HC stays FIR against Ex-PA for former Minister

JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court on Friday stayed the FIR registered by ACB Jammu against Rajinder Sharma who was then PA to former Minister. Justice Sanjay Dhar after hearing Sr. Adv Vikram Sharma with Adv Sachin Dev Sharma for the petitioner, observed that Sr. Adv Vikram Sharma appearing for the petitioner has submitted that the allegations made in the impugned FIR have been subject matter of departmental enquiry initiated against the petitioner and he has been exonerated in the said enquiry. It has been further contended that even the respondent-Anti-corruption Bureau had informed the Director General of Police, J&K that the allegations against the petitioner regarding accumulation of disproportionate assets have not been substantiated. In order to support these assertions, Senior Counsel has brought to the notice of this Court the relevant documents, which have been made part of the instant petition. Sr. Adv Vikram Sharma has contended that the petitioner cannot be subjected to investigation in respect of same allegations, regarding which he has been exonerated in the departmental enquiry and which have been found unsubstantiated in the earlier round of probe conducted by the respondent Anti Corruption Bureau. Justice Sanjay Dhar observed that there appears to be prima facie merit in the submissions made by the Senior Counsel and as such, a case for grant of interim indulgence is made out, issue notice to the respondent, subject to petitioner's taking necessary steps within a week's time and ordered that in the meanwhile, investigation in the impugned FIR shall stay. It is worthwhile to mention here that FIR No.02/2024 u/s 13(1)(b) r/w 13(2) of PC Act has been registered in PS ACB Jammu against Head Constable Rajinder Kumar Sharma based on the outcome of an Enquiry conducted into the allegations that the official has raised disproportionate assets to the known source of his income. During the course of Investigation, searches were conducted in the residential houses of both the officials and business establishments of HC Rajinder Kumar Sharma. During searches some incriminating documents and valuables have been seized and taken for investigation purpose.

Court directs CJM to pass fresh order, set-aside discharge of accused in offence against Public tranquillity

JAMMU: Additional Sessions Judge Doda, Amarjeet Singh Langeh set aside the order passed by Chief Judicial Magistrate, Doda on August 5, 2023 by virtue of which trial Court discharged Respondent/accused in case titled U.T of Jammu and Kashmir through Police Station Doda V/s Rashid Annayat. Allegations against the accused were that he kept a proactive post as status of his WhatsApp on March 31, 2020, the contents of which had the propensity to cause disharmony or feelings of enmity/hatred or ill will between different communities. FIR in this regard was lodged at instance of then DC Doda. After investigation, Investigating Agency presented challan before Chief Judicial Magistrate, Doda seeking prosecution of accused under section 153-B (c) of IPC. Prosecution led evidence before trial Court and ultimately after completion of trial, matter was posted for final arguments. Vide order dated 05-08-2023, trial Court altered the charge from Section 153-B (c) of IPC to 153-A of IPC. Because prosecution for Section 153-A of IPC requires previous sanction from competent authority, Chief Judicial Magistrate,

Doda after altering the charge, discharged the accused for offence under section 153-A of IPC on purported lack of sanction. Against this order, State filed revision before the Court of Addl. Sessions Judge, Doda. While allowing the revision of the State, the Court of Addl. Sessions Judge held, "The point is not that trial Court had no power to alter the charge. What is of essence is that same must be founded on conscious consideration of material available on record. What weighed with the trial Court while passing order impugned, has not been expounded with reasons" adding "Trial Court, it appears - has overly rushed to conclude, without expounding reasons that charge -- was alterable". Elaborating further, Court further observed, "Another aspect of the order impugned which cannot nigggle through/withstand legal scrutiny is that after concluding that respondent ought to have been charged for offence under section 153-A of IPC, and then instead of providing opportunity to investigating agency/ prosecution to produce requisite sanction for trial of respondent in due course, Ld. trial Court -- by adopting a very unusual procedure, chose to truncate the proceedings by discharging respondent for purported

lack of sanction in an overly rushed manner" Adding, "Prosecution cannot be expected to have uniquely endowed itself with an angelic sense to anticipate that trial Court would come to the conclusion while concluding the trial of the case that respondent may be tried for offence under section 153-A of IPC instead of Section 153-B (c) of IPC and therefore it (prosecution) was obligated to produce sanction from competent authority on the date order impugned itself". "Apart from common sense, trial Court ought to have drawn necessary guidance from Section 216 (5) of Cr.PC and given adequate opportunity to prosecution to produce sanction from competent authority" - Court added further. Court accordingly set aside the impugned order and directed Chief Judicial Magistrate, Doda to pass fresh orders in the matter in light of observations made hereinabove. In case, trial Court, by delineating comprehensive reasons, again comes to conclusion that case for alteration of charge against respondent from Section 153-B (c) of IPC to section 153-A of IPC is made out, in that eventuality prosecution be given reasonable and adequate opportunity to produce sanction from competent authority for prosecution of

respondent and thereafter trial Court shall proceed ahead in accordance with law. Court also noticed that APP of the Court of Ld. Chief Judicial Magistrate, Doda applied for certified copy of order impugned on 21-10-2023 after more than two months in a clearly serious case involving offence against public tranquillity. Court maintained that this aspect needs to be gauged assiduously. "A Public Prosecutor, if I may say so -- cannot afford such a degree of Ex facia lackadaisical approach. Let a copy of this order be sent to Director General of Prosecution, Jammu and Kashmir, Jammu for information and appropriate action. This may also help ascertain the cause of delayed filing of instant revision" - Court further observed. It is worthwhile to mention that when plea of limitation was raised for filing revision petition beyond limitation period, Court held that because palpable illegality, impropriety resulting in miscarriage of justice stems out of order impugned, suo moto cognizance of the order impugned was accordingly taken by exercising suo moto revisional Jurisdiction over the matter. With these observations, Court allowed the revisional petition.
