terrorism but the movement was due to lure of financial benefit and land offer in Delhi....another belief is there is a long battle between separatist and those who stand for India," she said quoting the tweets.

She also said Congress was an ally of the government at the time of the exodus and the then chief minister left people to fend for himself when terrorism was on the rise.

She alleged that under the Congress regime, the then prime minister met a separatist who had had allegedly killed an Air Force officer and later conceded the same to a foreign TV channel.

MPs of the Congress, NCP, TMC and the National Conference walked out of Lok Sabha in protest against the remarks made by the minister after the Speaker did not allow the opposition members to intervene.

The House passed the Budget totalling Rs 1.42-lakh-crore for Jammu and Kashmir and also Supplementary Demands for Grants seeking additional spending of Rs 18,860.32 crore for the Union Territory.

Sitharaman said normalcy has been achieved after the abrogation of special status to Jammu and Kashmir while prior to that it was "fake normalcy".

"Jammu and Kashmir was not normal under Article 370...there was fake normalcy prior to abrogation of Article 370....post abrogation there is no fake normalcy," she said.

Sitharaman said 890 central laws became applicable in Jammu and Kashmir after the abrogation of Article 370.

"Removal of Article 370 was necessary, it was delayed...we have fulfilled that promise given to the people of Jammu and Kashmir," she said.

Backdoor entry has stopped and there is transparency in appointments, she said, adding the system is getting better day by day.

The government is committed to the development of J&K and for the homecoming Kashmiri Pandit, several steps have been taken.

She assured the House that the government will fulfil the promises made with respect to the rehabilitation of Kashmiri Pandits.

Reeling out numbers, she said, the government has built 1025 transmit accommodations while about 1,500 are under the process of construction.

The minister said 40,000 projects were completed in Jammu and Kashmir in 2021-22 and connectivity in the Union Territory is improving.

The Union Territory has witnessed a 90 percent decrease in ceasefire as it reduced from 900 in 2020 to 98 in 2021, she said, adding, terrorism has been contained and infiltration has declined significantly.

About investment, she said, an investor-friendly Jammu and Kashmir campaign has paid off.

COVID vaccination to...

born in 2008, 2009 and 2010 i.e those who are already above 12 years of age) of the population from March 16, 2022, the ministry said in a statement.

According to official sources, around 7.11 crore children will be vaccinated under the new age group.

Biological E Ltd has supplied 5 crore doses of Corbevax to the Centre and the vaccine has been distributed to states, sources said.

The announcement comes at a time when schools across the country are opening up given the considerable decline in the COVID cases.

The Government has also decided that the condition of comorbidity for COVID19 precaution dose for population over 60 years of age will be removed forthwith, the ministry said.

"Hence, from 16th March 2022 onwards, the entire population above 60 years of age will be eligible for precautionary doses of COVID19 vaccine," the ministry said.

The population above 14 years of age is already being inoculated under the ongoing COVID vaccination program.

The countrywide vaccination drive was rolled out on January 16 last year with healthcare workers (HCWs) getting inoculated in the first phase. The vaccination of frontline workers (FLWs) started on February 2 last year.

The next phase of COVID-19 vaccination commenced from March 1 for people over 60 years of age and those aged 45 and above with specified comorbid conditions.

The country launched vaccination for all aged more than 45 years from April 1, 2021.

The Central government then decided to expand its vaccination drive by allowing everyone above 18 to be vaccinated from May 1 last year.

The next phase of COVID-19 vaccination commenced on January 3 this year for adolescents aged 15-18 years.

India began administering precaution doses of COVID-19 vaccine to healthcare workers, frontline workers and those aged 60 and above with co-morbidities, from January 10 amid a spike in coronavirus infections fuelled by the Omicron variant of the virus in the country.

Delimitation Commission makes...

The detailed proposal, published in leading newspapers on Monday, also carried two dissenting notes signed by four of the five associate members - three National Conference Lok Sabha MPs (Farooq Abdullah, Hasnain Masoodi and Mohammad Akbar Lone) and BJP MP Jugal Kishore. Union Minister Jitendra Singh is the

fifth associate member of the commission.

Set up on March 6, 2020, with a one-year term to redraw Lok Sabha and assembly constituencies, the commission headed by former supreme court judge Ranjana Prakash Desai has been given two extensions of one year and two months, respectively, to complete its task.

However, its draft proposals had evoked a strong reaction, especially from the opposition parties including the National Conference whose dissent note pertained to different assembly constituencies besides challenging the very constitution of the panel pending the Supreme Court verdict on the Jammu and Kashmir Reorganization Act.

"...the present delimitation exercise, it is painful to point out, is neither in tune with the Constitution nor in consonance with law. The criteria, be it allocation of 7 increased Assembly constituencies or delimiting the constituencies and drawing boundaries of the constituencies is arbitrarily fixed and selectively applied," the NC had said about the panel's report.

