Court denies bail to four in abetment to suicide case of Seoj Dhar

JAMMU: Principal Sessions Judge Udhampur Yash Pal Bourne rejected the bail applications of four accused in a much-publicized abetment to suicide case occurred in hilly Seoj Dhar area of Basantgarh Tehsil in Udhampur, however granted bail to one.

Senior PP Koshal Kotwal for the State resisted the application on the grounds that all accused persons, with a common criminal intention, wrongfully restrained and made a murderous assault on one Shiv Raj, who has not been traced dead or alive thereafter. He further said that accused are charged with the commission of offences

under sections 306, 382, 147 of IPC, however, taking stock of evidence on record and conduct of accused persons, they don't deserve to be enlarged to bail at this stage of proceedings.

After hearing both the sides, Court observed that Shiv Raj has not been traced so far dead or alive and their release at this stage could certainly effect adversely the trial, however, accused Hassan Din is admitted to interim bail after taking into account nature of evidence against him.

However, Court rejected bail pleas of other four accused namely Din Mohd, Sadeeq, Ashiq Ali, Mohd Hassan.

HC takes serious note in investigation in NDPS Act, directs for ensuring logical conclusion of enquiries

JAMMU: A Division Bench of Jammu & Kashmir and Ladakh High Court comprising Justice Sanjeev Kumar and Justice Mohan Lal, while dismissing acquittal appeal of New Pension Scheme besides raising remuneration of village guards as per minimum wage act, honararium of Lumberdars, Anganwari workers, NYC, NYK, ReK, Helpers etc.

He also reiterated demand for extension of leave encashment benefits to teachers, reorganisation of clerical cadre and removal of pay anomalies. Later, the participants paid tributes to Late Avtar Singh, Ex-Provisional President of Teachers Association.

This significant judgment has been passed in an applica-

tion by Union Territory of Jammu & Kashmir seeking condonation of delay of 327 days in filing leave to appeal application to assual judgment of acquittal dated September 6, 2019 recorded by Court of Principal Sessions Judge, Reasi in file No.12/Sessions titled State vs Partap Singh, whereby Trial Court has acquitted respondent-accused in FIR No.54/2013 of Police Station Katra for offences under Sections 8/20 of Narcotic Drugs and Psychotropic Substances Act 1985 (NDPS Act).

DB after hearing AAG Ravinder Gupta for UT, while dismissing appeal filed by UT, observed that before we part with this judgment, we deem it appropriate to notice that this Court vide order dated

December 9, 2020 had directed the applicant to apprise the Court as to whether action has been taken or proposed to be taken against Investigating Officer, who did not appear as a witness in case as also Public Prosecutor, who failed to take requisite steps for examination of Investigating Officer and other relevant witnesses.

DB further observed that in response to aforesaid interim order passed by this Court, SSP Reasi has filed a status report and has also placed on record a copy of order No.164 of 2021 dated February 10, 2021, perusal of which indicates that the IGP Jammu Zone has ordered an enquiry to be conducted by Imtiyaz Ahmed, DySP, SO to DIG, UR Range, Udhampur against Inspector Sanjeev

Gupta, the then SHO, Police Station Katra; Constable, Sudesh Kumar No.201/CR and Const Gurcharan Singh No.532/U. "We are, however, not aware as to whether enquiry ordered by the IGP Jammu Zone has been taken to its logical end or not. It is the duty of the Inspector General of Police, Jammu Zone, Jammu to ensure that the enquiry ordered by him is taken to the logical conclusion and the delinquent officials are made accountable. This will be necessary to send a signal to the Investigating Officers, particularly those, investigating cases under NDPS Act to remain vigilant in future and perform their duties diligently, so that people who indulge in drug trafficking can be booked.
