In Khimber, DG reviewed the construction of an open playfield, which includes leveling, fencing, and a gate. The project, with an estimated cost of Rs. 168.48 lakh, has already incurred Rs. 128.35 lakh as of March 2024. For the current fiscal year, Rs. 16.00 lakh out of the approved Rs. 20.00 lakh under the Capex Budget 2024-25 has been released.
