The report, presented in presence of Secretary RDD&PR, Mohammad Aijaz Asad,

is expected to highlight the objectives laid down at the time of its constitution. Director Panchayati Raj, J&K, Sham Lal; Secretary in OBC Commission, Reyaz Ahmad Shah; Deputy Secretary in OBC Commission, Mohinder Sharma and others were also present on the occasion.

The Commission, headed by Justice (Retired) Janak Raj Kotwal, a former Judge of Jammu and Kashmir High Court, with former IAS Officer, RK Bhagat and former Dean of SKUAST Jammu, Dr. Mohinder Singh Badwal as members, was constituted with determining OBC reservation quotas. The Commission's term officially ended on December 31, 2024, however, its tenure was extended till February 28, 2025 for accomplishment of the complete work.

Pertinent to mention that the Commission was constituted for the purpose of conducting empirical studies on OBC representation, engaging with stakeholders and recommending proportional reservations in urban and rural local bodies. Accordingly, during its tenure, the Commission analyzed records, surveys and census data to determine the OBC population share and their representation in the

The panel sought data inputs from the government departments, institutions and experts; held consultations with researchers and conducted field visits across J&K to ensure a comprehensive assessment before submitting its report to the govern

The J&K Local Bodies Dedicated Backward Classes Commission was established on June 11, 2023, in compliance with Supreme Court Ruling in the K Krishnamurthy Vs Union of India (2010) and Vikas Krishna Rao Gawli v Maharashtra (2021) case.

Currently, Municipal Bodies, Panchayats and Block Development Councils in J&K are without elected representatives for a period of more than a year. The term of Municipalities ended in October-November 2023, while Panchayats and Block Development Councils completed their five year term on January 9, 2024.

In the recent electoral history of J&K, the three phases of panchayat elections including the Halqa Panchayat Elections (November 2018), Block Development Council Elections (October 2019) and District Development Council Elections (November-December 2020) were successfully conducted leading to significant devolution of Power in terms of Funds, Functions and Functionaries strengthening the grassroots democracy.

Firing on Army vehicle, anti-terrorist operation continues in Rajouri

JAMMU: Security forces on Thursday extended the cordon and search operation to new areas near the Line of Control (LoC) in the Sunderbani sector of Rajouri district to flush out terrorsts who opened fire on an Army vehicle the previous day, officials said.

A fresh operation was also launched in Dayalachak near the International Border in the Hiranagar sector of Kathua district after security forces intercepted a suspicious frequency vireless set, the officials said.

An Army vehicle came under fire from suspected terrorists hiding in a forest area near Phal rillage in the Sunderbani sector on Wednesday, prompting a massive search operation by the The search operation continues in Phal and was extended to new areas this morning to flush

out the hiding terrorists, the officials said, adding there was no contact with the terrorists so far. They said the security forces are using latest technology, drones and sniffer dogs to hunt down the terrorists in the dense forests. In a post on X on Thursday, the Army's Jammu-based White Knight Corps said, "Terrorists

opened fire at an Indian Army convoy in Sunderbani, Akhnoor, yesterday (Wednesday). The

firing was ineffective and our own troops responded swiftly. "Some social media handles are falsely claiming casualties to own troops. This is false and deliberate disinformation. J&K Police nabs terrorist in covert Delhi operation STATE TIMES NEWS

SRINAGAR: The Jammu and Kashmir Police's counter intelligence wing on Thursday arrest ed a suspected terrorist, allegedly involved in terror funding, during a covert operation in Delhi. The Counter Intelligence Kashmir (CIK), in a covert operation, arrested a terrorist from Delhi who was involved in terror funding and had links with terrorists of proscribed terror organisation(s) across the Line of Control (LoC), an official said.

The case is connected to providing logistics support to terrorists of proscribed terror organisation(s) active in Jammu and Kashmir by a variety of means, including providing or passing on funds for conducting terror activities, he added.

"This money was being routed through various means from across the LoC, then pushed into India through their couriers, which included arrested accused Parvez Ahmad Khan alias PK alias Sheikh Tajamul Islam alias Khalid, a resident of Bemina, Srinagar," the official said. Khan was arrested in Delhi by a CIK investigating team in collaboration with the Delhi

Police. The operation was planned at the CIK headquarters a few days ago and the accused put under surveillance, the official said. Khan had been evading arrest and planned to abscond from Delhi, he added.

"The arrest was made in compliance with a warrant of arrest issued by a competent court in Srinagar.

The arrested terrorist will be produced before a competent court in Srinagar after his transit from Delhi to Srinagar for which transit remand has been obtained from a Delhi court," the official said. Further arrests are expected in the case, he added.
