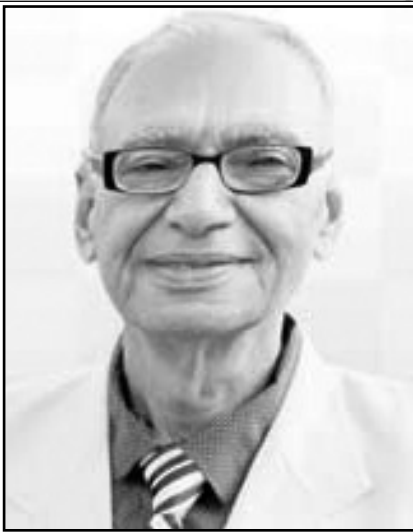

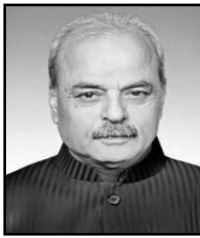

CRIME REPORT

6 arrested for illegal extraction & transportation of minor minerals

BUDGAM: Police in Budgam arrested 6 persons and seized 5 vehicles including 4 tippers and a JCB involved in illegal extraction and transportation of minerals.

As per details, officers from Police Station Chadoora arrested 4 persons involved in illegal extraction and transportation of clay from Government land at Nagam Chadoora. They also seized 3 vehicles including 2 tippers and a JCB from the spot. The arrested persons were identified as Fayaz Ahmed Dar, son of Ghulam Rasool Dar, resident of Chadoora Budgam; Mushtaq Ahmad Khanday, son of Mohammad Ramzan Khanday, resident of Chontinar Charar-e-Sharif; Abdul Majeed Teli, son of Abdul Kareem Teli, resident of Wathoorah Budgam and Irshad Ahmad Shah, son of Ghulam Hassan Shah, resident of Chadoora.

In a similar action, officers from Police Station Khansahib, arrested 2 accused identified as Mudasir Ahmad Nengroo, son of Ghulam Mohiuddin, resident of Banderpora Khansahib and Muzamil Mushtaq, son of Mushtaq Ahmed Mir, resident of Bugroo Khansahib for extraction of minerals at Nalla Shali-Ganga Draigam Khansahib, besides seizing two tippers bearing registration numbers JKo1S-2807 and JK02AF-8497. All accused were shifted to Police Stations where they remained in custody. Accordingly, cases under relevant sections of law were registered at respective Police Stations and investigation started.

Inter-State drug cartel busted; 5 arrested, haul of drugs, cash recovered

SRINAGAR: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police in Srinagar busted an Inter-State drug mafia cartel by arresting five notorious drug peddlers and recovered huge quantity of drugs and cash amount of Rs 70,200 (believed to be proceeds of narcotic sales).

Acting on specific information generated by Police Station Kralkhud about movement of notorious drug peddlers, on a vehicle bearing registration number HR26BA-5606 around SRTC Bridge in Karalkhud area, a special operation was launched by Srinagar Police wherein five drug peddlers were arrested, who were identified as Tariq Ahmad Wango, son of Ab Khaliq, resident of Chinkral Mohalla; Manzoor Ahmad Mir, son of Ghulam Mohammad Mir; Mohammad Afzal Mir, son of Noor Mohammad Mir; Tariq Ahmad Sofi, son of Mohammad Afzal Sofi; all residents of Tengpora Bypass and Mudasir Ahmad Sheikh alias Vicky, son of Ghulam Mohammad, resident of Zaindar Mohalla, Srinagar. During search, 35,000 Spasmaproxyn capsules and an amount of Rs 70,200, believed to be proceeds of narcotics sales, was recovered from their possession. These peddlers were on move towards other districts for delivery of illegal consignments. It is pertinent to mention here that drug peddler Tariq Ahmed Wango is already involved in six FIRs registered at different police stations of Srinagar and was also lodged in Public Safety Act in 2019. Subsequently, FIR No. 08/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Kral Khud and investigation started.

18 bovines rescued, smuggler held

SAMBA/JHAJJAR KOTLI: Police on Saturday foiled three attempts to smuggle bovines by rescuing 18 bovines and arrested a smuggler.

As per details, a party from Police Station Ghagwal led by SHO Inspector Vijay

Verma while performing vehicle checking duty at Naka Tapyal, intercepted a Mahindra (JK02BJ-5417) and during checking found two cattle laden in it, which were rescued. The accused, identified as Yaqoob Ali, son of Murid, resident of Ward-4 Chak Drab Khan Tehsil and District Kathua was arrested and FIR No. 33/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Ghagwal. Similarly in another incident, same police party rescued 3 more bovines at Naka Tapyal, Ghagwal which were being transported in a Mahindra (JK02BJ-1729). The vehicle used for transporting bovines was also seized and FIR No. 35/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police station Ghagwal. Meanwhile, 13 bovine animals were rescued from a vehicle (JK13B 5750) at Manwal. The recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Devinder Singh assisted by Incharge Police Post Manwal PSI Ayub Khan under the supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.



