

J&K's 3 Deaf Judokas in Indian team for Deaflympic at Brazil

JAMMU: Three deaf Judokas of Jammu & Kashmir have been selected in the Indian Team for 24th Deaflympic scheduled to be held at Brazil from May 1 this year. The Indian Team selected has eight Judokas.

All three selected Judokas of J&K are the alumni of School for Speech and Hearing Handicapped, Jammu being run by a well-known NGO, J&K Samaj Kalyan Kendra, Jammu.

The J&K Judokas selected for Indian Team are Rakshinda Mehak for under-78 kg category, Vishal Khajuria for under-60 kg category and Rakesh Singh for under-66kg category.


Govt GLDM Degree College Hiranagar organises Intra-college Debate Competition
