J&K at a...

Modi became the prime minister; a new era of friendship started between India and the UAE.

I think, it is for the first time that India's head of state has twice or thrice visited the UAE and created a new environment of cooperation, Sinha said.

The J-K LG said during the Dubai Expo in January, the J-K administration interacted with many businessmen and invited them to visit J-K so that they could see with their own eyes and explore the investments here.

We interacted today and specified several issues and areas. We have identified their concerns and we have assured them that their redressal will be done in a minimum time period especially in the hospital and medical education, real estate, hospitality, food processing cold storages and cold chains, and education, he said.

Sinha said the delegates were very important people as many of them were CEOs of big companies.

The discussions have been very good. We will now try to take it to the conclusion very soon, he added.

He said the administration has taken steps which have started to show results.

I think it will result in increase in the business and employment generation. The industries and commerce department has made several efforts to take J-K's horticulture produce, handicrafts and crafts across the world. I am sure we will get huge success in this sector as well. The UT is at a transformative stage where prosperity will come, employment opportunities will come, and people will live in a peaceful coexistence, Sinha said.

Talking about the fast-paced socio-economic transformations taking place in J&K, the Lt Governor, while addressing the conference, said that the government embarked on several major initiatives in developing physical and social infrastructure and some of these initiatives are the biggest ever since the country's independence in 1947.

The development of the power sector, trade, horticulture, rural infrastructure, roads and air links, medical education and health services, Industrial Training Institutes, Information Technology and storage facilities for the produce are the diverse areas that have been addressed, the Lt Governor added.

The Lt Governor said that the sector-specific Industrial Estates and Industrial Parks are being promoted in a focused manner, besides launching a Single Window Portal as the one-stop solution for attaining all the approvals and permissions in a time bound manner.

'So far about 130 services are active on our single-window portal. We have also coordinated with various departments towards minimizing regulatory compliance burden over the businesses by eradicating redundant compliances, streamlining the processes for ease of doing business in the UT', he added.

Later, taking to Twitter, Sinha said during his address at the summit, he highlighted the scope for J-K and GCC companies' economic cooperation to make the "paradise on earth" as the most beautiful investment destination in the world.

The visit of CEOs of top companies, entrepreneurs, start-up representatives, exporters in J&K is an expression of confidence of the industry leaders in the potential for business cooperation between J&K and Gulf countries, he said in a series of tweets.

The LG said India's relationship with Gulf countries is being translated into a vibrant, revitalized economic partnership with J-K that will not only diversify our export basket but will also create a conducive environment for expansion of the existing trade.

We have worked with a coherent framework in last 2 yrs to harness immense natural resources, economic potential of J&K. Under guidance of PM Narendra Modi and HM Amit Shah, we've also worked out a blueprint to unlock investment flows from compliance & restrictions, he said.

We promise to provide global standard end-to-end facilities for the businesses, skilled workforce, transparent and hassle-free regulatory mechanism and creation of necessary infrastructure wherever required, Sinha said.

He said since the Dubai Expo visit, many foreign companies from UAE have announced long-term plans for J-K. We are ready to take relationship to a qualitative new level and strengthen our economic partnership.

Police constable martyred...

martyr, a wreath laying ceremony led by DGP Dilbag Singh was held at DPL Srinagar, where floral tributes were paid to the martyr: Special DGP CID RR Swain, IGP Kashmir Vijay Kumar, IG (Ops) CRPF MS Bhatia, DIG CRK Sujit Kumar IPS, SSP Srinagar; SSP PCR Kashmir; besides, other officers and officials and family members of the martyr also laid floral wreaths on the mortal remains and paid rich tributes to the martyr for his supreme sacrifice made in the line of duty.

"My heart goes out to his family and loved ones. The cycle of violence is despicable and serves no cause. It only leaves behind inevitable loss and adds to our sufferings" Altaf Bukhari, President Apni Party, also wrote on Twitter while expressing heartfelt condolences on martyrdom of a policeman Imran Ahmad.

In a statement to the press, Bukhari said the conflict has claimed so many lives till date all across the region and this cycle of violence needs to stop.

"I unequivocally condemn this attack while at the same time sending my heartfelt condolences to the families of the deceased. I urge the government to take precautionary measures to save innocent lives on duty. I hope that the perpetrators of the crime are punished at the earliest," he said.

Meanwhile, three people were arrested in connection with a grenade throwing incident in Shopian district, police said.

