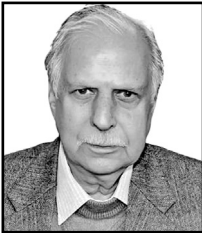

# CRIME REPORT

## Two missing persons traced, reunited with families

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday traced two missing persons and reunited them with their families. As per details, a missing complaint was lodged at Police Post Chinore by legal heirs of a girl stating that she went missing from home. In this regard, a missing report was registered and investigation started, after which a team of Police Post Chinore under supervision of SDPO Domana Sunil Singh led by Incharge Police Post Chinore PSI Amit Roshan, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, traced the missing girl.

Similarly, another missing report was lodged at Police Station Bahu Fort regarding missing of a boy namely Ramesh Chander Sawhney, son of Balkrishan, resident of Adarsh enclave. On this a missing report was lodged and investigation started and a team of Police Station Bahu Fort under supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspr Nayat Ali traced the missing boy. Subsequently, families of both traced persons were informed and they were handed over to them after completing all legal formalities.

## Two absconders arrested

JAMMU: Police on Tuesday nabbed two absconders who were evading their arrests since 12 years and 23 years respectively.

As per details, an information was received at Police Station Bahu Fort through reliable sources regarding two absconders namely Manzoor Ahmed, son of Ghulam Rasool, resident of Gujjar Nagar who was evading his arrest for 12 years i.e., 2010 in FIR No. 222 /2010 registered under sections 341/323 of RPC and Babu Ram, son of Vijay Ram, resident of Kanthan Mahan Reasi evading arrest for 23 years i.e., 1999 in FIR No. 234 /1996 registered under section 379 of RPC. On this, special police teams of Police Station Bahu Fort under supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Inspr Nayat Ali arrested both the accused. It is pertinent to mention that a warrant under section 512 CrPC was issued against Manzoor Ahmed by the Court of Sub Registrar Jammu on October 28, 2010 and a warrant under section 512 CrPC was issued against Babu Ram by Court of City Judge Jammu on Nov 2, 1999. Both absconders shall be produced before the Court for further proceedings.

## Theft case solved; 5 arrested, stolen cows recovered

ARNIA: Police on Tuesday solved a theft case by arresting 5 accused persons and recovered stolen cows on their disclosure.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Arnbia by Vishal Kumar and Saimal Saini, both residents of Arnbia regarding theft of five cows. On this, FIR No 86/2021 under section 380 of IPC was registered and investigation started. A team of Police Station Arnbia under supervision of SDPO R S Pura Surinder Singh led by SHO Arnbia Inspr Tllak Raj rounded up four suspects namely Mohd Kaku, resident of Mangu Chak Chatha; Yasha, resident of Sair Manjla Ramnagar; Sartaj Ali, resident of Sair Manjla Ramnagar and Bashir Ahmed, resident of Chak Botali, Bhadarwah. During questioning, accused confessed their involvement in crime and further disclosed name of another accused namely Khadam Hussain, resident of Sair Manjla Ramnagar. On their disclosure, stolen cows were also recovered.

## 4 vehicles seized for illegal mining

RAJOURI/JAMMU: Continuing its efforts to curb illegal mining in district, the Geology and Mining Department Rajouri has seized two dumpers and an excavator at Rajouri. On directions of District Development Commissioner Rajouri, Vikas Kundal, special teams of the Geology and Mining Department conducted raids at different locations of Thannamadi and Darhal. The teams, under the supervision of the DMO, Mohd Naseeb Bajran, seized two dumpers and an excavator found involved in illegal mining. Meanwhile, a party of Police Post Pul-Doda headed by PSI Anil Kumar Incharge Pul-Doda during routine checking/frisking stopped a Tipper (JK06B-2291) at Pul-Doda for checking. During checking, it was found loaded with sand, which was being illegally taking from Thathri towards Khellani. FIR No. 40/2022 under section 188 of IPC was registered at Police Station Doda against driver identified as Chander Kumar, son of Gian Chand Bhagat, resident of Khellani, who was arrested and vehicle (Tipper) was also seized.

## Two truckers, helper arrested with 94 Kg poppy straw

RAMBAN: Tightening noose over narcotic smugglers under Operation Sanjeevani, police foiled a narcotic smuggling bid at Banihal by arresting three persons and recovered 94 Kg poppy straw from their possession.

As per details, during the routine checking of vehicles at T-Chowk Naka Banihal, a party of Police Station Banihal intercepted a Truck (JK19-2187) for checking. During search of the truck, 90 Kg dry poppy straw like substance was recovered, which was seized. The driver, identified as Irshad Itoo, son of Gh Mohd Itoo, resident of Shiganpora, District Kulgam was arrested and FIR No 44/2022 under sections 8/15 of



NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Banihal.

