjeev Kumar, observed that the representation of the petitioner has not been considered by the competent authority at all. # India, China hold military talks on Ladakh border row; no breakthrough

# HC takes strong exception to disclosing name of victim, directs all Criminal Courts of J&K and Ladakh to remain careful while dealing with such cases

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Srinagar Wing, while dealing with an acquittal appeal in rape case, on Wednesday recorded its strong exception to the judgment of the Sessions Judge, where the name of the victim has been repeatedly mentioned.

"It is well established that in the cases relating to sexual offences, the name of the victim is not to be mentioned in any proceeding ", the court observed and directed all the Criminal Courts of Union Territory of Jammu and

Kashmir and Ladakh shall remain careful while dealing with such cases. The Registry shall circulate soft copies of this judgment to all the Criminal Courts of Union Territories of J&K and Ladakh, it ordered.

The appellant-State has challenged the impugned judgment of acquittal on February 15, 2021 passed by Principal Sessions Judge, Budgam, whereby the respondents have been acquitted of the charges for offences under Section 363, 376, 342, and 109 RPC arising out of FIR No.230/2007 registered with Police Station, Budgam

While upholding the acquittal appeal, Justice Sanjay Dhar observed that 27) In the instant case, as already noted, there are contradictions on essential aspects of the case inter se the statements made by the prosecutrix before the police during investigation and before the Court during the trial. There are also contradictions between her statement and the statement of the Medical Officer and there are contradictory versions about the involvement of both the accused in the alleged occurrence. Even the statement of the father of the prosecutrix contradicts her version of

occurrence. In these circumstances, it would be hazardous to base conviction of the respondents/accused on the solitary statement of the prosecutrix or at least it can be said that there is a reasonable doubt with regard to alleged occurrence and involvement of respondents/accused therein. Thus, the conclusion derived by the trial court on the basis of the evidence on record is possible. With these observations, the Court does not find any ground to interfere with the judgment of acquittal passed by the trial court. The
