India's first gene therapy trial in Haemophilia conducted at CMC Vellore: Dr Jitendra

NEW DELHI: India has conducted the first human clinical trial of gene therapy in Haemophilia A (FVIII deficiency) at Christian Medical College (CMC)

This was disclosed here on Wednesday by Union Science & Technology Minister, Dr. Jitendra Singh while addressing the "National Science Day 2024" programme in Vigyan Bhavan.

Dr Jitendra further informed that the programme is supported by the Department of Biotechnology, the Centre for Stem Cell Research - a unit of InStem Bengaluru, in collaboration with Emory University, USA at Christian Medical College, Vellore.

The trials involved deploying a novel technology of using a lentiviral vector to express a FVIII transgene in the patient's own haematopoietic stem cell which will then express FVIII from specific differentiated blood cells.

The Minister expressed the hope that manufacturing of this vector will commence soon in India and proceed with further clinical trials. Stating that the

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Justice Tashi Rabstan and Justice Puneet Gupta dismissed the appeal filed by Irfan Shafi Mir OGW of HM and uphold the order of Trial Court.

DB after hearing Adv IH Bhat for the appellant whereas DSGI Vishal Sharma for the NIA and Sr. AAG Monika Kohli for the UT, observed that As of now, in our opinion, learned counsel for the appellant-accused has failed to convince this Court that there is any change in circumstances regarding medical conditions of the appellant-accused especially after the passing of the order dated December 6, 2022 by the trial Court, for exercising discretion for grant of short term bail/parole in favour of the appellant-accused. Therefore, this Court is not inclined to allow this appeal. The net result is that the Appeal fails so the same is dismissed along with application(s) being bereft of merit.

DB before parting, this Court deems it appropriate to give liberty to the appellant-accused to approach the trial Court in case of any change in circumstances of the treatment being provided to him at Agra and in that case trial Court shall pass appropriate orders for providing medical facilities to the accused as and when needed in a hospital of repute.
