CRIME REPORT

Theft case solved; two arrested, stolen batteries recovered

JAMMU: Police on Friday solved a theft case by arresting two thieves and recovered stolen batteries from them.

As per details, information was received at Police Station Gharota regarding various thefts of batteries in area. Accordingly, two FIRs No 23 & 25 /2022 under section 379 of IPC were registered at Police Station Gharota.

After this, a team of Police Station Gharota under the supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial led by SHO Gharota Inspr Khyatimaan Khajuria did strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages, rounded up two suspects namely Sushant Sharma, son of Naresh Kumar, resident of Jullaka Mohalla Jain Bazar and Raghu Raina, son of Rakesh Raina, resident of Afgana Mohalla, Jammu. During questioning, both accused confessed their involvement in crime and on their disclosure 4 stolen batteries were recovered.

Three absconders arrested

JAMMU: Police on Friday arrested three absconders evading arrests for 35 years and 8 years.

As per details, an information was received through reliable sources at Police Station Pacea Danga regarding presence of an absconder namely Dhiyan Chand, son of Dhani Ram, resident of Khawasapur, R S Pura who was evading arrest since 1987 i.e., 35 years in a FIR registered under sections 457/380 of RPC at Police Station Pacea Danga. On this, a team from Police Station Pacea Danga under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO Pacea Danga Raghbir Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Lalit Kumar, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested the absconder, who was produced in the Court of Sub Judge Jammu, and Court sent him to District Jail Amphalla.

Similarly, information regarding two absconders namely Chankar Singh, son of Krishan Lal, resident of Chaka Rajgarh District Ramban related with FIR No 317/2014 registered under sections 279/337/338 of RPC at Police Station Nagrota and Shaqoor Ahmed, son of Bashir Ahmed, resident of Pernoth Tehsil District Ramban, who were evading their arrests since 2014 i.e., 8 years. On this, a team of Police Station Nagrota under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar led by SHO Nagrota Vishav Pratap Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, arrested both the accused. It is pertinent to mention that two different warrants under sections 512 of CrPc were issued against absconders namely Chankar Singh and Shaqoor Ahmed, who were produced before JMFC Forest Court, Jammu for further proceedings.

6 missing persons traced, reunited with family members

JAMMU: Police on Friday traced six missing persons and reunited them with their families.

As per details, two different missing complaints were lodged at two different Police Posts i.e., report regarding missing of a boy namely Neeraj Gupta, son of Bodh Raj, resident of Sanjay Nagar at Police Post Digiana and report regarding missing of a girl namely Ramrati, daughter of Raja Bhai, resident of Kheri Tehsil Rajnagar District Chhatterpur; presently staying at lower Chowdi, Greater Kailash Jammu at Police Post Greater Kailash stating that they went missing from their respective homes.

In this regard two different missing reports were registered at Police Posts Digiana and Greater Kailash. On this, teams led by Incharge Police Post Digiana SI Tarsem Raj and Incharge Police Post Greater Kailash SI Majid Hussain, after putting in hectic efforts and with help of CCTV footages of areas, traced both missing persons. Subsequently, their families were informed and they were handed-over to their respective family members after completing all legal formalities.

Another report regarding missing of a specially-abled boy, resident of Canal Road Jammu was lodged at Police Post Canal Road Jammu. After this, a team of Police Post Canal Road led by SHO Nowabad Rajesh Khajuria assisted by Incharge Police Post Canal Road PSI Ishfaq Ahmed Kasana, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, traced the missing boy. The family was contacted and the boy was handed-over to family members after completing all legal formalities.

Meanwhile, on November 3, it was reported at Police Station Chassana that a woman namely Banno, wife of Late Baj Khan, resident of Neosi Channa, District Reasi went missing from home. On this, missing report was registered at Police Station Chassana and search was launched. Enquiries from the family, relatives & friends provided sufficient clues regarding the missing woman and accordingly police sources were activated. After meticulous track-following, team of Reasi police zeroed upon location of woman. A Police team led by SHO Chassana Rahul Mahajan recovered the woman from her native village Neosi and after completing all legal formalities, she was handed-over to her legal heirs.

In another case, an application was received at Police Station Chanderkote on March 10, 2022 by one Mehtab Ali, son of Itfaq Ali, resident of Kunfer, Chanderkot that his brother namely Afzal Ali, son of Itfaq Ali, resident of Kunfer Chanderkote went missing from his house. Acting swiftly, a wireless message was broadcasted to all Police Stations/Police Posts and a special police team was constituted to trace missing boy, led by Insp Padam Dev Singh SHO Police Station Chanderkote, assisted by PSI Ishan Sharma. After hectic efforts, the missing person was traced near Dam Site on Rajgarh road, Chanderkote and was reunited with his family. The entire search was effected by police team headed by Insp Padam Dev Singh SHO Chanderkote under supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen DySP Ramban

and overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

22 bovines rescued; 2 smugglers arrested

JAMMU: Police on Friday foiled bovine smuggling bids by rescuing 22 bovines and arrested two smugglers.