Police based on reliable sources picked up one suspect, identified as Fazil-bin-Rashid, a resident of Melhura in Shopian, in connection with the incident, a police spokesman said.

During questioning, Rashid disclosed that he was working with one active terrorist namely Basit Ahmed of Frisal Kulgam who was linked with proscribed terror outfit LeT (TRP). On his instructions, he threw a grenade at Babapora camp of CRPF on March 19 in which one CRPF Jawan was injured, he said.

The spokesman said Rashid disclosed that he lobbed the grenade as a task given by Ahmed in order to join terrorist ranks.

During further questioning, he disclosed the name of another accused person, identified as Qaiser Zahoor Khan, Nowpora Safakadal, Srinagar. On Khan's disclosure, incriminating material, arms and ammunition including three Chinese pistols, six magazines, four grenades and 30 rounds were recovered, he said.

All the three accused persons involved in the terror crime have been arrested and further investigation is on, the spokesman added.

The DGP was talking to reporters after handing over keys of motorcycles and scooters to policemen and policewomen for undertaking patrolling along the borderline in Jammu, Samba and Kathua district, besides in the city.

another question on launch pads and infrastructure built across the border; Pramila said the government regularly reviews the security situation along the LoC and takes precautionary measures for thwarting any move by threat elements including the terrorists.

"However, information sought being a sensitive operational matter concerning national security, cannot be divulged in the interest of national security," he added.

Replying to a question about use of drones for delivery of ammunition by terrorists along the international border, Pramila said the border guarding forces are well equipped to neutralise threats emanating from misuse of drones by rogue elements including terrorists.

"An incident of use of drone to deliver ammunition was noticed and the drone was neutralised in Punjab along Indo-Pakistan border in 2022," he said and added that anti-drone systems have been deployed along the border to tackle such situations.

In addition, border guarding forces have taken various preventive as well as precautionary measures to counter drones which include framing of standard operating procedures for countering drone, adequate deployment of troops and patrolling, and deployment of surveillance equipment.

COVID regulation for...

from October 18, 2021, and has now decided to recommence scheduled international flight operations from March 27, 2022, "in view of the declining COVID-19 cases, high level of vaccinations and prevailing COVID-19 situation".

The requirement of complete PPE kit for crew member stands removed, the MoCA stated.

"However, use of face mask and maintenance of hand hygiene/sanitiser continue to be mandatory," it added.

The pat-down search by security personnel at airports is reintroduced, wherever needed, as per directions of the Bureau of Civil Aviation Security, the MoCA noted.

"During the process, the security personnel must wear N-95 mask and sanitise hands after each pat-down search, besides following regular COVID-19 protocols," it mentioned.

India reported a single-day rise of 1,581 fresh COVID-19 cases, taking the infection tally to 4,30,10,971, while the active cases further declined to 23,913, the Union Health Ministry said on Tuesday.

The death toll has climbed to 5,16,543, with 33 daily fatalities, the ministry data updated at 8 am stated.

Farooq Abdullah terms...

terrorists but unfortunately, there were no takers in the government in Delhi. Everyone knows whose government was at the Centre who had extended the outside support," Abdullah, who is the Lok Sabha member from Srinagar parliamentary constituency, said.

The former chief minister alleged the movie is "pure propaganda" and was being deliberately hyped by people with vested interests to polarise the nation. "The movie is far away from reality and it is only to polarise the nation and let me tell the nation today that it is not a healthy development," he said.

Abdullah said his son Omar Abdullah, who has also been the chief minister of the erstwhile state, had been advocating the setting up of a Truth and Reconciliation Commission from the day he took over the office.

"Let us have it now. Get an honest person to head the Commission and let us investigate each and everything and after that, if I am guilty, the law will take care. Farooq Abdullah does not believe in fooling people," an agitated Abdullah said.

He said that his party has been demonised by the filmmakers for failing to protect the Kashmiri pandits. "But unfortunately, the facts speak the other way round. It was my Lok Sabha MP Pyare Lal Handoo who raised the issue of Kashmiri pandits in Lok Sabha. The debate is very much preserved in the Parliament library.

"It was my government that brought an Act in 1997 The Jammu and Kashmir Migrant Immovable Property (Preservation, protection and Restraint on distress sales). We meant business and not propaganda," he said.

