## AIIMS Jammu initiates laparoscopic surgeries, performs first Laparoscopic Cholecystectomy

JAMMU: The All-India In stituteMedical Sciences (AIIMS) Jammu has taken a significant step towards advancing medical care by initiating laparoscopic surgeries at its stateof-the-art surgical facility.

In yet another major milestone for the institution, the Department of Surgical Gastroenterology successfully performed its first laparoscopic cholecystectomy, a minimally invasive procedure for gallbladder removal.

The laparoscopic cholecystectomy, which involves small incisions and the use of a camera and specialized instruments, is a highly preferred method for gallbladder surgery due to its reduced recovery time, minimal scarring, and quicker return to daily activities compared to traditional open surgery.

The procedure was carried out by a team of surgeons which included Dr. Vijay Kundal, Dr. Abhinay Mani, Dr. Sahil Sandal, and Dr.