As per details, police rescued 6 bovines from a vehicle (JK20 9509) during patrolling duty under jurisdictions of Police Post Chowki Choura. Accordingly, FIR No. 54/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act, 207, 3/181 of MV Act was registered at Police Station Akhnoor and two accused persons were arrested, who was identified as Vikram Singh, son of Shamsheer Singh, resident of Rajouri and Varinder Singh, resident of Sunderbani. The arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Akhnoor Inspr Hilal Azhar assisted by Incharge Police Post Chowki Choura SI Saroop Singh under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial.

Samba Police also foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines and rescued 16 bovines. Acting on an information regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party of Police Post Mansar while vehicle checking at Naka Mansar, intercepted a truck (HR61A/4815). During checking, 16 cattle were found laden inside it which were rescued. FIR No. 51/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Samba.

Attempt to murder case solved, 3 arrested

SAMBHA: Police on Friday solved an attempt to murder case and arrested 3 accused involved in crime.

As per details, on February 2, 2022, a Special Police Officer (SPO) namely Arun Kumar posted at Police Station Ramgarh was attacked brutally with sharp-edged weapon by some unknown persons with an intention to kill him. The accused fled away from spot leaving behind the official in a pool of blood, who was later shifted to GMC Jammu for treatment. At this, FIR No. 19/2022 under sections 307/353/382/34 of IPC 4/25 of Arms Act was registered at Police Station Ramgarh and investigation started.

SSP Samba, Dr Abhishek Mahajan immediately constituted a special team led by SHO Ramgarh Insp Ashanand under supervision of SDPO Vijaypur; Vishal Manhas for arresting absconding persons. During course of investigation, a team of Police Station Ramgarh developed leads and conducted raids at different suspicious places in & out of District Samba and finally succeeded in apprehending accused persons from Nanke Chak, Samba. The accused were identified as Ranju Choudhary, son of Late Kuldeep Raj, Kathar, Ramgarh; Atul Choudhary alias Ravi, son of Mohan Lal, resident of Trindi Camp, Ramgarh and Vasudev alias Shunu, son of Late Som Dutt, resident of Shahzadpur, Ramgarh and during sustained questioning, confessed their involvement in crime.



5 notorious drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs from society, Police on Thursday arrested 4 notorious drug peddlers across Srinagar and recovered contraband substances.

As per details, a party of Police Station Kothibagh at a checkpoint established at Lal Chowk intercepted 2 suspects identified as Sajad Ahmed Beigh, son of Abdul Hamid Beigh, resident of Aluchibagh & Amir Mir, son of Mohd Ashraf Mir, resident of Mujgund. During checking, officers recovered 21.5 gm of brown sugar like substance from their possession. Meanwhile, acting on specific information, another drug peddler was arrested by a party from Police Station Kothibagh at a checkpoint. Identified as Ferooz Ahmed Shah, son of Ghulam Qadir Shah, resident of Rawalpura Shopian, the accused was found in possession of 25 gm heroin like substance.

Meanwhile, a party of Police Station KaralKhud at a checkpoint established at SRTC bridge, intercepted a suspect identified as Ghulam Nabi Bhat, son of Abdul Gani Bhat, resident of Bagi Dilawar Khan, Shamsipora Baddem. During checking, 10 bottles & 30 tablets of banned psychotropic substances, 50 gram Charas like substance & cash amounting to Rs 1,20,500, believed to be proceeds of narcotics, was recovered from his possession. They were arrested and shifted to respective police stations where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective police stations and further investigation started.

In another action, a party of Police Station Kreeri under the supervision of SDPO Kreeri Dr Khalid Ashraf at a checkpoint established at Waripora Payeen Kreeri intercepted a suspect identified as Bashir Ahmad Mir, son of Ab Rehman Mir, resident of Kreeri. During checking, 55 gm Charas like substance was recovered from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, a case under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Kreeri and further investigation started.

Notorious thief arrested; stolen items, cash recovered

BUDGAM: Police on Friday arrested a notorious thief and recovered stolen items & cash amounting to Rs 20,000 from his possession.

As per details, on March 9, 2022, Police Station Chadoora received a complaint from one Abdul Gani Dar, son of Abdul Rahman Dar, resident of Daulatpora

Chadoora stating therein that one Zahid Muzaffar alias Raja Don, son of Mohammad Muzaffar Sheikh, resident of Gopalpora Chadoora obstructed his way at Wathora Sheikhpura, Chadoora and snatched his mobile phone and wallet containing some cash, driving license, ATM card and other important receipts and fled away. He further stated that accused withdrew an amount of Rs 37,000 using his ATM as complainant had kept his ATM PIN in the wallet.

Accordingly, FIR No. 32/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Chadoora and investigation started, during which a police team headed by SHO Police Station Chadoora Insp Mir Sajad Bashir taking advantage of modern technology, conducted a series of raids at multiple locations & subsequently arrested accused near Mochwa Railway Bridge.

On his disclosure, cash amount of Rs 20,000, snatched mobile, another mobile phone etc were recovered. Further investigation in the case is going on and more recoveries are also expected.

Two arrested with Charas & Ganja

Labourer killed after hit by rock at Zojila tunnel

Kidnapped girl recovered, missing woman traced

4 thefts in single night; 2 houses, temple, shrine burgled
