

# Indian men, women teams selected for Asian Wrestling Championships

NEW DELHI: World championships silver medallist Anshu Malik and bronze winner Sarita Mor will lead a 10-member Indian women's wrestling team at the Asian Championships to be held in Ulaanbatar, Mongolia next month.

While Anshu, a silver medallist in the 2021 World Wrestling Championships in Oslo, will represent in her pet 57kg category, Sarita will be take part in the 59kg section.

Sarita is a bronze medallist in her category at the 2021 World Championships.

The team was picked after the selections trials held at

the SAI Training Centre in Lucknow on Friday.

In the other high-profile bout in the trials, Manisha defeated Rio Olympics medallist Sakshi Malik 1-5 to seal her place in the 62kg category.

Reigning Asian Games gold medallist Vinesh Phogat, surprisingly, didn't turn up for the trials.

Other women grapplers to book their places in the Asian Championships-bound squad are Manisha

(50kg), Swati Shinde (53kg), Sushma Shokeen (55kg), Radhika (65kg), Sonika Hooda (68kg), Nikki (72kg) and Sudesh (76kg).

Meanwhile, Tokyo Olympics silver medallist Ravi Dahiya (57kg) managed to secure his place in the national team for the Asian Championships with-out even taking the mat on Thursday.

He along with Olympians - Bajrang Punia (65kg) and Deepak Punia (86kg) - was given a direct passage to the final of the selection trials held at KD Jadhav Indoor Wrestling Stadium on Thursday.

Selection trials were organised by Wrestling

Federation of India under the overall supervision of Brij Bhushan Sharan Singh, President WFI in presence of Vinod Tomar, Secretary and Jai Parkash, President Delhi Wrestling Association and Shiv Kumar Sharma, former Joint Secretary, J&K Sports Council and prominent wrestling promoter of Katra.

The Asian Championships is scheduled to be held in Mongolia from April 19 to 24.

While Bajrang and Deepak competed in the final, Ravi's final opponent, Aman gave a walkover raising questions over the Wrestling Federation of India's decision.
