**CRIME REPORT****Theft case solved; accused arrested, stolen cash & silver chain recovered****STATE TIMES NEWS**

JAMMU: Police on Wednesday solved a theft case within 24 hours by arresting an accused and recovered stolen cash amounting to Rs 20,300 and silver chain worth Rs 10,000.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Peerimtha by one Aamir Rafiq, son of Mohd Rafiq, resident of Mohalla Dalpatian stating that an amount of Rs 20,000 approximately and a silver chain was stolen by breaking Almirah lock in his house by some unknown person. On this, FIR No. 17/22 under sections 454/380 of IPC was registered and investigation started.

A team of Police Station Peerimtha under supervision of SDPO North Sharad Kalu led by SHO Peerimtha Inspri Zaheer Mushtaq, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages of area, rounded up a suspect namely Deepak Kumar, son of Amit Kumar, resident of Kalka Colony, Bagh-e-Bahu, Jammu. During sustained questioning, the accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure stolen cash and silver chain was recovered.

Fraudster arrested in Srinagar**STATE TIMES NEWS**

SRINAGAR: Police on Wednesday arrested a fraudster involved in collecting money from public on pretext of issuing digital door number plates.

As per details, on March 16, 2022, Police Station Bemina received a written complaint from Project Manager GeoVista Technologies Pvt Limited stating therein that they were assigned task of conducting door to door survey to facilitate digital door numbering plates to individual households in Srinagar. However, it was observed that some fraudsters were collecting Rs 100 from households for issuing digital number plates. He further stated that aforesaid agency has not authorized any individual to collect money as the project is free of cost and the mischief is being done to disrupt their company and Srinagar Smart City Project etc.

On receipt of information, FIR No.13/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Bemina and investigation started. During investigation, police team succeeded in identifying an accused namely Munawar Rashid Khushoo, son of Rashid Ahmad Khushoo, resident of Firdous Colony Bemina, who was arrested. Further investigation in the case is going on and more arrests are expected.

3 gamblers arrested; stake-money recovered**STATE TIMES NEWS**


PULWAMA: Acting tough against social crimes, Police on Thursday arrested 3 gamblers and seized stake-money from their possession.

JAMMU: An accused involved in two murders in Bihar was arrested on Wednesday by Jammu police.

As per details, during patrolling, Gangyal police intercepted a man who turned suspicious on seeing and tried to flee. During sustained questioning, he revealed that he had killed two persons in Bihar in 2021 & 22 and was hiding there in Jammu on fake identity. Later, Bihar police was informed, who came Jammu and took him to Bihar. The accused was identified as Raja Alam, resident of Almara.
