

Cong’s ideological fight against BJP, its policies in J&K will be intensified: Patil

JAMMU: Jammu and Kashmir has suffered the most under the BJP regime, senior Congress leader and MP Rajni Patil alleged on Friday, asserting that in run-up to the assembly elections, the Congress will intensify its ideological fight against the saffron party and its policies towards the union territory.

She was addressing workers meeting on Friday at Guru Nanak Nagar organized by Block Congress Committee wherein Chief JKPCC GA Mir, Working President JKPCC Raman Bhalla, General Secretary JKPCC Manmohan Singh, APRO Sukhwant Brar, Spokespersons Congress Ravinder Sharma, Ex MLA Haji Abdul Rasheed, Distt Jammu President Urban Yogesh Sawhney, Mahila Congress President Indu Pawar, General Secretary, Channi Singh, Treasurer Rajnesh Sharma participated. Patil claimed that so far BJP rule has been of "mismanagement, immense despair and agony" and the country today stands at a stage where the common people are suffering from the wounds inflicted by the government whereas Congress has been continuing its efforts to listen to grievances of aggrieved people in various areas of J&K. She said politics of disorientation and false propaganda have become the hallmark of the functioning of the Modi government.

She lashed out at the Central Govt for the unprecedented price hike and record unemployment besides failing to address the grievances of people of J&K on every count after promising massive development post August 5, 2019.

She said that development process started by UPA Govt in J&K, received a major setback, as the NDA Govt failed to carry forward the massive developments started by UPA.

Every section of the society including farmers, youth, students, employees are up in arms due to wrong policies of BJP, she said. Hitting hard the BJP and its state leadership for cheating the people of Jammu, she said that the BJP has lost the moral right to go to Jammu people after betrayal after betrayal. Stating that Bharatiya Janta Party (BJP) has "cheated" people of Jammu, she accused the Union govern-

ment of reducing status of people of the region to "fourth class citizens" even when they voted the party to power in Assembly and Parliamentary polls.

She criticized the misgovernance of BJP government due to which common masses are feeling cheated. She blamed the government for failing to tackle prices and making life difficult for the common man. There is no doubt that there has been a significant increase in poverty and hunger, she said. She said there is rule of untruth and injustice in the country. Mir in his address observed that governments are elected to ease the burden of people and at the very least, not work directly contrary to their interests. Every citizen is anguished and deeply distressed regarding the spiralling fuel and gas prices.

Raman Bhalla called upon people to teach BJP a lesson of life for issues of

price rise, unemployment, agricultural distress and crony capitalism in the country. He alleged that the BJP was taking the country on the path of destruction. He said all sectors were being handed over gradually to the corporates, while the farmers and small shopkeepers who generated employment were being finished. He said it was the people's responsibility to make the government accountable and pose questions to it. "Whenever the elections come, the BJP leaders mislead the people by talking about China or other countries and raise communal and casteist issues. JKPCC Working President added BJP government has not done any work in the public interest in J&K. The double engine government of the BJP has harassed every section of society and has not done anything itself but has been appearing in advertisements claiming the works of the Congress party as its own. He gave a clarion call to people in J&K and across the country to root out the BJP government which, according to him, is weakening the rural economy and hereditary trades, and playing havoc with the farm sector only to hand over agriculture sector to the corporates, he said.

Yogesh Sawhney said BJP playing politics of deceit and indulging in rhetoric. He said that not fulfilling the promise of providing 2 crore jobs annually is enough to prove the lies of its leadership.

Has Narendra Modi’s team been able to keep pace with him in ‘Time & Initiatives’

Right from day one of his taking over in May 2014 as Prime Minister of India Narendra Damodardas Modi has been expressing publicly his first intimate concern for the cause of the economically poor/underprivileged/under represented masses and the unemployed / under employed youth. He has refurbished, conceived & launched over 200 programmes & schemes for his people in the form of short term as well as long term props irrespective of caste/creed/sex/age segment/religion/region so as to give his people a respectable living & settlement with more of immediate focus on the women, unemployed youth, the senior citizens, the destitute and all round economic, physical & emotional development of his fellow countrymen. As far as the financial inputs to be sanctioned, released and ordered directly or indirectly by the government the Prime Minister at his level has been moving with extra pace but as far as the qual-

ity & achievements of physicals /social benefits are concerned has 'his team' been able to keep pace with him is a question that needs introspection since we may find some analysts opining that the money use efficiency of the resources flowing out of the public exchequer and element of good governance reaching the common man is not commensurate to the efforts being made by Prime Minister Narendra Modi.

