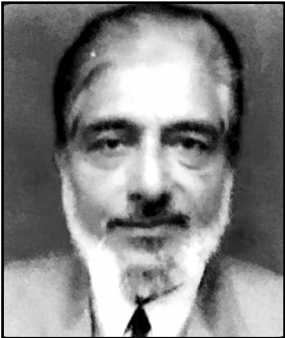

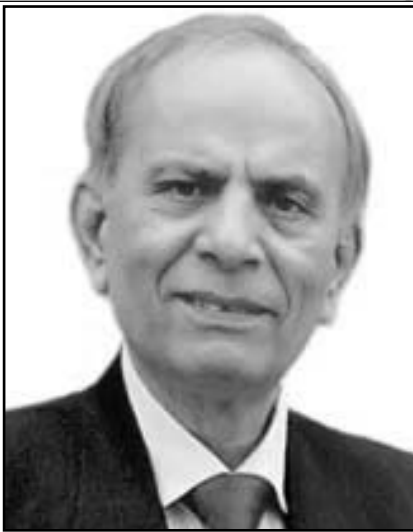
SHRADHANJALI

CRIME REPORT

Fake permission racket unearthed; 4 bovine smugglers arrested

AKHNOOR: Police on Thursday unearthed a fake permission racket by arresting 4 bovine smugglers. As per details, two Mahindra pick-up vehicles (JK11B-2104 & JK11B-4673) carrying four bovines were stopped at Chowki Choura Naka by a police team led by SI Saroop Singh. During checking, the drivers along with other associates produced medical fitness certificate in respect of bovine animals issued by Chief Animal Husbandry Officer, Jammu and permission of ADC Jammu. However, police got suspicious and aforesaid certificates were sent to Deputy Commissioner's office and Chief Animal Husbandry Office Jammu for verification, after which it was intimated by Deputy Commissioner's office and Chief Animal Husbandry Officer Jammu that aforesaid certificates are forged and have not been issued by them.

On this, FIR No. 66/2022 under sections 188/420/465/468/471/120-B of IPC read with 11 of PCA Act was registered and accused namely Javed Iqbal, son of Mohd Ishaq, resident of Badhoon Rajouri; Yasir Hussain, son of Mohd Sharief, resident of Ningnar Rajouri; Asif Hussain, resident of Ghulam Nabi, resident of Rajal Nowshera and Basharat, son of Abdul Hameed, resident of Laha Thannamandi Rajouri were arrested and both vehicles were seized. Arrest and seizure were made under supervision of SHO Akhnoor Hilal Azhar. During further investigation, in came to fore that a well-established organised gang of bovine smugglers are issuing fake medical fitness certificate and permissions. Further arrests and recovery are expected and involvement of any Government official is also being ascertained. The investigation is being conducted under supervision of SDPO Akhnoor Varun Jandial and SP Rural Sanjay and overall guidance of SSP Jammu Chandan Kohli.

3 drug peddlers arrested; contraband recovered

PULWAMA: Continuing its efforts to eradicate menace of drugs, Police on Thursday arrested three drug peddlers in Pulwama and recovered contraband substances from their possession.

As per details, officers from Police Station Pulwama at a checkpoint established at Pinglena intercepted a vehicle (Truck) bearing registration number PB06M-2585 with three persons onboard, who were identified as Jeet Masih, son of Munshi Masih, Mandeep Singh, son of Kashmir Singh and Gurminder Kumar, son of Chanchal Nath, all residents of Gurdaspur (Punjab). During search, 4.5 Kg poppy straw was recovered from their possession. The accused were arrested and shifted to police station where they remained in custody. Accordingly, FIR No. 57/2022 under relevant sections of law was registered at Police Station Pulwama and further investigation started.

Woman's mysterious death: Husband, brother-in-law arrested

RAJOURI: Working out a case regarding mysterious death of a woman in Handan village of Nowshera of Rajouri, police has converted inquest proceedings into a FIR under sections 306, 34 of IPC and arrested her husband as well as brother-in-law.

