General Secretary Apni Party and President, Durganag Trust, Vijay Bakaya and other Trustees expressed grief over tragic death of Krishna Dhaba owner's son. In their condolence message, Trustees of Durganag Trust expressed shock at tragic death of Akash Mehra, who had received bullet injuries in an attack by terrorists eleven days back and succumbed to injuries. The Trustees also expressed solidarity with Ramesh Kumar Mehra, tenant of Durganag Trust in his

hour of grief and prayed for peace to departed soul.

Ajay Kumar Sadhotra, former Minister and senior leader Jammu & Kashmir National Conference, in a press statement issued here, expressed grief over the killing of Aakash Mehra. Condemning dastardly attack by terrorists, Sadhotra expressed solidarity with bereaved family in this time of utmost grief.

The NC leader said that such radical killings are very sad and unfortunate. He emphasised upon the need of taking all effective measures to check such killings as peace is imperative for speedy development of J&K.

Sadhotra also prayed for eternal peace to the departed soul and courage and patience to the bereaved family to bear such an irreparable loss. He demanded that perpetrators should be brought to book so that such incidents may not occur again.

A number of activists of **Dogra Front and Shiv Sena (DFSS)** led by its President Ashok Gupta paid tributes to Akash Mehra by lighting candles. Speaking on the occasion, Gupta said that after a brave fight, Akash lost battle to recover from injuries suffered in attack. May his soul rests in peace and family gets strength at this difficult time, he added. "Such a targeted attack is proof that even today there is an attempt to drive away the minorities in Valley.

Though our security forces are working hard, but anti-national elements are trying to revive terrorism back. The elements inimical to peace have always spilled blood of innocents. This vicious cycle of death has haunted and stigmatised our society for long now and must be ended," he asserted. Others present on the occasion included Sukhdev Singh, Kewal, Vijay, Surinder, Raj Kumar, Subhash, Ajay and Narendra.