The NC had said that delimitation exercise has to be conducted in a manner that the maximum population should be represented. "However, be it the allocation of additional seats or delimiting of the Assembly constituencies these principles have been very conveniently ignored", it claimed.

Opposing the annexing of Poonch and Rajouri areas in Anantnag seat, the NC said such a proposal "may be without a parallel in the history. Nowhere in such an exercise, two geographically different regions separated by one of the highest mountain ranges inaccessible for most of the year must have been ever joined to form one constituency ignoring fundamental principles of contiguity, connectivity, convenience and compact area as required under law."

Notwithstanding the opposition, the notification said "...the Delimitation Commission hereby publishes its proposals for the delimitation of Parliamentary and Assembly Constituencies in the Union Territory of Jammu and Kashmir, together with the dissenting proposals of the Associate Members, and specifies 21st March 2022 (Monday) as the date on or after which the proposals will be further considered by it."

The advertisement signed by Secretary K N Bhar said any objections or suggestions on these proposals should reach the Secretary, Delimitation Commission, New Delhi, on or before March 21 following which the Commission will visit Jammu and Kashmir on March 28 and 29 for public sittings.

It said Jammu and Kashmir will have a 90-seat Assembly (43 in Jammu and 47 in Kashmir) and, of them, seven segments will be reserved for SCs and nine for STs.

Nine seats reserved for STs include Rajouri, Darhal and Thanna Mandi, all in Rajouri district, Surankote and Mendhar in Poonch district and Mahore in Reasi district (Jammu region); Gurez in Bandipora district, Kangan in Ganderbal district and Kokernag in Anantnag district (Kashmir division).

All seven seats reserved for SCs fall in Jammu region including Ramnagar in Udhampur district, Kathua South in Kathua district, Ramgarh in Samba district, Bishnah, Suchetgarh, Marh and Akhnoor in Jammu district.

While splitting Jammu and Kashmir into two Union Territories through the Reorganization Act in August 2019, the Union Home Ministry had increased Assembly seats of Jammu and Kashmir by seven taking total seats to 114, 24 of which are reserved for Pakistan-occupied Jammu and Kashmir (POJK) while the election will be held for 90 seats.

The erstwhile State of Jammu and Kashmir had 111 seats including 24 reserved for PoJK while elections were held for 87 seats. With the creation of Ladakh as Union Territory, four seats of the region were reduced and the Assembly was left with 83 seats. Delimitation of the Assembly constituencies was last held in 1994-95 during the President's Rule when seats of the erstwhile State Assembly were raised from 76 to 87.

LeT responsible for...

Malla was held guilty in 2019 by a court martial along with his company commander Major Gogoi for "fraternising" with a local woman and "being away from the place of duty while in operational area".

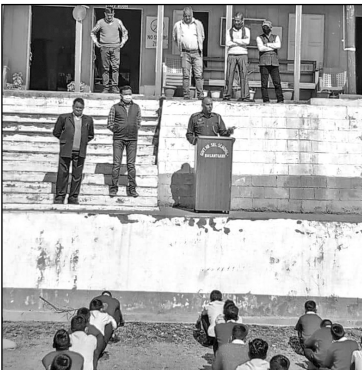

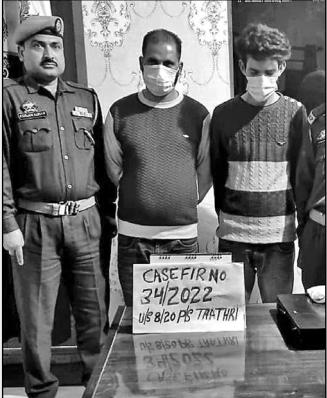
Three drug peddlers arrested with Charas

AWANTIPORA/DODA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, police on Monday arrested three drug peddlers in Awantipora and recovered Charas from their possession.

As per details, a party from Police Post Reshipora at a checkpoint established near Bra Bandina Crossing intercepted a suspect identified as Irshad Ahmad Koka, son of Bashir Ahmad Koka, resident of Melhura Shopian. During checking, officers recovered 900 gm Charas (in shape of sticks) from his possession. He was arrested and shifted to police station where he remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR number 36/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Awantipora and investigation started.

Meanwhile, two drug Peddlers namely Salman Yaqoob, son of Mohd Yaqoob and Nadeem Iqbal, son of Mohd Iqbal Malik, both residents of Bhadarwah were apprehended at Karara by a Police party led by SI Rahul Verma Incharge Police Post Krara. 130 gm Narcotic Substance (Charas) was recovered from their possession and FIR No. 34/2022, under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Thathri. The arrest and recovery were made under supervision Insp Amrit Katoch SHO Thathri and Meer Ghafoor SDPO Bhadarwah.



Three absconders nabbed

JAMMU/RAMBAN: Police on Monday arrested three absconders who were evading their arrests since long.