In an official statement, SSP Rajouri Mohammad Aslam said that on March 12 at around 05:30 PM, an information was received at Police Station Nowshera that a woman namely Sumita Devi (35), wife of Karanjeet Kumar, resident of Mora Patli, Chowki Handan, village Nowshera was found hanging in her house and died, after which inquest proceedings vide DDR No 15, dated March 12, 22 was initiated and post mortem of deceased was conducted through a board of doctors. SSP further said that a special investigation team led by Additional SP Nowshera Amit Verma along with Sub Divisional Police Officer Nowshera Tusif Rishu and Station House Officer Nowshera Rajesh Jasrotia was framed which during investigation, managed to develop some evidences bringing out criminal act of few accused. "Based on this, the instant inquest has been converted into criminal case and FIR No. 35 /2022 under section 306/34 of IPC was registered at police station Nowshera," SSP Rajouri Mohammad Aslam said. He said that during course of investigation, two accused namely Karanjeet Kumar (husband of victim) and Jatinder Kumar (brother-in-law of victim), both sons of Raj Kumar, were arrested. Further investigation into the case is going on, he added.

Two minor abducted girls rescued; 2 accused arrested

SAMBA: Police on Thursday successfully rescued two kidnapped girls and arrested accused persons. As per details, on Feb 28, 2022, a missing report was lodged at Police Station Ghagval by father of missing girl, a resident of village Raghu Chak, Rajpura, stating therein that his daughter went missing from home. Acting on complaint, FIR No. 34/2022 under sections 366/109 of IPC was registered and search was launched to recover her. With strenuous efforts coupled with technical assistance, a team of Police Station Ghagval recovered the kidnapped girl along with kidnapper from Pathankot, Punjab. Both were brought to Police Station Ghagval and after completing all legal formalities, she was handed over to family.

Ramban Police also rescued minor kidnapped girl and arrested accused. On 3rd March, 2022, a resident of Sanasar, Batote lodged a written complaint at Police Post Patnitop stating that his daughter, age 17 years, went missing while she had gone to her school HSS Sanasar. Since girl was minor, cognizance was taken immediately and FIR under section 363 of IPC was registered in Police Station Batote.

In order to find out missing girl, special search team of Police Post Patnitop was constituted. After putting in strenuous efforts, the party got a clue about whereabouts of girl. The police party immediately rushed to the spot and recovered the missing girl. Pertinent to mention here that she was kidnapped by one Ranjeet Singh, son of Balwant Singh, resident of Nagrota Jammu, who was also arrested by the Police. The overall operation was executed by a police party led by PSI Vinod Saini Incharge Police Post Patnitop under supervision of Insp Sudhir Sadotra, SHO Batote and Pardeep Singh Sen, DySP Hqrs

Ramban with overall supervision of Mohita Sharma, SSP Ramban.

2 theft cases worked out; 2 arrested, stolen property recovered

DODA: Police on Thursday worked out 2 theft cases within 24 hrs by arresting two thieves and recovered stolen property.

Doda Police said that it worked out two theft cases in 24 hrs after registration of FIRs. It was informed that on complaint of one Arif Sajad (site Incharge Ms R K Gupta & Co) regarding theft of crash barriers, which were installed at various places on road in Bhalla area, FIR No. 27/2022 under section 379 of IPC was registered at Police Station Bhadarwah. Acting swiftly, a team led by SI Ankush Sharma Incharge Police Post Bhalla swung into action and after getting some clues through reliable sources, nabbed one Mohd Sharif Mir, son of Rehamtulla Mir, resident of Shiva Doda. During questioning the accused admitted his involvement in the theft and on his disclosure stolen property was recovered within 24 hrs.

Moreover, in FIR No. 30/2022, registered under section 379 of IPC at Police Station Bhadarwah on written complaint of a Junior Engineer of STD Bhadarwah regarding theft of HT Poles and Rail Poles from Bhalla, a team led by PSI Ankush Sharma was constituted and during investigation, one Mohd Yousuf, son of Gh Mustafa, resident of Bhella, Tehsil Thathri was rounded up. During questioning, he confessed his crime and on his disclosure, stolen Government property was recovered. Further investigation of the case is going on. The recovery of stolen property and arrests were made by a party of Police Post Bhalla under supervision of Insp Jatinder Singh Rakwal SHO Police Station Bhadarwah, Abdul Ghafoor SDPO Bhadarwah under overall supervision Mohd Aftab, Addl SP Bhadarwah.