In a similar incident, during the routine Naka checking of vehicles at Navyuga Tunnel Banihal, the party of Police Post Jawahar Tunnel intercepted a Truck (JK02-AH-0717) for checking. During search, 4 Kg dry Poppy Straw like substance was recovered from cabin of truck. The driver and his associate, identified as Angrez Kumar, son of Dharam Chand, resident of Dirthi, Katra and Kaka Ram, son of Moti Rama, resident of Jajjar Kotli, Tehsil Damsal, were arrested on the spot and FIR No 41/2022 under sections 8/15 of NDPS Act was registered against them at Police Station Banihal. The overall recoveries and arrests were made by police parties led by PSI Gourav Sumbria and PSI Hariish Kumar Incharge Police Post Jawahar Tunnel under supervision of Insp Naem Ul Haq, SHO Banihal and Nissar Ahmad Khoja, SDPO Banihal and under overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

## Major crackdown against bovine smuggling; 106 Cattle rescued; 10 smugglers arrested

JAMMU: In a major crackdown against bovine smugglings, police on Tuesday rescued 106 bovines and arrested 10 smugglers in separate actions.

Acting tough against bovine smugglers, a massive recovery was made by Jammu Police at two Nakas under jurisdictions of Police Stations Jhajjar Kotli & Nagrota where 82 bovines were rescued from five vehicles viz 76 bovines at Suketar Naka and 6 bovine animals at Ban toll plaza Naka.

76 bovines were recovered from three different vehicles (JK03D/7802, JK03C/9009 and JK02BR/9717) at Suketar Naka under jurisdiction of Police Station Jhajjar Kotli. In this regard cognizance has been taken by Police and two accused were arrested, who were identified as Jaguan Shah, son of Mohd Iqbal Shah, resident of Chanahwas, Banihal District Ramban and Altaf Hussain Choker, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of Manzmoh Doorn, Anantnag. The arrests and recoveries were made by SHO Jhajjar Kotli Inspr Devinder Singh.

Similarly, at another Naka by team of Police Station Nagrota at Ban Toll plaza, police teams rescued 6 bovines i.e., 4 from a vehicle (JK19 6947) and 2 from another vehicle (JK19 3224). In this regard two FIRs viz No.98 & 99/2022 under sections 188/34 of IPC 11 of PCA were registered at Police Station Nagrota and 5 accused were arrested, who were identified as Mumtaz Ahmed, son of Pervaiz Ahmed; Mohd Rafiq, son of Abdul Rashid; Saichullah Khan, son of Mangta Khan and Ab Latif, son of Ab Rashid, all resident of Doda and Mohd Iqbal, son of Mirza Ali, resident of Batote. The arrest and recoveries were made by SHO Nagrota Inspr Vishav Pratap Singh. The operation was done under the overall supervision of SDPO Border Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and SP Rural Sanjay Sharma.

Meanwhile, District Police Samba also foiled an attempt to smuggle bovines by rescuing 5 bovines. Acting on information received from reliable sources regarding illegal transportation of bovines, a party of Police Post Rajpura intercepted a Mahindra road carrier (JK08E/9033) near Bein Nallah Khadd, Rajpura. During checking of vehicle, 5 cattle were found laden inside it, which were rescued. The vehicle used for transportation of bovines was also seized on spot. FIR No. 38/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered at Police Station Ghagwal.

Kathua Police under overall supervision of SSP Kathua R C Kotwal also rescued 19 bovines within district, arrested 3 persons and seized two vehicles. In first instance, in wee hours of March 15, 2022 a team led by Insp Amit Sangra SHO Police Station Rajbagh under supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan while on Naka checking duty near NHW Rajbagh intercepted a Truck (JK02CA-2385), driven by one Yaqoob Hussain, son of Mohd Islam, resident of Bagval Dhras Tehsil Haveli District Poonch while his associate was identified as Sharaz Ahmed, son of Mohd Adrees, resident of Gujjar Kothi Tehsil Thakrapur District Reasi. During checking of vehicle, 13 bovines were found loaded, which were rescued. Both accused were arrested and FIR No. 49/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against them. In another instance a police team led by PSI Muzamil Manzoor Incharge Police Post Chadval under the supervision of SDPO Border Pankaj Soodan during Naka checking duty near NHW Chadval noticed a suspicious Load Carrier (JK02AP-9106) which was being driven by one Sher Ali, son of Mohd Sadiq, resident of Dhamu Tehsil Majalta District Udhampur. On thorough checking, 6 bovines were found laden in vehicle which were rescued and accused was arrested. FIR No. 51/2022 under sections 188 of IPC, 11 of PCA Act was registered against him at Police Station Rajbagh.

