District Hospital Budgam; 50 Bedded Critical Care Block at GMC Baramulla, GMC Rajouri, GMC Kathua, SKIMS Bemina and District Hospital Kulgam.

The Critical Care Blocks under COVID-19 Emergency Response and Health System Preparedness Package Phase-II (ECRP-II) to be constructed at Rs 142.5 crore are 50-bedded Critical Care Blocks each at District Hospitals Pulwama, Kupwara, Reasi, Shopian, Poonch and PHC Sonamarg, Ganderbal.

The critical care units would provide services of emergency, surgical and intensive eare to the patients, PTI quoted an official saying.

Most of the critical care services are confined to tertiary care level with limited access to secondary care and referral transport systems.

The top five causes of mortality - coronary artery disease, chronic obstructive pulnonary disease, stroke, diarrhoeal diseases and neonatal disorders - shall be managed timely at the level of these units itself, the official said, adding it will not only reduce the burden on tertiary care facilities but will also reduce the out of pocket expenses significantly, the official said.

The COVID pandemic has highlighted the need for critical care facilities, especialy at the level of the districts. To augment the capacity of the district for assured treatment and management of patients with infectious diseases or critical illnesses by creating critical care hospital blocks or wings at district hospitals and medical colleges, according to the official.

He said the current architecture of the public hospitals is not equipped fully to handle the dual burden of meeting critical care needs and maintaining essential services as was seen during the two waves of the COVID-19 pandemic.

Many hospital buildings, especially in the districts, do not have provision for segregating a part of the building as an infectious disease treatment blocks, the official

saffron party has never considered elections as a means of gaining power.

Under the Modi government, the country has come out of collective inferiority complex and the respect for India's passport has increased, he said.

"After you gave a chance to Modi in 2014, the respect of the country has grown across the world. Seeing the Indian passport, people overseas now ask have you come from Modi ka Bharat?'. This is the change that has come in the world for India

in the last 10 years," he said.

Attacking the Congress, he said, "If we build parliament (building), they say what

The Congress has been "launching" Rahul Gandhi repeatedly since 20 years, he said

"They launch Rahul Gandhi with a new look but this rocket doesn't launch. Instead, it backfires every time. They again come out with the same rocket," Shah said, adding that there is "Narendra Modi who didn't face even a single accusation",

The Union minister claimed that a Congress MP said that the country should be divided into North and South.

"What has happened to the party of leaders like Sardar Vallabhbhai Patel, Maulana Azad and Mahatma Gandhi? It even couldn't distance itself from such statements. How can you say such a thing? I assure you that nobody can dare do this as there is Narendra Modi government," Shah said.

Earlier in the day, Shah spoke to BJP workers in Gwalior and Khajuraho as part of his party's preparedness for the upcoming Lok Sabha polls.

In Gwalior, he asked the BJP workers to strive for polling of 370 additional votes in each booth, compared to the last general polls, to achieve the party's seat target in the upcoming Lok Sabha elections.

Shah addressed nearly 400 leaders and workers of the booth management committee of Madhya Pradesh's Gwalior-Chambal cluster comprising four Lok Sabha seats - Morena Bhind Guna and Gwalior

Each vote counts for the party, Shah said as he asked the workers to ensure polling of additional 370 votes in each booth, compared to the last elections, a local BJP leader, who attended the meeting, quoted the minister as saying.

Addressing about 23,000 booth-level BJP workers at Khajuraho, Shah urged them to resolve to give the Modi government a third term at the Centre with more than 400 seats, asserting that the coming elections were about making India a superpower and the world's third-largest economy.

Shah said the Congress during its 10-year tenure (between 2004 and 2014) had indulged in scams worth Rs 12 lakh crore.

Hailing the construction of the Ram Temple in Ayodhya under the Modi government, Shah said Congress leader Rahul Gandhi used to take swipes at him by saying the saffron party claims it will build the temple but will not give people the date

Listing out achievements of the party, Shah said the BJP regime at the Centre has ensured 5 kg of free ration monthly to more than 80 crore poor people, provided tapped water to 14 crore families, and given Rs 6,000 annual assistance to 11 crore farmers. The next five years will be the time to lay the foundation of a "great Bharat", he said.

10 drug peddlers arrested, contraband seized

SRINAGAR: In continuation of its efforts to eradicate the menace of drugs from the society, Police on Sunday have arrested three drug peddlers in Sopore and recovered Contraband substances from their possession.

A Police spokesperson said, "On a specific information, a police party of Police Station Sopore alongwith 22 RR headed by SHO PS Sopore Insp. Nissar Ahmad under the supervision of SDPO Sopore Shri. Sarfaraz Bashir at a checkpoint established at Mahrajpora Sopore apprehended three drug persons.'

"During their personal search,1700 grams of contraband charas like substances were recovered from their possession", he said.

"The accused persons were identified as Showkat Ahmad Bhat, son of Abdul Rashid Bhat, resident of Neharpora Sopore; Firdous Ahmad Bhat, son of Ghulam Mohiudin Bhat, resident of Mazbugh Sopore and Firdous Ahmad Dar, son of Nazir Ahmad Dar R/O Mahrajpora Sopore. They have been arrested and shifted to PS Sopore where they remain in custody.

He said that accordingly, case FIR No. 36 of 2024 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act has been registered at Police Station Sopore & investigation has been initiated.

Police also arrested 07 drug peddlers and recovered Contraband/ psychotropsubstances from their possession in Sopore, Ganderbal & Baramulla.

In Sopore, a police party of Police Post Watergam headed by Incharge PF Watergam under the supervision of SDPO Rafiabad and SHO PS Dangiwacha at a checkpoint established at Seelo-Behrampora bridge, intercepted a truck bearing registration No. JK03E-4421 with 03 persons onboard. In Ganderbal, Police Post Shadipora received an information through reliable sources that one person namely Manzoor Ahmad Bhat@ Setha son of Late Gh Mohd Bhat resident of Batwina has hoarded banned drugs in his residential house. Acting swiftly, a Police Party led by Incharge Police Post Shadipora under the supervision of Shri Gh Hassan-JKPS Hqrs Ganderbal raided the spot. During search, 10 Strips of banned drugs (SpasmoProxyvon-Plus) were recovered from the vehicle (Scorpio) bearing Registration No. JK16-0901 belonging to the accused person. Vehicle used in the commission of the crime was also seized. However, the accused managed to escape from the spot and efforts are on to effect his arrest.
