## Ch Manmohan reiterates demand of OBC status to Jat community

NOWSHERA: Ch Manmohan Singh, President All India Jat Maha Sabha (AIJMS) and former Mayor on Sunday reiterated demand of giving OBC status to the Jat community in J&K on the pattern of eleven states of the country. In this connection, Ch Manmohan Singh visited Nowshera and held a meeting at M R Hotel in which several issues related to Jat community was discussed threadbare. Speaking in the meeting, Ch Manmohan Singh expressed resentment against the J&K and Central Governments for depriving the Jat community members of their due share. He stated that in 11 states, Jats are enjoying the benefits of OBC status but the Jats of Jammu and Kashmir continue to be deprived of the same. He said that earlier Article 370 was cited as the hurdle in conferring OBC status to the Jat Community but now when Article 370 has been removed from the erstwhile state of Jammu and Kashmir and now full authority lies in the hands of the Union Government then why the government is adopting a dilly-dallying attitude on this very significant issue concerning the Jats. Ch Manmohan Singh said that J&K BJP President Ravinder Raina has also assured to provide OBC status to J&K Jats. He asked J&K BJP leadership to fulfill its promise by changing words into actions and ensure justice to Jats of Jammu region before holding Assembly elections in the Jammu and Kashmir Union Territory. He warned that in case the ruling government would be failed to provide OBC status to Jat community then the party will not

get a single Jat vote in any of the upcoming elections in J&K. Ch Manmohan Singh emphasized that the members of Jat community will conduct a door-to-door campaign and make people apprise about the anti-Jat policy adopted by the ruling government by not providing OBC status and making all the border constituencies from Lakhanpur to Mendar, having major population of Jat community. He sought intervention of the Prime Minister that under his slogan of 'One Nation, One Constitution', Jats of Jammu and Kashmir facing discrimination. He appealed to the Prime Minister to do justice with J&K Jats by providing OBC status at par with eleven states of the country. Ajay Choudhary, Youth President of Jat Maha Sabha Rajouri lauded Ch Manmohan Singh for his proactive role in highlighting the issues of the community at various forums and the significant role which he is playing to get the rights of the Jats without any compromise whatsoever. He assured Ch Manmohan for all possible support in his fight for the welfare of Jat community. Sarpanch Sukhdev Singh Chowdhary appealed to the Jats of Rajouri district to get united and strengthen the hands of Ch Manmohan Singh who is playing a vital role for the upliftment of Jat community. ## 307 vaccinated, 1,353 samples collected in Ramban

RAMBAN: As per District Immunization Officer, Ramban, Dr. Suresh, the Health Department on Sunday administered COVID vaccine doses to 307 persons including 60 children in the 15-17 years and 244 in 12-14 age group in the district.

Continuing the enforcement drive to implement Covid protocol, the Enforcement teams fined scores of violators for roaming without wearing face masks and not maintaining physical distance.

The enforcement teams, during the inspection in their respective jurisdictions, recovered a fine of Rs. 20,900 taking the total amount fined since April 1, 2021 to Rs. 100,68,750.

The Enforcement officers urged the people to wear face masks and maintain physical distance besides taking Covid vaccination doses at their nearest CVC.

As per daily bulletin issued by the Chief Medical Officer, Ramban, Dr. Mohammad Fareed Bhat, the Health Department has collected 1353 samples including 455 RT-PCR and 898 RAT samples besides administering Covid vaccine to 307 persons at various dedicated Vaccination Centres in the district.
