

MLA Mohan Lal inaugurates Jio Pota Ghat revamp; major push to develop Akhnoor as tourism hub

AKHNOOR: In a significant step towards promoting heritage and religious tourism in the Akhnoor town MLA Akhnoor Mohan Lal Bhagat on Sunday kick-started the beautification, renovation and redevelopment work of Jio Pota Ghat. The project forms part of a broader plan to develop the Chenab riverfront as a tourist destination, expected to boost local trade and strengthen the regional economy.

The ghat had suffered damage during recent floods, and its restoration has been taken up on priority. The inaugural ceremony was attended by XEN PWD Sanjeev Sharma, Executive Officer Municipal Committee Akhnoor Mohd Yaqoob, AEE Sunil Baogia, Banwari Lal Sharma and other officials.

Later, a public gathering was held at the old Sub-District Hospital building in Akhnoor Bazaar, where locals expressed gratitude to the MLA for taking a firm

stand to restart the long-closed building. It was announced that six departments - ENT, Eye, Dental, Physiotherapy, Family Welfare and Immunization - will soon function from the premises, providing much-needed relief to the public.

During the meeting, residents and market representatives highlighted several civic issues, including the need for multi-storey parking, installation of streetlights at dark spots, CCTV cameras, and repair of lanes and drains in the town.

Speaking on the occasion, MLA Mohan Lal Bhagat said the revamp of Jio Pota Ghat was an urgent necessity after flood damage and emphasized that Akhnoor possesses immense potential

in religious and heritage tourism. He stated that during his tenure, he is committed to establishing Akhnoor's identity as a prominent tourism destination in Jammu & Kashmir.

The MLA further informed that the tender for the incomplete Maharaja Gulab Singh Library at Nirdosh Chowk has been floated, and students will soon get a Government library in town. He assured installation of adequate streetlights in dark areas and CCTV cameras for public safety.

Bhagat announced that repair of lanes and drains worth ₹60 lakh will begin shortly, while ₹50 lakh more will be spent on town beautification. He also disclosed that the revamping of ghats and walkways from Baba Sunder Singh Gurudwara to Hari Mandir Ghat, estimated at ₹1.34 crore, will start within days. Multi-storey parking, he said, remains part of his long-term development plan, along with an overall facelift of the town and bazaars.

SAMBHA: On the occasion of Purnima (full moon), Sahib Bandgi's Sadguru Shri Madhu Paramhans Ji Maharaj, while giving spiritual discourse to devotees present at the Satsang in Ranjadi, Jammu, said that at one time I counted that 724 spiritual leaders used to appear on devotional channels. I thought I would see what message these spiritual leaders are giving currently. At that time, the market for gurus was booming. Then a time came when devotional channels flopped. Some individuals did such things that later the news channels reported on them. This caused the market for gurus to decline.



Today, when you tell someone to go to a guru, they refer to those incidents, saying, "Look at what so-and-so did."

Then I observed and found that no one was talking about the fundamental truth. Sage Vashishtha gave Lord Rama the teachings about the soul. He said that the attainment of the self-element is possible only by conquering the mind. This is the main point. No one is talking about this. Otherwise, there is no other means. Vashishtha is talking about the mind. He is giving teachings to Lord Rama. If you look at the essence of Yoga Vashishtha, you will find Sahib (the Supreme Being). Now, how to control the mind? Sahib mainly spoke on 5 things. First, he spoke about that Supreme Being. He spoke about Sahib, the Lord of the immortal realm. He said that the Vedas and scriptures do not

know that realm. He called it Begampur. There is a train named Begampur, after Sahib, which runs from Kashi. Then he spoke about the mind. He spoke about Maya (illusion). He spoke a lot about the Name. That Name is completely different from the names known in the world. Only that Name can take the soul to the immortal realm. Others cannot. That Name cannot be spoken or written. It is a living Name. It is only with the saints who have reached the immortal realm. Only a rare few know it. Dharnadas Ji told Sahib that he was also chanting the Name. Sahib said, "No Dharnadas, the Name I am talking about is secret. The world does not know it." It cannot be attained without a perfect Guru. Vashishtha Ji is saying that the mind must be controlled. But this man cannot control his

mind even with Herculean efforts. This mind will only be controlled by the power of the secret name.

So, not a single saint out of 724 spoke about the mind. The mind is like a banyan tree. The entire world is made of the mind. The mind is vast. It has made even great sages dance to its tune. But when the true name comes, the mind bows down.

The Master is saying that not one, but millions of names are being chanted by people in the world. But liberation will not be attained through those names. That name is the one that the Satguru, after going to the immortal realm and merging with the Supreme Being, brings back and implants within the disciple; that is the secret essence of the name. Without that name, no living being can cross the ocean of the world.