As per details, an information was received at Police Post Narwal regarding presence of an absconder namely Rajan, son of Dev Raj, resident of Narwal Bala, Jammu who was evading arrest since 2016 i.e., 6 years in FIR No 72/2004 registered under sections 376/34 of RPC. On this, a team from Police Post Narwal under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Police Station Bahu Fort Inspnr Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Narwal SI Achal Rana, arrested him.

Similarly, an information was received at Police Station Bahu Fort regarding an absconder namely Vicky Kumar, son of Balbir Singh, resident of Ludhiana, presently staying at Rajeev Nagar Narwal who was evading his arrest since 2011

i.e., 11 years in FIR No 129 /2011 registered under sections 436/452/147/109 of RPC at Police Station Bahu Fort. A team of Police Station Bahu Fort under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspnr Nayat Ali, after putting in hectic efforts, arrested the absconder.

It is pertinent to mention that warrant under section 512 CrPC were issued by the Court of 2nd Addl. District Sessions Judge Jammu on October 11, 2018. Absconders shall be produced before the Court for further proceedings.

Meanwhile, another absconder was arrested by Ramban Police after 15 years. As per details, one Manzoor Ahmad, son of Khan Mohd, resident of Kushiwah Kokernag, Anantnag, was booked in FIR No. 20/2007 registered under sections 188 of RPC, 56/146/196 of Motor Vehicles Act at Police Station Batote and was evading arrest for last 15 years. District Police Ramban was looking for the absconder and on specific information, a special police team of Police Station Batote was constituted which, led by SHO Ramban Insp Sudhir Sadotra under the supervision of Pardeep Singh Sen, DySP Hqrs Ramban with the overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban, arrested accused from Ramban and produced him in Court.

39 bovine animals rescued; 3 smugglers arrested

JAMMU/VIJAYPUR: Police on Monday foiled an attempt to smuggle bovine by rescuing 29 bovines and arrested three smugglers. As per details, acting on reliable information regarding transportation of bovines, a party from Police Station Vijaypur while performing vehicle checking duty at Naka NH AIIMS, Rakh Barotian, Vijaypur signaled a truck (PB35Z/1128) to stop. But instead of stopping vehicle, the driver accelerated vehicle and crossed Naka point. However, alert cops intercepted the truck a few meters away from Naka point. During checking of vehicle, 19 cattle were found laden inside vehicle, which were rescued. The accused identified as Lal Singh, son of Hem Raj, resident of Shail Firozpur Kalan Tehsil and District Pathankot was arrested and FIR No. 35/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Vijaypur.

Meanwhile, 10 bovines were rescued from two vehicles at Ban toll plaza Naka by police teams of Police Station Nagrota Jammu. Acting tough against bovine smugglers, Jammu Police rescued 10 bovine animals from two different vehicles (JK03H/1502 and JK02CS/2696) at Ban Toll Plaza Naka in jurisdiction of Police Station Nagrota. FIR Nos 95& 97/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA was registered at Police Station Nagrota and accused was arrested, who were identified as Asif Ali, son of Rafaaqat Ali, resident of Kokarnag District Anantnag and Mansha Choudhary, son of Nawab Din, resident of Channi Himnat, Jammu. The arrest and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspnr Vishav Pratap Singh under supervision of SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar.

6 vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams made a massive recovery of vehicles involved in illegal mining. The teams of Police Stations Satwari, R S Pura and Police Post Phallain Mandal acted stringently on specific inputs and raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 5 different vehicles, which included 2 dumpers (JK02Q/7607 and JK02 7707) seized by Satwari Police; Tractor trolley bearing Chassis No MBNBG55AEMCG21081 and Tractor trolley bearing Chassis No MZMDH916659S3 seized by R S Pura police and a tractor trolley bearing Chassis No FZCDS848386S3, seized by Phallain Mandal police.

The overall recoveries were made by SHO Satwari Insp Sameer Jeelani, SHO R S Pura Inspnr Jai Pal Sharma and Incharge Police Post Phallain Mandal PSI Ajesh Singh Jamwal in their respective jurisdictions.

Trucker nabbed with 1.24 quintal poppy straw

SAMBA: Police on Monday arrested a trucker and recovered approximately 1.24 quintal of poppy straw like substance from vehicle, he was driving. As per details, a party from Police Post Mansar during routine vehicle checking intercepted a truck (JK03B-5420) at Naka Mansar, Samba. During checking, 5 plastic sacks were found filled with Poppy Straw like substance each weighing approximately 20-25 Kg, which were concealed tactfully beneath wooden sawdust. The accused driver identified as Junaid Ahmed Gojer, son of Gulzar Ahmed Gojer, resident of Kleri Doru, Anantnag was arrested on the spot and FIR No. 56/2022 under sections 8/15/25 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Samba. The whole operation was carried out under the supervision of SSP Samba, Dr Abhishek Mahajan.
