

## H&UDD launches online portal for change of land-use permission in Master Plan areas

JAMMU: Housing & Urban Development Department (H&UDD), J&K on Friday launched the online portal for granting permission for change of land use in Master Plan Areas. In exercise of powers conferred by section 11-A of the Jammu and Kashmir Development Act, 1970, the Government of UT of J&K had notified vide SO No. 439 dated 24-12-2021 the scheme for levy of charges for use of land as permitted in the Master Plan Areas. Under the scheme, permission for land use shall be granted strictly in accordance with permitted land use under such Master plan or Zonal plan.

In terms of the above S.O, the Jammu Development Authority is the Competent Authority to grant the permission for Change in Land Use and to levy charges there

for in the entire local planning area of Jammu Master Plan 2032 including JMC, Municipal Committees of Bari Brahma, Vijay Pur, Gho-Manhasan, Bishan and rural areas falling in JMP 2032 limits.

Any owner or his authorised person desirous of getting land use of his land changed to the one prescribed in the Jammu Master Plan 2032 irrespective of whether he intends to undertake construction immediately thereafter or later, can apply for this permission through online portal [www.jkhudobps.in](http://www.jkhudobps.in) or through JDA's website [www.jda.jk.gov.in](http://www.jda.jk.gov.in) by clicking Online Building Permission System (OBPS).

CLU permission certificate cannot be used as a proof of title of ownership of the land as it is issued solely on the declaration of the applicant and entirely on his risk and responsibility. JDA reserves the right to withdraw/ cancel the CLU permission attained on the basis of mis-representation/concealment of correct facts, at any time.

Change of land use (CLU) shall be given for Residential/Industrial/Public & Semi Public/Commercial

use as per land use permissible in Jammu Master Plan 2032 for that particular piece of land. However, CLU of a plot of land measuring less than 1 kanal for residential purposes is not required. Change of land use permission does not mean approval or sanction of building permission on the land. For undertaking building activity, applicant need to separately apply before Competent Building Permission Issuing Authority through Online Building Permission System (OBPS).

## Jt Commissioner of Police, New Delhi delivers lecture at JU

JAMMU: The fourth online lecture under the banner of the Azadi Ka Amrit Mahotsava was organised by the Department of History, University of Jammu, today. The lecture was delivered by Dr. Om Prakash Mishra, Joint Commissioner of Police, New Delhi, on the theme "NARRATIVES OF POLICING DURING COVID 19." In his address, Dr. Mishra, stated that the police policy and practice are always implemented within wider social, political and economic contexts and, therefore, Police organisations have a wealth of experience in responding to emergencies. However, the COVID-19 pandemic created social upheaval and altered

norms for police as for all members of society. While securing public consent remained a core aim - and policing in this sense continued as before - the pandemic had profound effects on police organisations, the way they worked, their relationships with the public they served. He then went on to highlight the changing narratives of policing during COVID-19. He also spoke on how as frontline warriors, police organisations took up new responsibility and enforced covid-19 regulations.

Prof. Manoj K.Dhar, Vice-Chancellor, University of Jammu in his opening remarks said that the spread of Covid has been unprecedented in terms of

speed and scale, leading to complex social developments. It threw into sharp focus the need to reconsider and reorient the structural arrangement obtainable in the service sector. While society is still grappling with several issues arising out of it, the topic chosen for today's lecture remains extremely relevant and hopefully, it would unfold the multiple engagements of the police sector, members of which stood for us as a frontline warriors.
