Asian Water Bird Census 2024 launched

SRINAGAR: Chief Executive Director, Wular Conservation and Management Authority and Addl. PCCF Forests Kashmir, T. Rabi Kumar on Monday launched Asian Water Bird census exercise 2024 for Wular, Hokersar and other adjoining wetlands. The department of wildlife protection wetland division and Wular Conservation and Management Authority are jointly conducting Asian Water bird Census, 2024 on 27th February, 2024 for Ramsar sites of Wular, Hokersar, Shallahugh and other adjoining wetlands. Scientists and conservationists from organizations like WII, WTI, Wildlife SOS JK and NGOs like WCF, WRCE, SRDE, SEED, Birds of Kashmir, Kashmir Bird watch, Scholars and students from reputed academic institutions like SKUAST, University of Kashmir, Degree colleges etc. shall take part in the bird counting in these wetlands.

for active collaboration of all stakeholders in mobilising the resources for effective management of our wetlands. He exhorted upon the students to develop bird watching as a habit and promote it as an important eco-tourism activity.

The event witnessed participation of various NGOs, College and University scholars, volunteers, birding watching groups and the departmental staff besides various resource persons were invited to impart training and knowhow with regard to conducting of census exercise.

Ensure strict adherence to project deadlines: CEO ERA to PIUs

SRINAGAR: Chief Executive Officer, Jammu and Kashmir Economic Reconstruction Agency (ERA), Dr. Syed Sehrish Asgar, on Monday instructed the Project Implementation Units (PIUs), executing various components of the World Bank funded Jhelum Tawi Flood Recovery Project, to strictly adhere to the project timelines for completion of the remaining sub projects. Dr. Syed Sehrish issued these directions while chairing a meeting held to review progress on various components of World Bank funded JTFRP being executed by the Srinagar Municipal Corporation, Public Works Department, Industries and Commerce Department, Jammu and Kashmir Medical supplies corporation limited and J&KERA as PIUs at Civil Secretariat, Srinagar;

Superintending Engineer, SMC City Drainage, while giving details of the progress on upgradation work of 47 dewatering stations being executed by the Corporation as project implementation unit, informed that till date work on 40 dewatering stations has been completed and have been made fully functional while work on remaining stations is underway. He further informed that work on two stations at Peerbagh and zero bridge has been impacted due to the litigations which are being proae-

tively followed up by the SMC.

CEO, ERA asked the Director, Technical, JTFRP to conduct the joint site inspection of the said sites along with the officers of Srinagar Municipal Corporation immediately after the meeting and submit a report regarding the matter. She further instructed the representatives of SMC to submit the operation and maintenance plan for all the stations upgraded under the project by the end of this month and ensure completion of sub-project by end of June,2024. Representatives of R&B (PWD) informed that all the sub-projects which were previously being executed by JKPC have been taken over by R&B (PWD) and further estimates and BOQs for balance work of four bridges at Waza Mohalla, Shrakawara, Wahdina and Wagila have been completed and works will be tendered out as soon as technical sanction is given by the competent authority in R&B (PWD).

CEO ERA directed the R&B (PWD) to submit O&M plan for bridges, cleanup restoration of all bridges and buildings constructed by it under the project besides ensuring site clearance and site safety measures at all sites and strict adherence to safety and environmental measures as stipulated under World Bank norms. She also directed that all the social and safeguard issues

related to various sub-projects be expeditiously taken up with the concerned revenue authorities in R&B for their earliest resolution.

Managing Director, Jammu and Kashmir Industries, which is implementing the component of strengthening of livelihoods under JTFRP, informed that sustainability for the 4 artisan clusters including Zaidibal paper machie, Noorbagh Chainstitch, Bandipora Pashmina and Ganderbal Willow clusters is under preparation and will be further modified by the consultant and submitted to JKERA by end of this month.

Representative of JKMSCL informed that most of the procurements made by JKMSCL have been updated on the STEP. JKMSCL was asked to update all the activities by today itself.

Among others the meeting was attended by Dr. Sajad Wani, Chief Accounts Officer, J&KERA/JTFRP, Mehjabeen, Additional Secretary, Legal, JKERA, Ashok Khokar, Project Manager, Transport, J&KERA, Jammu, Pooja Wazir, Deputy Project Manager, Transport, Jammu, Sushil Kumar, Project Manager, Transport, JKERA, Kashmir and senior officers of Srinagar Municipal Corporation, PWD (R&B), JKMSCL, Jammu and Kashmir Industries limited besides J&KERA and JTFRP.

The Secretary impressed upon the Additional Registrars and Deputy Registrars to ensure functioning of a minimum of one Jan Anshadi Kendra in each district. She directed them to ensure functionality of such kendras by the first week of March this year.

She observed that securing a drug license by virtue of the association with PACS should act as an advantage for qualified pharmacists.

She said that such pharmacists should be made an inalienable members of such societies with full rights and stakes like other members. She asked for taking appropriate measures suitable for the location to start functioning of drug stores.

The Secretary asked for turning maximum numbers into drug stores by encouraging the identified pharmacists.

She also asked for increasing the sales of such stores by popularizing them among the public with all the

benefits. She advised for identifying such public health institutions where there is no presence of these stores nearby essentially in far off areas of the UT. She asked for looking into having long term tie ups with such institutions for maximizing benefits for all the associated stakeholders.

Earlier, the Additional Registrars revealed that for each district 5 Jan Aushadi Kendras have been set, out of which, 32 have been made functional. In addition, 42

have applied for drug license and 98 out of 101 applicants have obtained PMBI approvals pre-requisite for establishing such stores, he added.

The meeting was further apprised that the Deputy Registrars are in constant touch with different stakeholders including the health institutions, Pharmacy Council and Controller Drugs office for enhancing the pace of establishment of such medicine stores for the benefit of public at large.