The former chief minister also highlighted that it was his government that had opposed the release of three dreaded terrorists in 1999 in exchange of passengers of hijacked Indian Airline plane during the tenure of the BJP government led by Atal Bihari Vajpayee.

"There were no takers whenever I objected rightfully," Abdullah said, adding "the immediate repercussion of the wrong decision was that we saw an attack on Jammu and Kashmir assembly and later on Parliament".

Abdullah said that he is not ready to take the blame for others' misdeeds.

LG visits SMHS....

asserted that the government is determined to eliminate terrorism and perpetrators of despicable terror attacks will be brought to justice soon.

Earlier, Principal, GMC Srinagar, Prof. Samia Rashid briefed the Lt Governor about the condition of the injured and the healthcare facilities being provided by the hospital.

The Lieutenant Governor was accompanied by Divisional Commissioner Kashmir, Pandurang K. Pole; Deputy Commissioner Srinagar; Mohammad Ajaz; Medical Superintendent SMHS hospital, Kanwaljeet Singh and other senior officers of the health department.

Union Territory to look for opportunities to invest in real estate, telecommunications, agriculture etc., he added.

"This is a major change after the BJP removed Article 370," Naqvi said, adding, "Kashmir is now on the path of progress and prosperity."

He said the Kashmiri people were never against India's Constitution, but a handful of families indulging in dynastic politics were protecting Article 370.

"This dynastic politics and the legacy of dishonesty have been finished and as a result, Kashmir has a very positive and constructive environment today. Representatives from the Gulf are visiting the region now," Naqvi said.

Seven new medical colleges, five nursing colleges and an AIIMS are being set up in the Union Territory, he said, adding that people are getting electricity and tap water at their doorstep under schemes such as Har Ghar Nal Yojana.

"People are realising that they have come out of a labyrinth of terrorism," Naqvi said, adding that dynastic politics was playing an important role in strengthening the labyrinth.

Praising Finance Minister Nirmala Sitharaman, he said through the budget, the Centre is trying to extend benefits to Kashmiris.

On the remarks of some Opposition members that Parliament is discussing the budget of the Union Territory instead of the Jammu and Kashmir Assembly, Naqvi said, "Earlier also, the budget was for Jammu and Kashmir but the money used to go from the Centre. This is not a new thing, whether it was your government or ours."

Moreover; earlier; the money sent by the Centre could never be audited because of Article 370, he pointed out.

"That robbery was 100 per cent exempted," he said.

Naqvi said improving the situation of the people of Jammu and Kashmir is a collective responsibility.

"We all want the people of Jammu, Kashmir, Kargil and Leh to flow in the stream of progress and this has to be strengthened," he said.

Fauzia Khan of the Nationalist Congress Party (NCP) hoped for the rehabilitation of Kashmiri Pandits.

"Some concrete action should take place on this front," she said.

Khan also raised the issue of unemployment and said at the time of the District Development Council (DDC) polls, 70,000 jobs were promised.

"However; as on February 2, the rate of unemployment in Jammu and Kashmir was 15 per cent, which is much higher than the average of 6.5 to 7 per cent in the rest of the country," she said.

In the budget, there is a provision of Rs 23,060 crore for the social sector, of which 0.47 per cent is earmarked for labour and employment.

"What is the status of the promised jobs and what are the special interventions?" Khan asked.

Rajni Ashokrao Patil of the Congress said Article 370 was abrogated on August 5, 2019 and the statehood of Jammu and Kashmir taken away, but even after three years and seven months, the situation there is not normal.

Citing a report on the economy of Jammu and Kashmir after the abrogation of Article 370, she said after some months, the Union Territory had lost Rs 178.78 billion and 90,000 jobs in the handicraft and tourism sector. The horticulture sector is in distress and tourism is in shambles. Moreover, the rural economy of Jammu and Kashmir is witnessing a decline for the first time in 70 years, she pointed out.

While Sudhantha Trivedi of the BJP said Kashmir was always projected and protected by the Opposition parties as a model of secularism, eventually, it had become a challenge to nationalism.

In 1976, when the word "secularism" was inserted into the Constitution through the 42nd amendment, it was not adopted in Jammu and Kashmir due to Article 370.

Khan also referred to an incident of August last year, where some tourists were trapped in adverse conditions in the higher ranges of Pir Panjal in Gulmarg and were rescued by policemen. Their service to humanity should be highlighted by the government but those policemen were rewarded with Rs 100 only, she said.