May be 'his' people are not providing time to time real achievements on ground and Prime Minister gets carried with the thinking that no improvements / modifications are needed in the schemes and the guidelines for implementation & evaluation. To quoted Jan Aushadi Drug Store programme was started with opening of 1st retail Jan Aushadi Drug Store in November 2008 in Anuritsar, the scheme was conceived by Lt Shri Ram Vilas Paswan the then Petroleum and Chemicals Minister with Bureau of Pharma PSUs of India (BPPI) as the nodal agency to

promote the prescription writing, use and supply of allopathic drugs by chemical name / generic name & ensure that the drugs are sold labelled with genuine MRP so as to dislodge the prevailing unfair system of marking the drugs with unreasonably inflated MRPs which could be noticed at occasions even 5 to 6 times more than the genuine price. But the progress was very very dismal even after 7 years which could be well seen from the total revenue receipts of the Bureau of Pharma PSUs of India (BPPI) that was given the job for promotion of Jan Aushadi Store (Kendra) where supplies to JAS(K) has been just of Rs. 11 Cr (Rs.11,05,39329.91) in one year (2015-16) on all India basis in a country as large as India (janaushadhi.gov.in/brochure.html).

Prime Minister Narendra Modi had taken personal notice of that and he is in a way very intimately working to promote the programme just like 'his private' mission, the programme has been

renamed as Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadi Pariyojana (PMJAY) and handling body BPPI too has been renamed as Pharmaceuticals and Medical devices Bureau of India (PMBI) and even now since 2019 the 7th March is being observed as Jan Aushadi Divas. As per the information released by PMBI as on 31st March 2020 there were only 6306 retail outlets in India and the annual sales at MRP was just INR 433.60 Cr in 739 districts of India, no doubt the number has significantly grown after 2015 but in a country of about 6.5 Lakh villages (638365 villages- Census-2001) the number of retail shops after 14 years of start is too less and as per balance sheet of (PMBI) ending 31-03-2020 total revenue from operations has been just Rs.278 cr (Rs.278,01,49235) which includes accessories and surgical appliances also where as the total Annual Turnover of Pharmaceuticals was Rs. 2,89,998 crore for the year 2019-2020

in India.

The drugs and appliances sold through the Jan Aushadi Stores under the Pradhan Mantri Jan Aushadi Pariyojana (PMJAY) under chemical / generic name can cover the needs of more than 95 % of the sick/ailing people and are labelled with genuine prices (MRP) which could be as low as at least one third to one fifth of the MRP of the same drug being sold under different brand names by Pharma companies with the help of prescription writers. The programme was conceived about 13 years back but still there are only a few thousand shops in the country, very less people know about these stores and not many people have come forward to open these shops when on face of it there should be huge rush on these shops since people can save very large expenditure on drugs, should not the government of India / States / UTs have investigated into that ?

One of the prime reasons for fall back of the programme (inspite of Modi taking personal interest) has been that even

the government doctors do not write prescription by chemical name / generic name. In the year 2018 J&K government had even ordered creation of prescription audit cells in government hospitals but that too has remained only a formal order. Modi has interacted with some consumers and the JA store owners on 07-03-2022 but I do not find from any report in the media that any one has given such like feed back to Modi. Hope when such feedback reaches Modi he would surely express his unhappiness to those who 'simply' write success stories for such @functions. Imagine how many lakhs of crores of genuinely earned common man money has been unfairly taken away by pharma companies and their associates even after 2008 due to the reason that those assigned the job of promotion of Jan Aushadi Drug Outlets and prescription writing by chemical name having not performed their duty truthfully.
