191 Govt school teachers submit research papers from 26 states

JAMMU: CONVOKE 2021-22, a national research symposium organized in collaboration with NITI Aayog and Bharti Foundation, the philanthropic arm of Bharti Enterprises, to encourage teachers and head teachers from Government schools to write research papers.
