Com SMC reviews snow clearance, dewatering operations

SRINAGAR: Commissioner SMC, Dr.Owais Ahmed on Sunday conducted a whirlwind tour of Srinagar City to personally assess the ongoing snow clearance and dewatering operations in the wake of recent snowfall and precipitation.

The Commissioner's proactive initiative aimed to gauge the efficiency of the operations and ensure that the city's essential services continue to function optimally despite the challenging weather conditions.

During the tour, Dr.Owais visited key locations SMHS Hospital, CBD Lal Chowk,

engaged with on-site Officers and supervisory staff to gain firsthand insights into the progress of snow clearance and dewatering efforts.

Additionally, Commissioner, SMC interacted with residents and community representatives to gather feedback on the impact of the operations and to address any immediate concerns.

The tour underscored the SMC's unwavering commitment to maintaining the functionality and accessibility of Srinagar City, particularly during adverse weather events. The Commissioner emphasized the importance

of swift and effective snow clearance and dewatering measures in safeguarding public safety, facilitating transportation, and mitigating potential disruptions to essential services.

Furthermore, Commissioner expressed appreciation for the dedicated efforts of SMC frontline Warriors, local authorities, and emergency response teams who have been diligently working to ensure the timely clearance of snow and the efficient dewatering of waterlogged areas. At Lal Ded Hospital, the Deputy Commissioner took a round of various units of the Hospital and inspected the Emergency unit, ICU, OPD, IPD and enquired about the patient care facilities available at the hospital.

The DC also inspected the drug store of the hospital and enquired about the medicine

Later, the DC also visited JVC, SKIMS Bemina to take stock of the patient care facilities available post overnight snowfall.

On the occasion, the DC inspected various wards, orthopaedic units, labs etc

and took on spot assessment of the facilities being provided to the patients.

The DC also interacted with the patients and their attendants and enquired about the facilities available at the hospital.

On the occasion, the DC stressed on the Hospital Medical Superintendent Dr Shifa to ensure better healthcare facilities to the patients and also asked them to ensure proper heating and cleanliness in the hospital.

Fresh Snowfall: DC Bandipora tours villages, listens to public concerns Also monitors essential services

BANDIPORA: Amid fresh snowfall, Deputy Commissioner (DC) Bandipora, Shakeel Ur Rehman Sunday toured several villages across the district including Lankreshipora, Kulhama, Nadihal, Gurura, Chittiybanday and other areas of TOWN Bandipora to take stock of the post-snowfall situation and overall well-being of the residents during this challenging weather.

The DC interacted with the public, assessed the ground situation and snow clearance operations, and took stock of the availability of essential services like power, drinking water, ration and healthcare services, etc.

During his interactions with the villagers, the DC patiently listened to their concerns regarding the impact of the snowfall. He assured them of prompt action and directed the concerned departments to address their grievances on priority.

Furthermore, the DC inspected the availability of essential services like electricity, water supply, healthcare, and transportation in the affected areas.

He instructed the officials to ensure uninterrupted services and immediate restoration wherever disruptions were identified.

SHOPIAN: The drives aimed at the rescue and rehabilitation of street children were conducted at hotspot areas of the district Shopian, in compliance to the directions of Hon'ble Supreme Court and National Commission for Protection of Child Rights (NCPCR) and on the directions of District Magistrate Shopian, Faz Lul Haseeb.

The drives were conducted in district Shopian for Rescue and Rehabilitation of children in street situation (CISS) which started from 12 January and culminated on 31 January, 2024.

The Child Welfare Committee Shopian, all officials of District Child Protection Unit Shopian, Officials of Labour department, Station House Officer Shopian, Special Juvenile Police Officer, NGO, Human Welfare Voluntary Organisation and representatives from Special cell for women took part in the campaign.

During the campaign, two children were found below the age of 18 who were rescued and after proper counselling were handed over to their parents against a proper undertaking.

During the rescue campaign, people were made aware about various policies of the government for the well-being of children and were urged to inform the Child Welfare Committee, Shopian, DCPO, Shopian or Labour Department in case they found any child of this category.

As per the guidelines, the District Child Protection Unit (DCPU) and the Child Welfare Committee (CWC) are required to identify and provide counselling to the children and their families living on the streets and rehabilitate them.

DC Shopian visits several areas, takes stock of restoration of essential services

Visits SDH Keller & DTs Workshop; emphasises on expeditious snow clearance, power restoration

SHOPIAN: The Deputy Commissioner (DC) Shopian, Faz Lul Haseeb visited various areas of the district including Gagran, Shirmal, Keller to take stock of snow clearance, availability and restoration of essential services.

On the occasion, DC was apprised that all the men and machinery have been mobilized early morning to clear all major and link roads of snow and restore power.

The DC took stock of snow clearance being undertaken by MED, PMGSY, R&B and MC, and instructed for making road accessible for traffic.

While visiting DTs Workshop at Gagren, he also directed KPDCL to ensure lifting of damaged DTs and ensure repairs as per timelines and keep buffer stock available for use. He also instructed to restore feeders facing fault immediately for providing

uninterrupted power supply to the people as per schedule.

He visited the Shirmal area and took stock of services and snow clearance and interacted with MED staff and asked for immediate snow clearance of all roads. He called upon putting all efforts to ensure speedy snow clearance and prompt response to the public grievances.

The DC was informed by concerned that KPDCL,

MED and other departments are working in mission mode for restoration of power supply and roads.

The DC said that various essential commodities including ration, LPG etc were stocked well in advance in far flung and remote areas so that people living in such areas may not face any inconveniences.

At Keller, the DC made inspection of Sub-District Hospital Keller, where he

interacted with the patients and attendants, enquired about the treatment being provided to them.

Emphasizing better healthcare facilities are provided to the general public at Sub-District Hospital Keller, the DC directed concerned to ensure all doctors and paramedical staff follow duty roster and better patient care is guaranteed in the Sub-District hospital. He inspected the Wards, including, OPD, Emergency Wards, X-Ray Units and other sections of the hospital and reviewed their functioning.

Enroute, the DC met people of different villages who put forth their genuine issues. He heard them patiently and assured for quick redressal of the demands.

The DC was accompanied by various officers of MC, R&B, KPDCL, MED and others.

Distt Admin B'la leads swift essential services restoration efforts post snowfall

BARAMULLA: Under the supervision of District Development Commissioner (DDC) Baramulla, Minga Sherpa, the District Administration Baramulla is fully mobilized, with all departments collaborating closely to swiftly restore essential services across every part of the district following the fresh snowfall.

Control rooms have been established at both district and sub-division levels to enhance coordination and execution of



measures aimed at restoring essential services during these challenging weather conditions. Snow clearance operations are in full throttle in the dis-

trict with Roads and Buildings (R&B), Mechanical & Engineering Department (MED) and Municipal Councils/ Committees (MCs), working in tandem to clear roads for smooth passage of traffic. The dedicated teams and machinery remain on the ground, tirelessly working to restore road connectivity to any left out village and town area.

Similarly, the Power Development Department (PDD) has men on the ground restoring electricity in most of the district with front-line officials working on a war footing

to provide uninterrupted power supply to unconnected areas.

Healthcare services continued to operate smoothly in the District Hospital, SDHs, CHCs and PHCs of the district as essential medical supplies were preemptively stocked to address adverse weather conditions. Further, tap water supply has been reinstated in the majority of areas in the district and for areas where the supply remained interrupted, the Public Health Engineering (PHE) department is delivering water tanks to meet the demand.
