

JAMMU: In a joint statement, the KDP Wing of the Democratic Progressive Azad Party (DPAP) has strongly urged the Relief & Rehabilitation Commissioner (Migrants) to expedite the implementation of Circular No. 03 RRCM of 2023, issued on November 4, 2023. The statement, signed by President Saniav Dhar, Chairman Piaray Lal Pandita, General Secretary Raj Kumar Ticku, and other leaders, emphasized that the circular was issued following the directives of the Administrative Department of DMRRR (No. DMRRR-Plan/23/22, dated July 24, 2023). It called for the formation of Residential Welfare Associations in Migrant Camps and Transit Camps through an electoral process to facilitate coordination between camp residents and the administration, ensuring efficient execution of

The leaders lamented that despite the circular fulfilling the long-pending demands of migrants since 2015, its execution remains stalled. They accused the concerned government agencies and the Relief Organization of deliberately delaying the process, thereby depriving displaced migrants of a structured representative body. The circular had outlined the composition of elected representatives for various camps Jagti -

16 members, Nagrota - 08 members, Muthi - 06 members, Butanagar - 06 members, and Purkhoo - 08 members.

There has been just rationalization of reservation by shifting population to ST 2category and reducing Backward Area quota from 20 percent to 10 percent in view of this shift, Raina explained. Similarly, the OBC popula-

tion that gets reservation automatically gets reduced from the total population competing for open merit category. If there is anything unjustified in reservation policy of Jammu Kashmir it is continued backwardness of certain areas because of the misrule of these parties for around seven decades. How do you justify backwardness of areas in the same breath in which you claim Jammu Kashmir was better off prior to the 2019 historic decision, he asked?

GL Raina assured these disadvantaged sections of population about BJP's principled stand on reservations. No one will be allowed to tamper with the constitutional right of SCs and STs or Disabled sections of population.