## Fire erupted at CRPF camp in Sopore

SRINAGAR: A massive fire broke out in a Central Reserve Police Force (CRPF) camp near Iqbal Market in Sopore. As per reports, a fire engulfed building of camp and caused partial damage to it. The cause of fire is being ascertained yet, however, no one was hurt in incident.

## Drug peddler nabbed with Charas

As per details, Katra Police on a tip-off, laid a Naka at Battery Car route and intercepted a suspect, who was on his way to Bhawan. On frisking, 11 Challis of Charas weighing about 215 gm were recovered from him. The accused, identified as Manzoor Ahmed, son of Mohd Tulef, resident of Palel, was arrested and a case under relevant section of law was registered against him.

## Car hits tree; 1 dead, 2 injured

SAMBHA: One person died while two others got injured when the car they were travelling in, hit a tree near Ghagwal area on Tuesday.

As per details, a Verna car which was on its way to Jammu from Kathua, hit a tree near

Sadwari area of Ghagwal due to which a person identified as Manpreet Singh, son of Parmjeet Singh, resident of Dakoh, Punjab died on the spot while two others got injured. They were shifted to hospital and were identified as Anil, son of Dev Bhadur Singh, resident of Damtal and Simranjeet Singh, son of Paramjeet Singh, resident of Dakoh, Punjab.

## Two youth found hanging

JAMMU: Two youth were found hanging on Tuesday.

As per details, Yashpal, son of Ram Chand, resident of Shaheedi Chowk was found hanging in his house and was shifted to hospital by family members where doctors declared him as brought dead.

Meanwhile, some local spotted a man hanging with a tree in village Shekhpora Palota on Rangarh area and informed police. Soon a team rushed to the spot and shifted body to morgue for autopsy. The deceased was identified as Ramesh Chander (35), son of Guru Charan, resident of Shekhporur Palota.

## Thieves loot cash, jewellery on gun-point in broad daylight

JAMMU: In a filmy-style incident, thieves looted cash amount of Rs 1.75 lakh and gold & silver jewellery in broad daylight by pointing gun on a child in a house at Udeywalla.

They pointed gun at her 11 years old child and decamped Rs 1.75 lakh cash and gold ornaments. The woman informed her husband who along with his wife reported the matter to Police, which has registered a case and started investigation.

## Pedestrian killed in mishap

## Idol vandalized in Vijaypur, FIR registered

Meanwhile, Janipur police also registered a case against a man and his wife on complaint of his mother: Complainant has stated that they have beaten her and also damaged an idol placed in home.

## Bootlegger nabbed with 62 bottles of liquor

KISHTWAR: Police on Tuesday nabbed a bootlegger a nabbed with 62 bottles of liquor.

As per details, Kishtwar police on a tip off laid a Naka in the area and intercepted a suspect and recovered 62 bottles of liquor from his possession. The accused, identified as Ram Raj, resident of Chatroo was arrested and a case under relevant section of law was registered against him.

## 3 held for raping woman in Poonch

JAMMU: Three men were arrested for allegedly raping a woman and threatening her with dire consequences in Poonch district, police said on Tuesday.

According to complainant, she was allegedly raped by three persons in an abandoned house at Seri Chowhana in Mandi area last month, a police spokesman said.

He further said the victim had lodged a complaint in Mandi Police Station on March 11, alleging that Gultaj Ahmad, an acquaintance of her, raped her along with two of his friends. She alleged that Ahmad had called her to his place in Seri Chowhana on February 21 to discuss marriage and later took her to an abandoned house nearby. There, Ahmad called two of his neighbours - Ajaz and Shaqueel - and all of them raped her during night, the woman alleged, spokesman added. She further said that when she regained consciousness, the accused threatened to kill her if she told anyone about the incident. A case had been filed against the accused and a further investigation into the matter is on, said spokesman.

## 176 attempts of infiltration in 2 years; 31 terrorists killed, 104 security personnel martyred in J&K

NEW DELHI: The Centre on Tuesday said that 62 security personnel were martyred and 106 were injured in terrorist violence, including encounters during infiltration, in Jammu and Kashmir in 2020, while 42 security personnel were martyred and 117 injured in such incidents in 2021. As many as 176 attempts were made to infiltrate into J&K from across the border in the last two years in which 31 terrorists were killed, Union Minister of State for Home Nityanand Rai said in Lok Sabha on Tuesday.

Rai said the attempts of terrorist infiltration from across the border are mainly in Jammu and Kashmir which has been affected by terrorist violence, sponsored and supported from across the border. According to available information, there were 99 attempts of infiltration in 2020 and 77 in 2021 while 19 terrorists were killed in such infiltration attempts in 2020 and 12 terrorists were killed in 2021 and one was arrested, he said replying to a written question.

The minister said 62 security personnel were martyred and 106 injured in the terrorist violence, including encounters during the infiltration, during 2020, while 42 security personnel were martyred and 117 were injured in 2021 in such incidents.
