In this screening camp 315 patients suffering from different eye ailments were examined by the medical

team of the hospital out of which 67 patients were identified for cataract surgeries which were brought in the hospital by the members of the trust for further surgical procedures. 154 patients suffering with ENT ailments were examined.

31 patients suffering with hearing loss has been provided hearing aid free of cost. On March 26, 2020 all these patients were operated by Dr Ankur Goel & Dr Sumera Raina to restore their vision. Today, 26 operated

patients after follow up were discharged from the hospital. A conference was also organised in the hospital premises in which Dev Raj Gupta Chairman, Asha Gupta Vice Chairman, Dr Yogeshwar Gupta Trustee, Satish Chopra Trustee of Martyr Captain Tushar Mahajan Memorial Trust, Rtn D. N. Sharma Chairman, Rtn S. S. Kermi Finance Secretary of Rotary Eye Hospital Udhampur, along with the operated patients and their attendants were also present during conference. Awareness was also given to the patients about the eye care after surgery so that better vision is maintained in future.

Sharma congratulates Martyr Captain Tushar Mahajan Memorial Trust, Udhampur for organizing such camp in which the patients of far flung areas were selected and provided Gift of Sight. These patients are always remaining deprived of advance medical treatment due to non availability of medical facilities in their areas. # 307 vaccinated, 1,353 samples collected in Ramban

RAMBAN: As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr, Suresh, the Health Department on Sunday administered COVID vaccine doses to 307 persons including 60 children in the 15-17 years and 244 in 12-14 age group in the district.

Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol, the Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 20,900 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs.100,68,750.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1353 samples including 455 RT-PCR and 898 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 307 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.
