### No spring to jump, no habit of interrupting: Omar's candid quip lightens LA

JAMMU: Amid a charged atmosphere and frequent cross-talk in the Jammu and Kashmir Legislative Assembly, Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Tuesday struck a lighter note with a self-deprecating remark that briefly eased tempers and drew smiles across party lines.

Responding to repeated interjections during the proceedings, the Chief Minister told the House that he prefers restraint over theatrics, quipping that he neither interrupts others nor has the "spring" to jump into debates the way some legislators do. "There is no toka-toki from my side. I don't jump. I don't have a spring like others," the Chief Minister said, prompting laughter and

### Admissions must be on merit, not communal lines: CM on SMVDIME, NLU

JAMMU: Chief Minister Omar Abdullah on Tuesday made a strong pitch for merit-based admissions in professional institutions and cautioned against attempts to link education with religious or communal considerations.

Intervening during the proceedings of the Legislative Assembly, the Chief Minister said there was no rationale in questioning or seeking the closure of the Shri Mata Vaishno Devi Institute of Medical Excellence (SMVDIME) on religious grounds, adding that professional education must remain inclusive and guided solely by merit.

"Medical colleges are not meant to be run on religious lines. If minority status was the concern, then SMVDU should have been declared a minority institution at the very beginning," he said. The Chief Minister underlined that admissions to medical colleges are governed strictly

## Amit Shah arrives in Jammu on 2-day visit

JAMMU: Union Home Minister Amit Shah reached here on Thursday night on a two-day visit to Jammu and Kashmir to review security situation and inaugurate various developmental works in the region, officials said.

Lt Governor Manoj Sinha received the Home Minister on his arrival at the Jammu airport.

"Welcomed Union Home and Cooperation Minister Shri Amit Shah on his arrival at Jammu Airport today," the LG said in a post on X. The officials said Shah will undertake a visit

to border outposts along the International Border in Kathua district, where he will also virtually inaugurate and lay foundation of six welfare schemes for border guards on Friday.

Shah will chair a security review meeting at Lok Bhawan in Jammu on his return from the border and will later distribute compassionate appointments among the families of terror victims, the officials said. On Saturday, the home minister will preside over a meeting on development of Jammu and Kashmir at Lok Bhawan, Jammu before returning to Delhi, they added.
