RS PURA: All Jammu Kashmir Panchayat Conference (AJKPC) has welcomed the decision of LG Administration that Panchayats in Jammu and Kashmir will soon have its own secretariat. Addressing media persons, Sardar Gurdeep Singh Saini, State General Secretary AJKPC and Sarpanch of Gander Panchayat of Block RS Pura, said that the Chief Secretary, Arun Kumar Mehta has issued a directive that Secretariats will be run by the district administration at the Panchayat level and necessary directions have been issued to District Deputy Commissioners to identify the

government buildings. "AJKPC welcomes this decision of the government and demanded from that it should be implemented in letter and spirit," Saini said, added that due to no such system at present, people have to wander to get the work done at the Panchayat level, in such a situation, people will be able to meet the concerned employees and get their problems resolved by the formation of Panchayat Secretariat. Saini expressed disappointment over the fact that after the completion of Panchayati elections in Jammu and Kashmir, the government had entrusted the responsibility of 23 government departments to the Sarpanches, but except a

few departments, none of the departments cooperated with the Sarpanches, due to which the work of people could not be done at Panchayat level. "This decision of government needs to implement with strictness so that all the government work of the people can be completed in the Panchayat Secretariat itself," he said, adding that with the formation of Panchayat Secretariat, the problems of the people would be resolved and the Sarpanches would also be able to place the problems of his Panchayat in front of the concerned officials. Others who were present included Naib Sarpanch Pyarelal, Sardar Hajinder Singh and others were also present.

The two-day event shall conclude today with the valedictory function at the same venue, a handout issued by the Association here today informed.


Swiss Open Sindhu clinches women's singles title, Prannoy finishes runner-up in men's singles

BASEL: Ace Indian shuttler PV Sindhu clinched her second women's singles title of the season with a straight game win over Thailand's Busanan Ongbamrungphan but HS Prannoy went down fighting in the men's singles final at the Swiss Open Super 300 badminton tournament here on Sunday. Playing her second successive final in the tournament, Sindhu, a double Olympic medalist, took 49 minutes to get the better of the fourth seeded Busanan 21-16 21-18 at the St. Jakobshalle here. However, Prannoy suffered a 12-21 18-21 defeat against Asian Games gold medalist and fourth seed Jonatan Christie of Indonesia in a 48-minute summit clash to finish runner-up. For Sindhu, it was a moment of glory as she finally lifted the trophy after losing to Rio Olympics gold medalist Carolina Marin of Spain in the final of last edition.

The 26-year-old from Hyderabad has happy memories of this venue as she had also claimed the World Championships gold in 2019... registered her 16th win over Busanan in 17 meetings, having lost to the Thai only once — at the 2019 Hong Kong Open, to claim the Super 300 crown, the second lowest tier of BWF Tour events.

SSR holds workshops for IAS aspirants

JAMMU: The SR College of Competitions (SRCC) held a Workshop for the civil services aspirants in the College premises at Gandhi Nagar here on Sunday. An expert faculty with wealth of experience from Delhi dealt with the nature and structure of the exam comprehensively. All the aspects including the scheme and pattern of the exam, approach for prelims and mains, sources of material and the books required, use of online sources and the relevance of newspaper reading in preparing the current affairs and writing test series for both prelims and mains were covered thoroughly and to the satisfaction of the students. During the session the entire syllabus, the focus areas and the kind of questions asked in the previous years papers were also taken up. Aspirants were also guided about the CSAT and Essay papers also.

The expert faculty from Delhi, Gautam Kumar discussed in detail the entire syllabus of civil services examination conducted by the UPSC and JKPSC and suggested a comprehensive step by step strategy to prepare for both the Preliminary and the Mains examination. In a three and half hour long session, he dealt with all the four papers of the General Studies, Civil Services Aptitude Test and also about the selection of Optional subject. He attended to all the queries raised by the aspirants regarding factors to be kept in mind while choosing a right and suitable optional.

Further, aspirants asked about the ethics, integrity and aptitude paper and the approach to handle the theory and the case studies part. Also they asked about the cut off needed to qualify in the prelims and the mains examination. He also drew the attention of the aspirants to essay paper and the answer writing practice. He suggested the aspirants to atleast attend one comprehensive test series for both prelim and mains examination. The resource person also stressed on the importance of current affairs and the relevant sources to prepare the same. Various other aspects like time management, study material, preparation of notes and newspaper reading were handled in an exhaustive manner. The response was overwhelming and the attendees appreciated the initiative taken by the SR College. The attendees included the aspirants preparing for IAS and JKAS 2022 and also undergraduates who will be eligible in a couple of years.
