J&K gets Rs. 844 Crore Railway Boost in Union Budget 2025-26 Govt committed to enhance railway infra, connectivity in J&K: Vaishnaw

JAMMU: Union Minister for Railways, Information and Broadcasting, and Electronics & Information Technology, Vaishnaw on Monday said that a budget allocation of Rs. 844 crore has been earmarked for Jammu & Kashmir, underscoring the government's commitment to further enhancing railway infrastructure and connectivity in the region.

Addressing the media of J&K via a Video Press Conference from Rail Bhawan New Delhi, the Minister provided an update on the UT specific provisions in the Union Budget 2025

related to railway infrastructure and development projects.

Providing an update on key railway infrastructure and development projects in Jammu & Kashmir, he announced that all necessary testing processes much-awaited Katra-Srinagar railway line have been completed and commercial operations will com-

mence soon. He further highlighted the ongoing redevelopment of Jammu Railway Station, stating that once completed, direct railway connectivity Jammubetween and Srinagar will be operational.

The minister emphasized significant progress made in railway electrification, noting that since 2014, a total of 344 km of railway tracks have been electrified, making Jammu & Kashmir 100% electrified.

Addressing a query regarding the need for passengers to change trains at Jammu Railway Station for onward travel to Srinagar, Vaishnaw explained that this requirement arises due to the varying terrain and climatic

Ex-serviceman martyred; wife, niece injured in terrorist attack

LG Sinha, CM Omar strongly condemn attack

KULGAM: In the first noncombatant killing of the year, terrorists shot dead an exserviceman and injured his wife and 13-year-old niece in an attack in South Kashmir's Kulgam district on Monday, officials said here.

Details so far indicate that two terrorists armed with pistols arrived at the residence of Manzoor Ahmad Wagay in Beehi Bagh, approximately 10 kilometers from the district headquarters, and opened fire on his family members, which included his wife and niece.

According to initial statements recorded by police and army officials, Wagay, a former member of the



Territorial Army, sustained additional bullet wounds while attempting to protect his niece.

The terrorists, believed to be from banned Lashkar-e-Taiba, fired upon Wagay as he returned home, and all three victims were rushed to a nearby hospital, where

Wagay succumbed injuries.

Police have taken cognizance of the incident and initiated an investigation into the attack.

The officials said that Monday's attack could possibly be an act of revenge for gunning down the top cadres of the Hizbul Mujahideen in December last year.



has maintained that there is a significant decline in terrorist incidents, infiltration and recruitment of youth in terrorist organisations. The security forces last week launched a massive operation in Jammu and Kashmir mostly in the higher reaches and forest areas along the Line of Control, to locate and eliminate the terrorists who carried out multiple attacks in different districts last year.

Areas such as Reasi, Doda, Kishtwar, Kathua, Jammu and Rajouri have seen increased terror activity in the last couple of years.

JAMMU: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Monday underscored the need for the INDIA alliance to have a structured discussion on its future strategy, cautioning that internal rifts could harm its larger goal.

Abdullah parried a direct reply to a question about the prospects of the AAP winning the Delhi Assembly elections and said that party may make a clean sweep like they did in the past.

When asked if the contest between the alliance partners in Delhi would weaken the opposition bloc, Abdullah reiterated the importance of "I have said this before, and

I will say it again-someday, the INDIA alliance will have to sit down and discuss our strategy moving forward. If we fall apart like this, it won't be good for the country," Abdullah told reporters on the sidelines of a function

Responding to questions about the electoral outcome in Delhi, Abdullah remarked. "Let there be voting first and results out. Then we will analyze. You have started asking questions about who will benefit from it. Who knows, like in the past, the AAP may