Three absconders nabbed

JAMMU: Three absconders, who were evading arrests for a long time, were arrested on Saturday.

As per details, an information was received through reliable sources at Police Station Gangyal regarding two presence of absconders namely Amrik Singh, son of Gosha Singh, resident of Chatha, Kullian Govindpura Jammu and Avtar Singh, son of Gurdev Singh, resident of Bhour Camp, Chhatta Kullian who were evading arrests since 2004 i.e., 18 years in FIR No 34/2004 registered under section 379 of IPC of Police Station Gangyal.

On this, a team of Police Station Gangyal under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma led by SHO Gangyal Insp Joginder Singh, after putting in strenuous efforts, finally the absconder, who was produced before the Court for further proceedings.

Similarly, information regarding an absconder namely Mohd Mushtaq, son of Mohd Shafi, resident of Kothey Sainian, who was evading arrest since 2020 i.e., 2 years in FIR No 103/2020 registered under sections 365/341/147 of IPC at Police Station Bishnah. On this, a team of Police Station Bishnah under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Police Station Bishnah Insp Vinod Kumar arrested the absconder, who will be produced before the court.

Four vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams made a massive recovery of vehicles involved in illegal mining. The teams from Police Station Jhajjar Kotli and Police Post Sainik colony acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 4 vehicles involved in illegal mining, which included 3 tippers (JK02BB-5156, JK02AF-6147 and JK14F-5571) seized by Jhajjar Kotli police and a tipper bearing registration number MH12TRDZ1863, seized by Sainik Colony police.

The overall recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Devinder Singh and

Incharge Police Post Sainik Colony PSI Satyajeet Singh in their respective jurisdictions. DMO Jammu was also intimated about the same.

Notorious drug peddler arrested with Charas

DODA: Police on Saturday nabbed a drug peddler and recovered 370 gm Charas from his possession.

Doda Police said that on March 11, one Amjad Hussain, son of Mohd Hussain Bhat, resident of Chinar Mohalla Bhadarwah was going towards Bhadarwah town from Chinta area and found in possession of narcotic substance (Charas). Acting swiftly on information, a team from Police Post Bhalra led by PSI Bupinder Sharma Incharge Police Post Bhalra swung into action and apprehended accused near Kapra Bridge. During search, 370 gm Charas was recovered from his possession. The accused was arrested and FIR No.29/2022 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered at Police Station Bhadarwah. The forward/backward links of accused are being ascertained to unearth the source of supplier. The recovery of Charas was made from possession of accused in presence of Executive Magistrate Class 1st Bhalra (Bhadarwah) by a Police party led by Incharge Police Post Bhalra PSI Bupinder Sharma under supervision of Abdul Ghafoor, SDPO Bhadarwah and overall supervision of Mohd Aftab Mir, Addl SP Bhadarwah.



Missing for 24 days, body of former PDD employee found

PULWAMA: Body of a missing 65-year-old man, who went missing for last 24 days, was recovered from river Jhelum in Awantipora on Saturday.

As per details, body of Abdul Gani Bhat (65), son of Mohammad Sideeq Bhat of Sunsaneel area in Pulwama was spotted by some passers-by who informed concerned police station. Soon a police team rushed to the spot and recovered the body. Bhat, a retired PDD employee, was missing since February 16. Further proceedings have been initiated in the matter.

Five detained for sacrilegious act in Rajouri

RAJOURI: Five people suspected of committing a sacrilegious act, to disturb communal harmony and hurting religious sentiments, have been detained in Rajouri district on Saturday, police said. The five accused were detained after an FIR was lodged for the alleged commission of act at a place under Chatyar Chingus police post area of the district.

After receipt of information of commission of sacrilegious act, a team led by Police post Incharge, Sub-Inspector Sahil Chowdhary, rushed to the spot followed by Additional Superintendent of Police Vivek Shekhar, Deputy SP (Headquarters, Rajouri) Vinod Sharma and Station House Officer Fareed Ahmed. However, Police did not disclose detailed of sacrilegious act committed.

A police spokesperson said all legal formalities were completed and a case under section 295-A (deliberate and malicious acts, intended to outrage religious feelings of a class by insulting its religion or religious beliefs) was registered at Rajouri Police Station. Five suspects are being questioned so far and further detailed investigation is going on, spokesman added.
