The love and respect earned by the CRPF, the country's largest paramilitary force, is due to the sacrifices, dedication and devotion of its personnel, Shah said.

"Whether it is naxal-infested regions of central India, Pakistan-sponsored terrorism in Kashmir or extremist forces in the northeast, the CRPF has played a key role in the elimination of such groups and restoring peace in all the three regions, Shah said. Shah said the CRPF has played an appreciable role across the country and asserted that there will be no need for redeployment of CRPF in the three regions in the next few years.

"I am sure that we will be able to restore peace and if it happens, the credit will go to the CRPF jawans. I am saying it with confidence that ever since Prime Minister Narendra Modi took over, the work done by CRPF is self-explanatory," he said.

There was a time in the 1990s when extremism in the northeast and Pakistan-sponsored terrorism in Kashmir was at its peak and everyone in the country was concerned.

Within two decades, the CRPF with its dedication, devotion and determination fought the battle against the anti-national forces who are now on the verge of extinction," he said.

AB PMJAY SEHAT: Proving miraculous towards ensuring free medicare to numerous hapless poor, needy

JAMMU: Ayushman Bharat Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (AB-PMJAY) scheme has emerged as a ray of hope for numerous poor families who cannot afford health treatment at prestigious and premier medical institutes of the country.

The Jammu and Kashmir administration, in its endeavor to provide optimum benefit of this miraculous healthcare scheme to people of Jammu and Kashmir, launched the SEHAT scheme in convergence with AB-PMJAY by Prime Minister, Narendra Modi.

J&K government's efforts supported by central government have done a commendable job in providing succour to all sections of the society through a network of innovative and people friendly programmes launched in the UT. Jammu and Kashmir being demographically disadvantaged and inaccessible location received focused attention of both the governments in welfare and development of people here.

Pankaj Kumar, a 26 year old youth, who since his

childhood had been working in the fields of his fellow villagers to feed his family, feels privileged to narrate his tale of struggle in getting his leg surgery done free of cost through AB PMJAY Sehat scheme.

Narrating his ordeals, Kumar recalled that how distressed and hapless he was when he got his leg broken while working in his house to repair the wall of his courtyard. "I was extremely shattered after this accident and was more than worried about my old parents; who will look after them now," Kumar said. "Doctors asked my family to arrange money for surgery of my leg. I knew we had no savings and it was beyond my reach to meet the expenses for my treatment", Kumar added.

Then, I came to know about Pradhan Mantri Jan Arogya Yojana (PMJAY) scheme through one of my neighbors which came as a ray of hope for the whole family making an end to our woes.

After completing all the requisite formalities, a golden card was issued in my favour and I had my surgery under PMAY SEHAT card

free of cost. "It was not less than a miracle, SEHAT card helped us a lot, as our financial condition was not good and my treatment was almost impossible without this scheme," he maintained while expressing gratitude to Center and UT government

for launching this poor friendly scheme.

As per official figures around 29 Lakh beneficiaries have been registered so far in Jammu division. The Health Department has expedited the registration process as the Lieutenant Governor of J&K, Manoj Sinha has set the deadline for March 31, 2022 for completing the registration process.

It is pertinent to mention here that Ayushman Bharat, a flagship scheme of the Government of India, was launched as recommended by the National Health Policy 2017, to achieve the vision of Universal Health Coverage (UHC). This initiative has been designed to meet Sustainable

Development Goals (SDGs) and its underlying commitment, which is to "leave no one behind." The main aim behind the scheme is to extend health insurance coverage to all residents of Jammu and Kashmir.

The SEHAT scheme pro-

vides health insurance cover of Rs 5 lakh per family per year to all the residents at empanelled hospitals. The scheme covers medical procedures including oncology, cardiology, nephrology etc and covers up to three days of pre-hospitalization and fifteen days post-hospitalization expenses including diagnostics and medicines.

In yet another pro-people initiative, the State Health Agency (SHA) started an initiative 'Gaon Gaon Ayushman' to reach out to even last mile villages which remain cut from the rest of the world due to adverse weather conditions so as to percolate the benefits of the scheme down to every beneficiary.

Govt closes inquiry...

It added, "a preliminary inquiry was got conducted by the DGP, J&K, which established sheer negligence and culpability on the part of the delinquent officer. Accordingly, vide communication bearing No. Legal/GB-57/2017/85870-71 dated November 29, 2017, the DGP, J&K recommended initiation of departmental action against the delinquent officer."

Accordingly, as contemplated under Rule 33 of the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1956, vide Government Order No.1661-Home of 2018 dated December 13, 2018, Vivek Gupta, IPS, the then I/C DIG, JSK Range was appointed as an Inquiry Officer for conducting an inquiry into the charges levelled against the delinquent officer.

