

5 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which teams from Police Posts Bathindi, Chhatha and Belicharama acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 5 different vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles included a tractor-trolley (JK02BG4586) seized by Bathindi police; a tractor along with trolley bearing Chassis No WQTC24705016091 seized by Chhatha police; a JCB bearing Chassis No PUNJD14AJM307554, a tipper bearing registration No JK02AW6779 and a dumper bearing registration No JK02BD3457 seized by Belicharama police.

The recoveries were made by Incharges Police Post Bathindi PSI Mohd Younis Khanday, Chhatha SI Ranjit Singh and Belicharama PSI Jeevan Kumar in their respective jurisdictions. DMO Jammu was also intimated about the same.

4 women among 5 missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday traced five missing persons including 4 women and reunited them with their families.

As per details, four different missing reports were lodged at different police stations of Jammu including missing report of a girl at Police Post Talab Tillo, two missing reports of two girls at Police Post Pounchhal and a missing report of an old woman at Police Post Rehari, by their legal heirs stating that they went missing from their respective houses. In this regard, missing reports were registered at respective Police Posts. After this, special teams of concerned Police Posts, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages, traced out all missing women.

The dedicated police teams were led by Incharges Police Post Talab Tillo PSI Rakesh Kumar, Pounchhal-PSI Nitish Khajuria and Rehari-SI Ahmed Din, who successfully traced out the missing women in their respective jurisdictions and handed-over them to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities. Samba Police also reunited a mentally-retarded person hailing from Durrigella, Kangra (HP) with his family at Border Police Post Kamore under jurisdiction of Police Station Ramgarh. A party of Border Police Post Kamore while performing patrolling duty in its jurisdictional area, noticed a person in pathetic condition roaming in border area, after which the party brought him to Post. On questioning about his identity, the person hardly divulge his identity as Rakesh Kumar, son of Shakti Chand, resident of Durrigella, Tehsil

Shahpur, District Kangra (HP). Immediately Incharge BPP Kamore developed liaison with concerned Police Station, verified his character & antecedence and contacted his family members. After sustained efforts, the missing person was handed over to his relatives at BPP Kamore after completing all legal formalities.

Absconder evading arrest for 29 years arrested

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday nabbed an absconder who was evading arrest for last 29 years. As per details, an information was received at Police Post Digiana through reliable sources regarding presence of an absconder namely Sanjay Sharma alias Cheeku, son of Sham Sunder Sharma, resident of Digiana, Jammu who was evading arrest since September 25, 1993 i.e., 29 years in FIR No 227/1991 under sections 341/323 of RPC at Police Station Gandhi Nagar. On this, a team of Police Post Digiana under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Inspn Pankaj Sharma assisted by Incharge Police Post Digiana SI Tarsem Raj arrested the absconder. Further investigation is going on to ascertain various activities, in which absconder remained involved into during these years.

Narco-smuggler nabbed with heroin

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday nabbed a narco-smuggler and recovered 5 gm heroin from his possession.

As per details, a team from Police Station Gharota constituted under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial and led by SHO Gharota Inspector Khyatiman Khajuria while on patrolling duty near Thathi Petrol pump area rounded up a suspect. On search, 5 gm heroin was recovered from accused, identified as Vishal Sharma, son of Som Nath, resident of Jandial Thathi, Tehsil Bhawal, District Jammu. He was arrested and FIR No. 22/2022 under section 8/21/22 NDPS Act was registered against him in Police Station Gharota. The overall arrest and recoveries were made under supervision of SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

Drug peddler nabbed with 1.9 Kg Ganja

Blue-eyed teacher suspended for tempering Govt order

JAMMU: Nullifying all claims of administration regarding maintaining transparency and accountability in the system, in a bizarre incident, a teacher, who is a relative of Deputy Secretary Education and was deputed to work in the personal section of officer, was allegedly found involved in tempering an official order. Although, acting swiftly the department has put the erring teacher under suspension and relieved him from the personal section with directions to report to his original place of posting i.e., GBMS, Samote, Surankote, Poonch, but this incident has raised a question on tall claims of the Government.

The teacher was immediately put under suspension vide order no 86-JK(Edu) of 2022, dated February 28, 2022 issued by Under Secretary to Government-Mayank Sharma, directing him to join his original place of posting i.e., GBMS, Samote, Surankote, Poonch. Moreover, Additional Secretary to Government, School Education Department, Naseer Ahmad Wani has been appointed as an inquiry officer to conduct an inquiry into the matter and directed to furnish report to Administrative Secretary.

