Ahead of Shah's visit, 3 JeM terrorists killed in Kishtwar, Udhampur

JAMMU: Three Pakistani terrorists affiliated with the Jaish-e-Mohammad (JeM) were killed in two separate encounters in Kishtwar and Udhampur districts, marking a major success for security forces who had been hunting them for the past three weeks, officials said.

While one terrorist was killed in a gunfight in the snow-bound Chatroo belt of Kishtwar on Wednesday evening, two others -- both self-styled JeM commanders -- were neutralised this morning after they were trapped inside a natural cave in Udhampur district, the officials said. The success of security forces came ahead of Union Home Minister Amit Shah's three-day visit to the Union Territory beginning Thursday.

SRINAGAR: Security forces on Wednesday carried out a surprise cordon and search operation in the Ab Guzar area of Srinagar in Jammu and Kashmir, officials said.

The operation comes just three days ahead of the scheduled visit of Union Home Minister Amit Shah to the valley. Security forces sealed all entry and exit points leading to the Abi Guzar locality, which houses several residential and commercial establishments, including shops, the officials said. CM's jibe at BJP over its 2019 claims on ending terrorism

JAMMU: Encounters are taking place even in 2026, Jammu and Kashmir Chief Minister Omar Abdullah said on Wednesday in a veiled jibe at the BJP over its claim that terrorism would end following the abrogation of Article 370 that happened in 2019.

"It just keeps going on. They (terrorists) were killed, fine, but where did they come from? How did they reach Udhampur? Since when were they there? And how long will this continue?

"We were told that after 2019, this cycle would end. But now, even in 2026, it has started

BJP MLAs stage dharna outside LA alleging bias proceedings in allotting time

JAMMU: BJP legislators on Wednesday staged a dharna outside the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly after staging a walkout from the House, alleging that Speaker Abdul Rahim Rather was "muzzling the voice of the opposition" and showing bias while allotting speaking time to members of the ruling party.

All BJP members walked out of the Assembly after protesting inside the House over the issue. The legislators, led by Leader of Opposition Sunil Sharma, later sat on a dharna outside the Assembly complex and raised slogans against the Speaker and the government.


"We are sitting on a dharna after protesting against the biased manner in which the Speaker is granting time to