Woman among three arrested, illicit liquor recovered

DODA: In a massive drive against illegal sale and manufacturing of illicit liquor in Bhadarwah area, police arrested three persons including a woman and recovered illicit liquor from their possession. Doda Police said that it conducted raids at various places and recovered illicit liquor and Lahan in huge quantity from different places. It was informed that 3 FIRs were registered at Police Station Bhadarwah, following recovery of huge quantity of illicit liquor and Lahan from different places in Bhadarwah area.

In FIR No 32/2022 registered under section 48(e) of Excise Act, 4 lts illicit liquor and 40 lts Lahan was recovered from possession of one Suman Devi, wife of Walayat Chand, resident of Jananah, Bhadarwah. In FIR No. 33/2022 registered under section 48(e) of Excise Act, 4 lts illicit liquor and 100 lts Lahan was recovered from one Shadi Lal, son of Amar Chand, resident of Kodsu, Bhadarwah while in FIR No. 35/2022 registered under section 48(e) Excise Act, 8 quarters of liquor were recovered from one Pardeep Singh, son of Bheli Ram, resident of Chilli, Tehsil Bhalla at present Seri Bhadarwah. All the accused persons were arrested on spot and investigation of cases was initiated. The raids at different places were conducted by Bhadarwah Police under supervision of Insp Jatinder Singh Rakwal SHO Bhadarwah, Abdul Ghafoor SDPO Bhadarwah and overall supervision of Aftab Ahmed Addl SP Bhadarwah.

Major untoward incident averted; four arrested with weapons

JAMMU: Police on Thursday averted a major untoward incident by arresting four accused with weapons from R S Pura & Gandhi Nagar area. Giving details SSP Jammu Chandan Kohli said that several Nakas were laid by police teams of Police Station R S Pura constituted under supervision of SDPO Surinder Singh. The team led by SHO R S Pura Insp



Jai Pal Sharma during Naka checking at Chakrohi Naka rounded up a suspect namely Sumit Gondhi alias Kahu, son of Om Parkash Gondi, resident of Peer Mitha Tehsil and district Jammu. During search, a Desi Katta (pistol) along with 2 live rounds was recovered from his possession. Similarly at another Naka at Baspur, police team rounded up a suspect namely Pritam Singh alias Sethi, son of Mohan Singh, resident of Jerda Tehsil Ramgarh, District Samba.

During search, a pistol was recovered from him. The recoveries were made under overall supervision of SP Hqrs Ramnish Gupta. Two FIRs vide No 40/2022 under section 3/25 of A Act and No 42 /2022 under section 3/25 of A Act respectively were lodged at Police Station R S Pura and investigation started. SSP Jammu further said that during further questioning of accused namely Sumit Gondhi alias Kahu, he revealed about his other accomplices in Gandhi Nagar area, after which a special police team of Police Station Gandhi Nagar under supervision of SDPO South Sachit Sharma was constituted. The team led by SHO Gandhi Nagar Insp Pankaj Sharma, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of various inputs, rounded up two accused namely Vivek Sharma alias Pinu, son of Ram Rattan, resident of Peer Mitha Jammu and Rocky Kumar alias Billa, son of Ashok Kumar, resident of Gagian Tehsil R S Pura. During search, 2 pistols and 13 live rounds i.e., a pistol and 7 live rounds from Vivek Kumar and a pistol and 6 live rounds from Rocky Kumar were recovered. The recoveries were made under overall supervision of SP South Mamta Sharma. They were arrested and FIR No. 62/2022 under sections 3/25 of Arms Act was registered against them at Police Station Gandhi Nagar.

ATM fraudster arrested, duped money along with 5 ATM cards recovered

JAMMU: Police on Thursday arrested an ATM fraudster and recovered duped money

along with 5 ATM cards from his possession.

