KPS expresses concern over reported threats to displaced community

JAMMU: The Kashmiri Pandit Sabha (KPS), in a meeting chaired by its President K. K. Khosa, voiced concern over recent reports of threats allegedly directed at members of the displaced community, particularly PM Package employees serving in the Valley. Posters reportedly circulated in the name of the Muslim Janbaaz Force in parts of South Kashmir have caused unease, reviving painful memories associated with the events of 1989-90. The Sabha observed that the Kashmiri Pandit community continues to bear the legacy of displacement and loss following the tragic exodus of the early 1990s. In such a sensitive context, even isolated incidents of intimidation tend to create anxiety among minorities and must be addressed with seriousness and empathy. Ensuring a secure and reassuring environment, it stated, is vital for sustaining confidence and fostering reconciliation.

While expressing faith in the administration under Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, the Sabha urged authorities to take all necessary steps to prevent the spread of fear and maintain security among vulnerable sections. It emphasized that swift verification of such reports and transparent communication would help reassure the community. The Sabha also underscored the important role of the Government of India under Prime Minister Narendra Modi and central agencies at this critical juncture. Appealing to the elected leadership, including the Jammu & Kashmir National Conference government, the Sabha called for empathy and statesmanship.

Transporter Association meets BJP leadership over ATS privatization, RTO fitness issues

JAMMU: A deputation led by S. Gurdeep Singh, President of the All J&K Transport Companies Representatives Association, along with members of his team, called on BJP J&K General Secretary Baldev Singh Billawaria and BJP Minority Morcha State President Ranjodh Singh Nalwa to apprise them of the pressing issues being faced by the transport fraternity in Jammu & Kashmir.



During the meeting, Gurdeep Singh highlighted serious concerns regarding the privatization of the ATS (Automatic Testing Centre) system for vehicle fitness certification. He stated that the move has resulted in an arbitrary and frequent increase in testing fees, placing an additional financial burden on transporters. He further alleged that the present mechanism has led to harassment and procedural complications, giving rise to corruption and undue delays in obtaining fitness clearances. Raising another key issue, Gurdeep Singh demanded that the RTO fitness certification facility be made operational in Jammu district at par with other districts of Jammu & Kashmir. He asserted that the absence of such a facility in Jammu is causing inconvenience to transporters and creating a sense of discrimination within the sector.

Responding to the concerns, Baldev Singh Billawaria assured the deputation that the BJP stands firmly with the transport community. He stated that the issues raised are genuine and will be taken up with the concerned authorities at the appropriate level to ensure a fair, transparent, and transporter-friendly system. Ranjodh Singh Nalwa also expressed solidarity with the transporters and said that their grievances deserve immediate attention. He emphasized that no section of society should face discrimination or administrative harassment.