"The Inquiry Officer submitted his report on November 30, 2019 and concluded that the charges levelled against Tabassum Parveen (now retired), the then Dy:SP Crime Branch Jammu, (I/O of the case), were substantiated. The report of the inquiry officer was examined, with reference to the facts of the case, evidence brought on record and conclusions drawn by the inquiry officer. The matter was, accordingly, placed before the Competent Authority along with all the material for a decision," it added,

"Now, therefore, the report submitted by the inquiry officer in pursuance of Government Order No. 1661-Home of 2018 dated 13.12.2018, is accepted and the inquiry ordered against Tabassum Parveen, the then DySP Crime Branch Jammu, (Now retired SP), is closed and a penalty equivalent to 'Fine of one month's pay' (calculated as per last pay drawn), as provided under clause(ii) of Rule 30 of the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Services (Classification, Control and Appeal) Rules, 1956 read with Article 168-A of the Jammu and Kashmir Civil Service Regulations, 1956, is imposed on the delinquent officer; which shall be deducted from her pension." it added.

Pooja's husband -- selection grade constable Rohit Kumar --laid down his life during an anti-terrorist operation in village Sehpora-Pariwan in Kulgam district on January 12. The encounter resulted in the elimination of a dreaded Pakistani terrorist Babar. Ifra is the daughter of head constable Mohammad Yaqoob Shah, who was martyred in a terrorist attack on a police vehicle on August 13, 2014 at Galander-Pampore in Pulwama. Aabid is son of constable Bashir Ahmad Sheikh who martyred in a terrorist attack on a police party at Rabitar bridge in Ganderbal on the intervening night of January 29-30, 2000.

Mohsin is the son of follower Mushtaq Ahmad who lost his life in a cross-fire between terrorists and a BSF patrolling party at Kunan in Bandipora district on May 9, 1993. In retaliatory action, one terrorist was also killed.

J&K Lieutenant Governor Manoj Sinha, Union minister Jitendra Singh and Director General of Police Dilbag Singh were present on the occasion, the spokesman said.

Interacting with the families, Shah said the entire nation is proud of the courage and commitment shown by these brave security personnel of Jammu and Kashmir Police.

Shah, during his last visit to Jammu and Kashmir in October, 2021, had visited the house of martyr Inspector Pervaiz Ahmad Dar in Srinagar. He had also handed over an appointment letter to the wife of slain Inspector Arshad Khan in 2019.

the officials said. Zojila is a strategic pass that provides a vital link between the Kashmir valley and Ladakh, and it is key to operational preparedness of the armed forces. It remains closed mostly for about six months due to heavy snowfall. This year, it was cleared off in record time, they said.

"This pass remains closed mostly for about six months. But last year, we decided to keep it closed for a minimum period of time. We kept it closed for about 110 days only last year and there were many benefits. This year, we re-opened the road in 73 days," Lt Gen Chaudhary told reporters here.

He said the highway was kept open till January 4 this year, after which it was closed for traffic following heavy snowfall.

"It has now been re-opened in record time. This is a huge achievement and both Project Beacon, which manages the highway in J-K, and Project Vijayak, which manages it in Ladakh UT, have done it," he said.

The BRO DG said re-opening the highway sooner has many advantages strategically as well as from the socio-economic angle.

"From the strategic point of view, maintenance, including ammunition, logistics or anything else, for our troops deployed in Ladakh will reach in time now. It will also expedite the transportation of fresh vegetables, medicines etc to the people of Ladakh. This will increase trade and commerce there, and people are very happy," he said. Lt Gen Chaudhary said a study found that the government can save around Rs 7 crore per day by opening the road sooner.

"We saved about Rs 400 crore -- the money spent on air transportation -- by reopening the road sooner," he added.

A defence spokesperson said snow clearance operations on the highway recommenced on February 15 by projects Beacon and Vijayak of the BRO.

After sustained efforts, the connectivity across Zojila Pass was initially established on March 3, and after that, improvement of road surface was carried out for safe passage of vehicles, he said.

Singh also acknowledged inaccessibility to marshlands in Gujarat and the challenge they pose, but spoke of measures the force has taken to counteract the difficulties.

We are up to the mark there as well. We are equipped with necessary gadgets and other equipment, like fast speed-boats and floating border outposts. We are maintaining very good surveillance.

The DG BSF also attended a security review meeting chaired by home minister Amit Shah here.

Asked about the possibility of an increase in infiltration attempts with the melting of snow, he said we will not allow any wrongdoing.

Our jawans are absolutely alert with all the sophisticated equipment and gadgets to respond effectively to the enemies of the nation, he said in his message to the soldiers.

R&B expedites snow clearance on Bhadarwah-Chamba road

BHADARWAH: To revive tourism by opening roads towards tourist destinations, R&B Department Bhadarwah expedites snow clearance work on Bhadarwah-Chamba road, to open it for visitors by end of March.

In order to revive the tourism industry which suffered due to coronavirus pandemic since last 2 years, authorities have expedited the snow clearance work on interstate Bhadarwah-Chamba road by setting a deadline to reopen it by the end of March.

R&B, Bhadarwah-Chamba(BC) division have deployed extra men and machinery to clear the snow from the interstate highway

to prepone the opening of road by the end of March, which otherwise was made accessible for visitors around mid April every year.

As Bhadarwah Development Authority (BDA) failed to initiate the process to restore tourism activities in Bhadarwah, Administration and R&B Deptt took the initiative with a view to revive the tourism industry after seeing encouraging foothall of the tourists from as early as February in Bhadarwah Valley after heavy snowfall.

Rizwan Wani, JE R&B BC Division Bhadarwah, said that we have started snow clearance since last month and we are trying to get it open till the end of this month.