As per details, a complaint was lodged at Police Station Bahu Fort by one Ghulam Nabi Wani, resident of Gool stating that he was cheated by some unknown person, who swapped his ATM card and withdrew an amount of Rs 40,000 from his account. On this, FIR under relevant sections was registered and investigation started. A team of Police Station Bahu Fort under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari led by SHO Bahu Fort Insp Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Bathindi PSI Mohd Younis Khanday, after putting in strenuous efforts and with help of CCTV footages, rounded up a suspect namely Mohd Shabir alias Shabbu, son of Zakir Hussain, resident of Hyatpura Mangnar of Poonch. During sustained questioning, accused confessed his involvement in crime and on his disclosure an amount of Rs 30,000 along with 5 ATM cards were recovered.

Drug peddler nabbed with 147 gm Charas

JAMMU: Continuing its drive against drug trafficking and substance abuse, Police on Thursday recovered 147 gm Charas from an accused near Narwal area.

As per details, a team from Police Post Narwal constituted under the supervision of SDPO East Syed Zaheer Abbas Jafari and led by SHO Bahu Fort Insp Nayat Ali assisted by Incharge Police Post Narwal SI Achal Rana while on Naka duty at Transport Nagar Narwal, rounded-up a suspect and on search, recovered 147 gm Charas from him. The accused, identified as Asif Zaman, son of Ghulam Mohammad, resident of Tungali, Tehsil Gool District Ramban was arrested and FIR No. 84/22 under sections 8/20 of NDPS Act was registered against him at Police Station Bahu Fort.

Four vehicles seized for illegal mining

JAMMU: In a quest to stern menace of illegal mining, a multi-pronged strategy was devised by Jammu Police in which police teams made a massive recovery of vehicles involved in illegal mining. The teams from Police Posts Sainik Colony and Chatta acted stringently on specific inputs, raided at different locations in their respective areas and seized 4 vehicles involved in illegal mining. The seized vehicles included a Tipper (JK21D 7607) and a dumper (JK21H 2457) seized by Sainik Colony police and 2 dumpers (JK02CR7307 and JK21D 4532) seized by Chatta police. The overall recoveries were made by Incharge Police Post Sainik Colony SI Bhawani Singh and Incharge Police Post Chatta SI Arun Kumar Shan in their respective jurisdictions.

Two bootleggers arrested; 51 bottles of illicit liquor recovered

JAMMU: In an act of alertness and prompt action, Nagrota police has recovered 51 bottles of illicit liquor from two bootleggers.

As per details, a party from Police Station Nagrota constituted by SDPO Nagrota Pardeep Kumar and led by SHO Nagrota Insp Vishav Pratap Singh while on Naka duty at Toll Post Nagrota area rounded up two suspects, travelling in a vehicle (JK06A-0169). During search, 51 bottles of illicit liquor i.e., 50 bottles of 180 ml and a bottle of 250 ml of JK Special Whiskey were recovered from them.

Duo was arrested and FIR No. 106/2022 under section 48(a) of Excise Act was registered against them at Police Station Nagrota. The accused, identified as Romey Qarashi, son of Mohd Ashraf Qarashi, resident of Assar Jathi, District Doda at present Kargil Colony, Bathindi and pillion-rider Ashwani Sharma, son of Pitamber Lal Sharma, resident of Peer Mitha Jammu, were arrested on the spot.

Three booked for encroaching JDA land

JAMMU: Police on Thursday booked three persons for encroaching JDA land at Nagrota. As per details, a team of JDA during demarcation in Majin area found that Shabir Ahmed, resident of Shopian; Bashir Ahmed, resident of Baramulla and Asif Rasool, resident of Doda have encroached JDA land and directed them to vacate same but they didn't listen to them. Later Tehsildar JDA lodged a complaint with police, which has lodged FIR against trio.

Two arrested with heroin

As per details, Hiranagar Police on a tip off laid a Naka and intercepted a suspect. During frisking, 18 gm heroin was recovered from his possession. The accused, identified as Sumit Khajuria, resident of Dayalachak, was arrested and a case was registered against him.

Meanwhile, Digiana Police also arrested a drug peddler and recovered 3 gm heroin from his possession. The accused was identified as Manjot Singh, resident of Chak Mohd Yaar.
