NEW DELHI: Stepping up its efforts to evacuate thousands of Indians stuck in Ukraine, the government on Monday decided to send four Union ministers to the neighbouring countries of the wartorn country to coordinate the evacuation process even as the external affairs ministry said nearly 8,000 nationals have returned in the last fortnight.

The decision to send Hardeep Puri, Jyotiraditya Scindia, Kiren Rijiju and V K Singh as "special envoys" of India to coordinate the evacuation process was taken at a meeting chaired by Prime Minister Narendra Modi, who also held another high-level meeting in the evening on Ukraine, government sources said.

Official sources said Modi spoke to all four ministers personally to convey the decision that they will be coordinating evacuation efforts on

Scindia will take care of evacuation efforts from Romania and Moldova while Rijiju will go to Slovakia, sources said, adding Puri will go to Hungary and Singh will be in Poland to manage the evacuation.

The decision to send these ministers came a day after Modi asserted that ensuring the safety of Indian students and evacuating them is the government's top priority.

Monday's meeting was also attended by several ministers, including External Affairs Minister S Jaishankar and Commerce Minister Piyush Goyal, National Security Adviser Ajit Doval and Foreign Secretary Harsh Vardhan Shringla among other senior officials.

Also on Monday, Shringla briefed a parliamentary panel on the situation in Ukraine amid a Russian

JAMMU: Satwari police has registered an FIR on the written complaint of one Angad Singh, son of a retired IGP of J&K Police J P Singh.

According to the complaint, Angad entered into a deal for the supply of Industrial oil with a Chennai-based company. He paid Rs 26 lakh to the company for oil trading. However, on no response from the company, an FIR has been lodged with the Satwari police stating that the payment of Rs 26 lakh has been made online. Police has registered the FIR to probe the matter in detail.

"Angad is also running two petrol pumps in Jammu-one near Airport and other at Gangyal area", police said, adding "we are also probing the mode of payments made to the oil company.

Here it is pertinent to mention that under rules, no petrol pump operator can indulge in any type of other oil trading. "We are probing the case from all angles," police said.

India's GDP grows 5.4 pc in Q3; remains

NEW DELHI: India's economic growth slowed to 5.4 per cent in the third quarter of 2021-22 but was higher than China's GDP expansion of 4 per cent during the same $\,$ period and the country retained its position as the world's fastest growing major economy.

In the current fiscal, GDP growth stood at 20.3 per cent in April-June quarter and 8.5 per cent in July-September period.

The National Statistical Office (NSO) in its second advance estimates of national accounts released on Monday pegged the country's

per cent, a tad lower than 9.2 per cent estimated in its first advance estimates released in January. Besides, NSO revised its

estimates of GDP contrac-

tion for the coronavirus pandemic-hit last financial vear $(2020\mbox{-}21)$ to 6.6 per cent. Earlier, the estimate was 7.3 per cent contraction. The Indian economy con-

tracted 23.8 per cent in April-June in 2020 and 6.6 per cent in July-September quarter in 2020.

"While an adverse base was expected to flatten growth in Q3 FY2022, the initial