A senior official of Education Department, on condition of anonymity, revealed that a huge nexus is presently going on in the department, as the blue-eyed officials and teachers, who have been deployed in the Administrative depart-

ment finalizes transfer orders. "Tehseen Ahmad is not a single case, as there are many others who openly violate the rules, including Deputy Secretary to Govt, Mukhtar Ahmad, who used to take Tehseen along wherever he gets posted," said official. He further made a sensational revelation that one Principal, Fayyaz Ahmad Fayyaz is the mastermind behind the nexus, who is attached with School Education Department and posted at Civil Secretariat from last 12 years. One can easily gauge the level of his approach in power corridors that despite several advisories issued by the Government from time to time to discourage culture of attachment, the officer is posted at Civil Secretariat from last 12 years, he added. With such major irregularities going under the very nose of administration, what one can expect from field offices especially those located in far-flung areas. A serious introspection is required by the concerned authorities in such matters, if they are really serious for making J&K corruption-free.

HC sets-aside imprisonment in rape case

SRINAGAR: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Srinagar Bench set-aside imprisonment for 10 years in a rape case with the observations that trial court, while passing impugned judgment, has not appreciated evidence on record in its proper perspective which led it to perverse conclusions. The impugned judgment passed by the trial court is, therefore, not sustainable in law. The appeal is, accordingly, allowed and the impugned judgment of conviction and order of sentence are set aside. This significant judgment has been passed in an appeal filed by one Shabir Ahmed Malik challenging judgment dated August 31, 2021 passed by Additional Sessions Judge Fast Track Court, Kulgam, whereby he has been convicted for offences under Section 366 and 376 of RPC, sentencing him to undergo ten years rigorous imprisonment and a fine of Rs 5,000 for commission of offence under Section 376 of RPC and a rigorous imprisonment of five years and a fine of Rs 3,000 for commission of offence under Section 366 of RPC.

Justice Sanjay Dhar, after hearing both the sides, observed that evidence led by the prosecution lends credence to inference that prosecutrix had accompanied the appellant/accused out of her own will. "It has come in evidence on record that prosecutrix and accused were caught by police while they got down from a vehicle in Kulgam. It is not a case where police raided premises of accused and recovered prosecutrix from his custody. It has also come in the statement of one Ghulam Mohammad Ganie, who happens to be grandfather of prosecutrix, that when police recovered prosecutrix, she refused to go with her father. The witness has further admitted suggestion that the prosecutrix eloped with the accused.

He further stated that there were relations between prosecutrix and accused. These circumstances clearly go on to show that it is not a case of abduction and rape but it is a case of elopement of the prosecutrix with accused out of her own will and volition, which the learned trial court has failed to discern despite there being enough evidence on record to this effect," the Court observed.

HC quashes FIR registered against SSP



JAMMU: Justice Sanjay Dhar of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court Jammu Bench on Wednesday quashed a FIR registered against Ramesh Kumar Bhat at Police Station Bahu Fort under Sections 419, 342, 506 and 170 of IPC. Justice Sanjay Dhar after hearing senior Adv Sunil Sethi with Adv Vaibhav Gupta for petitioner; observed that it is clear that not only allegations have been made in complaint but it is also material that has been assembled by investigating agency in support of those allegations, required to be analysed by the Court while deciding as to whether proceedings in a particular case deserve to be quashed. "It is true that High Court in exercise of its jurisdiction under Section 482 CrPC would not embark upon an enquiry as to the veracity of allegations made in FIR or complaint but then when full-fledged investigation has taken place and material collected during investigation of the case do not support allegations made in complaint, the Court would be well within its jurisdiction to quash criminal proceedings," the Court observed. Justice Sanjay Dhar further observed that present case is not the one where if proceedings are quashed, the same would amount to stifling prosecution but it is a case where after full-fledged investigation of impugned FIR, the investigating agency has come to a conclusion that allegations made in aforesaid FIR are not substantiated by material assembled during investigation. "Continuance of criminal proceedings, in such a case, would amount to abuse of process of law. As such, proceedings in impugned FIR deserve to be quashed," the Court observed and quashed FIR registered by Police Station Bahu Fort.
