### Russian skier dead...

Kashmir on Thursday, officials said.

The avalanche struck the Khilan Marg on Afarwat Peak near the Army Ridge at around 2 pm, trapping several skiers under its debris, the officials said.

According to police, the group of seven Russians and a local guide ventured into a non-ski zone in the Army Ridge area, which is avalanche prone

"There was an avalanche warning but they still ventured into that zone and unforunately one skier died," Gulmarg police station SHO Haroon Kar said.

As the news of the avalanche broke, a joint effort was initiated by the Gulmarg Ski Patrol of the Tourism Department, police and the Army to rescue the trapped skiers. The deceased was identified as Hanten from Moscow in Russia and his body has been taken to the Tangmarg sub-district hospital for post-mortem, the police officer said.

The rescued persons were treated at a local hospital and one foreigner was being shifted to Srinagar for special treatment. A government spokesperson said the ongoing 4th Khelo India Winter Games

remain unaffected by the incident. Jammu and Kashmir Sports Council secretary Nuzhat Gull said all athletes par-

ticipating in the ongoing 4th Khelo India Winter Games in Gulmarg were safe.

"All Khelo India athletes are safe after the avalanche hit Khilanmarg area of Gulmarg... All the fixtures are being run as per schedule," Gull posted on X.

The Winter Games began on Wednesday and will conclude on Sunday. A spokesman of the Sports Council said all precautionary measures were in place

to ensure safety of the players.

National Conference leader Omar Abdullah, who was skiing in Gulmarg till

Wednesday, prayed for the safety of the skiers. "While the details are still sketchy some skiers are reportedly missing after an avalanche was triggered in the area around Gulmarg. It appears the skiers were skiing

off the piste or groomed slopes in the 'back country'. "Days like today remind us that while the skiing is fun, the fresh powder exhilarating & the visuals spectacular, skiing is not without its dangers & risk to lives. Praying that all the missing skiers are found alive & the reports of a casualty end

up being unfounded," Abdullah said in a post on X. The last avalanche in Gulmarg was in February last year, when two Polish skiers were killed and over a dozen were rescued. Avalanches are very common in Gulmarg. In 2010, at least 17 soldiers were killed after an avalanche hit the Army's High Altitude Warfare School.

Premises linked to Malik at R K Puram, Dwarka and Asian Games Village in Delhi, besides those in Gurugram and Baghpat, were searched, officials said.

A team of CBI officials reached Malik's ancestral village Hisavda in Uttar Pradesh's Baghpat district, where they went to his home seeking to know about his properties in the village, local officials said.

They opened the rooms of his ancestral home, did some videography and left.

They were told by his relatives that Malik does not have any property and has some share in the house which is also in decrepit state, they said.

The searches also covered the premises of alleged associates of Malik, associates of former chairman of Chenab Valley Power Projects Private Limited Navin Kumar Chaudhary and officials of Patel Engineering Limited, they said.

In a post on X, Malik said, "I have been ill for the last 3-4 days and am admitted to the hospital. Despite this, my house is being raided by the dictator through government agencies. My driver and my assistant are also being raided and harassed unnecessarily. I am a farmer's son, I will not be afraid of these raids. I am with the farmers."

He said his residence was raided by the CBI instead of investigating the people he had complained about and who were involved in corruption. "They will not get anything except 4-5 kurtas and pyjamas. The dictator is trying

to scare me by misusing government agencies. I am a farmer's son, I will neither be afraid nor bow down," he posted.

"Though a decision was taken in the 47th board meeting of CVPPPL (Chenab Valley Power Projects (P) Ltd) for re-tender through e-tendering with a reverse auction after the cancellation of the ongoing tendering process, the same was not implemented (according to the decision taken in the 48th board meeting) and the tender was finally awarded to Patel Engineering Limited," the FIR has alleged. The agency had conducted searches on the premises of five people in January in connection with the case.

But even with an upside down bat, Tendulkar was not to be dismissed as he signed off with a smooth drive, fetching a round of applause and several smiles.

He wasn't done enthralling the gathered crowd with just his cricket. The iconic former captain, who played six World Cups, took selfies with the fans, giving them a memorable few minutes to cherish.

"Mera dhyan aapke upar hai (I am focussed on you)," he told the group.

Tendulkar arrived here last week and visited a cricket bat manufacturer in the Sangam area in South Kashmir before heading to Pahalgham where he stayed at the Pine and Peak hotel.
