

# Education system needs to update for future industry trends: Kansal

JAMMU: Principal Secretary, Higher Education Department, Rohit Kansal on Thursday presided over the ongoing Mahatma Gandhi National Fellowship academic module of Sankalp at Hotel Asia.

The twelve-days programme, from March 7 to March 19, has been conducted by the Indian Institute of Management, IIM Jammu.

MGN Fellowship is a two-year programme which combines classroom sessions at IIM with an intensive field immersion at the district level to strengthen the district skill administration and the District Skill Committees (DSCs).

Speaking at the occasion, the Principal Secretary underlined the need to reap benefits of demographic dividend of India in the form its

stressed on the need to successfully convert it into a talented workforce through modern education.

through education', he said. The Principal Secretary called for aligning skill and education being imparted by universities with workplace opportunities of the future. He said that the system need to upgrade itself to cater to the upcoming Industry 4.0 trends.

Rohit Kansal shared his ideas on a plethora of subjects, including doubling of farmers income, efficient delivery of public services

and social welfare schemes etc. He called upon the fellows to act as crusaders of change and give recommendations to government for institutionalisation of their novel initiatives. He suggested that the fellows take inputs from local stakeholders while proposing any development for the latter.

The Principal Secretary also shared lessons from the success of Back to Village programmes and hailed its

grounds-up approach.

IIM faculty would teach course content under each course module that is consistent with 40 contact days; along with off-campus mentoring, field experience, and workshops that should form an integral part of the learning. Fellows from J&K, West Bengal, Ladakh, Chandigarh and Puducherry are participating in the programme.

The programme has been designed by the initiative of Ministry of Skill Development and Entrepreneurship (MSDE), Government of India, and implemented in collaboration with State Skill Development Missions (SSDMs).

## Corruption at peak in Kashmir despite ACB's stern watch

Srinagar: It was supposed that corruption would vanish after abrogation of Article 370 and inclusion of new rules as per Jammu and Kashmir Re-organisation Bill 2019, but the fight against corruption and corrupt officers is becoming more stringent for a common man with every passing day.

Anti-Corruption Bureau has arrested 6 corrupt government officials including a women Sarpanch for demanding bribe from people in less than a month. On Feb 16, ACB nabbed Hafiza Begum, Sarpanch, Khulchobhar; district Anantnag for accepting bribe of Rs 6,500 for approving work files of complainant. It was for the first time such a shameful incident took place wherein a woman Sarpanch was arrested for accepting bribe. Next day on February 17, ACB arrested one Habibullah Mir; Naib Tehsildar, Chukar Tehsil Kunz; district Baramulla for while receiving Rs 30,000 as bribe. During the course of investigations, it was revealed that accused had already taken Rs 10,000 from complainant and was demanding more. Again on February 18, ACB received a complaint alleging therein that a Guard in Wildlife Department namely Tariq Ahmad Sofi posted at Waskhura, District Ganderbal was demanding Rs 5,000 as bribe for releasing belongings of a complainant seized by Department. Rafiq Ahmad Sheikh, Computer Operator of Public Works Department (R&B) Ganderbal was also arrested by ACB for demanding and accepting bribe of Rs 4,000. Overall, during first week of March 2022, ACB arrested 4 Government officials for corrupt practices.

Notably during past decade,

India's rank improved one place

above to 85 among 180 countries in Corruption Perception Index (CPI) of 2021, according to report by Transparency International.

Except Bhutan, all India's neighbours are

ranked below it. Pakistan dropped 16 spots in the index and was ranked at 140.

The index which ranks 180

countries and territories by their perceived levels of public

sector corruption according to experts and business people,

uses a scale of 0 to 100, where

0 is highly corrupt and 100 is

very clean. Those with weak

scores included China (45),

India (40), Indonesia (38),

Pakistan (28) and Bangladesh (26), the report of anti-corruption watchdog said. While corruption takes vastly different forms from country to country, this year's scores reveal that all regions of globe are at a standstill when it comes to fighting public-sector corruption.
